Thank you to all members for using the online booking system. It is invaluable for us to have a good audit trail of usage should we need to apply for any grant help in the future.

63 MILE CHALLENGE

This is a message to all of you who know my son John. He is 17 now and is one of a group of sixth formers attempting to complete a gruelling 63 mile walk in 24 hours along the Ridgeway on 28/29 April this year. This challenge was completed by some of the prefects at Abingdon School in 1963 and the story caught the eye of my husband Jan. As many of you know, Jan loves walking and has completed challenges like the 3 Peaks in 24 hours, as well as trekking to Everest Base Camp and climbing the peaks there. So Jan, who currently teaches maths at the school, decided to organise a similar challenge this year, 50 years after the original one. This time they are walking along the Ridgeway and not main roads!! Jan has been planning this for months and everyone has taken part in many practice walks during the day and night, so hopefully all will be fully prepared. The walk will start at Overton Hill at Avebury and along the Ridgeway to Streatley, where they will take the Thames path back to school. Anyone who would like to walk with the boys for the last 9 miles is welcome, just contact the school.

So, they will be walking across Bury Lane about 3-4am in the morning and I am aiming to be there to provide sausage baps or similar. If anyone wants to join me to cheer them on or help me then you're very welcome, please contact me on jill.wiejak@btopenworld.com. Though initially planned as a a challenge, the boys themselves decided to try and raise some money and the charities are the Childhood Cancer Research Charity at the John Radcliffe and the Bursary fund at Abingdon school. It is Britain's oldest road and it's right on our doorstep, on the edge of the Downs, for everyone to enjoy. On Sunday, 7 April, The Friends of the Ridgeway are holding an Open Day at the Court Hill Centre near Wantage. Why not take a walk on The Ridgeway, and enjoy one of Britain's finest views. Visit nearby Segsbury Castle hillfort, and spot wildlife and spring flowers. Drop in to the Court Hill Centre any time between 10.30am and 3.30pm and find out more about the trail and how you can help to keep it special. Have a snack at the Barn Cafe. Meet the volunteers who help to preserve the ancient track, and join in a discussion about the future of the National Trails. With exhibitions of art inspired by the Ridgeway landscape and a birds of prey display, there's something for the whole family to enjoy. To get to the Court Hill Centre, take the A338 south from Wantage for 2 miles. Turn right into The Centre just before the crest of Court Hill. DO YOU KNOW A BERKSHIRE LAND GIRL?


An appeal goes out this week to find the surviving land girls who helped to keep Berkshire fed during the last war.


