### Service No.6 – Didcot through W.I. to Newbury

Our 'Better Frequency' service seems to have settled down quite well and is, generally, running close to time. Regrettably the Company have been obliged to increase fares a little and these are now:

	<u>Single</u>	<u>Return</u>
W.I. to NEWBURY	£ 2.20	£ 3.70
W.I. to DIDCOT	£ 2.00	£ 3.40

For O.A.P.s there is an excellent 'Concession Busabout' fare of £3.50 which [as well as being cheaper than the standard return to Newbury] ALSO allows unlimited travel for the day on all Newbury Buses' services.

Even drivers of average sized cars incur a real cost of around £9 in getting to and from, and parking for a couple of hours in Newbury so the bus is a much better proposition for one person and allows up to 2, 4 or 6 hours in town with no parking fees or driving 'hassle' around Chieveley.

Having got the service lets use it as much as possible. It would be a disaster for many Villagers if Newbury Buses found it uneconomic and withdrew it there being no Bennets around to 'pick up the pieces.

## FARMING NEWS

As 2001 draws to a close, we can reflect upon how our lives were hugely affected by the flooding of last Autumn/Winter and the Foot and Mouth crisis. The latter not only paralysed the farming community to various degrees depending on one's area, but also had a terrific impact on the country as a whole. The last foot and mouth case was September 30<sup>th</sup> and at long last the countryside is returning to some sort of normality, but with great emphasis on farmers being careful with their "bio-security" – sorry for the jargon!

Cattle and sheep exports from these shores are starting again, which is most welcome and means our meat prices should begin to increase. It goes without saying that the French are again disregarding EC rules and still banning our beef (because, they claim, of BSE) – they are a law unto themselves and who says there is a level playing field?

British farmers have tightened up all aspects of their production with various assurance schemes, e.g. Farm Assured British Beef and Lamb (FABBL) and Assured Combinable Crops Scheme (ACCS) to name but two, which makes us accountable for everything we do. Yet the Government still allows all manner of imports which do not comply with the above schemes and strict regulations of hygiene etc., an example being beef with spinal cords still attached and cheap milling wheat where we have no idea of either origin or growing methods.

Enough of this! ..... It is quite ironic how this Autumn has been (so far) completely opposite to last year's, with a greatly reduced rainfall and some gloriously sunny days – long may it last. My family and I had a wonderful day today following the Old Berks Hunt at Baulking Green, Faringdon, where there was a huge turnout of horses, hounds and followers having a get-together, a quick swig from the stirrup cup and above all minding their own business – I wish Tony Blair and others could do the same!
