I was sent this story recently and I hope you forgive me if I copy it here. Maybe having a couple of dogs and a 4 year old girl in the family helped me to imagine it, but I found it very touching. I hope you do too. I am guilty of writing letters to God from time to time, sometimes I have written after people have died. But I've never actually posted them, as the girl in this story does. So I don't know if I might have had a reply!

"Our 14-year-old dog Abbey died last month. The day after she passed away my 4-year-old daughter Meredith was crying and talking about how much she missed Abbey. She asked if we could write a letter to God so that when Abbey got to heaven, God would recognise her. I told her that I thought we could do so, and she dictated these words:

Dear God, Will you please take care of my dog? She died yesterday and is with you in heaven. I miss her very much. I am happy that you let me have her as my dog even though she was sick. I hope you will play with her. She likes to swim and play ball. I am sending a picture of her so when you see her you will know that she is my dog. Love, Meredith

We put the letter in an envelope with a picture of Abbey and Meredith and addressed it to God/Heaven. We put our return address on it. Then Meredith stuck several stamps on the front of the envelope because she said it would take lots of stamps to get the letter all the way to heaven. A few days after we posted it she asked if God had received the letter yet. I told her that I thought He had.

Yesterday, we had a letter in a gold envelope addressed, 'To Meredith' in an unfamiliar hand. Meredith opened it. Inside was the picture of Abbey & Meredith and this note:

Dear Meredith, Abbey arrived safely in heaven. Having the picture was a big help and I recognised her right away. Abbey isn't sick anymore . Her spirit is happy here with me. Abbey loved being your dog. Thank you for the beautiful letter and thank your mother for helping you write it and sending it to me. I send my blessings every day and remember that I love you very much. By the way, I'm easy to find. I am wherever there is love. Love, God" Simon
