HARVEST REPORT

The 1999 Harvest is nearly complete. In fact, as I write, I think Richard is just finishing at the Manor whilst there is about 100 acres of wheat left to cut at Rowles Farm and Place Farm. August has been one of the wettest months on record which has made the 1999 Harvest one of the most difficult I can remember for a long time, with wet periods of inactivity followed by frantic dry intervals (usually, unfortunately for everyone over the weekends and Bank Holiday), which enabled us to resume combining. We are very appreciative of the West IIsley villagers who put up with the noise of the drier(s) during these 'frantic periods'. Obviously they realise that the corn cut on any one day has to be cleared from the dryer before cutting can commence the following day. This means on one or two occasions drying into the night. Wheat and Barley has to be dried down to below 15% moisture content, whilst Oilseed Rape must be below 9%. This year these crops have often been harvested at around 18 - 19%, and 12-13% respectively. It costs in excess of £1 per tonne per % of moisture dried from grain seeds and Oilseed Rape, so obviously if we did not have to dry it, we would not. I think we all know that we cannot rely on the British weather to do the job for us. Once again, thank you to all those who put up with the drier over this tricky period, thus enabling the harvest to be completed.

It is good to read (in your September issue) of the increasing use of the village tennis court. All parishioners must be very grateful to the Tennis Court Management Committee (TCMC) for their hard work maintaining this facility. The criticisms also mentioned, and characterised as unkind and unfair, were made <u>not</u> at the Parish Council (although one of the P.C. functions is to field complaints on a wide variety of matters!), but at the Parish Assembly following Dennis Gilmour's presentation of the TCMC annual report. He described a substantial reduction in bookings and court usage, so Parishioners present were naturally concerned to offer suggestions to remedy the situation. Such interactions are why we have a Parish Assembly and are to be welcomed. I think the comments were neither unkind nor unfair; I am sure they were not intended as such. A further suggestion was made that at the tennis court itself there could be a public notice of the address and telephone number of where a booking can be made and the key obtained. The same information on the village notice board would also be helpful for would-be tennis players; both might boost the usage further.
