### PARISH COUNCIL

A Parish Council meeting was held in the Village Hall on 5th July attended by 7 Councillors and the Parish Clerk together with 2 Parishioners.

- No grant for street cleaning has been received from the District Council for the current financial year, and it was agreed that the Clerk would check that a grant would be forthcoming before any further work was carried out.
- The annual audit of the accounts had now been completed and the auditors had commented on the good presentation of the accounts by the Parish Clerk,
- It was reported that some work had been carried out to the sewer but confirmation was awaited that the remedial work had been completed.
- 4. Halam had reached the final in the Village Hall competition to be judged on 10th July.
- 5. A planning application by Mr. & Mrs. M.J. Hubbard for a two storey cottage and garage on a plot to the rear of Halam House, Radley Road (next to the dovecote) together with two letters objecting to the application were considered. Planning permission had previously been granted for a bungalow on this plot. Agreed to recommend approval with voting 3 for, 1 against and 3 abstentions.
- 6. A planning application by Mr. R. Stainwright for an extension to form a garage, bathroom and games room at his house adjacent to the pumping station on Radley Road was considered and it was unanimously agreed to recommend approval.
- 7. The Police have been invited to attend the next meeting of the Parish Council at 7.30 p.m. on Friday 30th August to speak about home security etc. and answer questions. Parishioners are specially invited to attend this meeting and ask as many questions as possible.
- 8. The Parish Council are to meet representatives of the District Council at 7.00 p.m. on Friday 13th Sept. in the Village Hall to discuss the Southern Area Local Plan which, when adopted, will be valid for ten years up to 2001.
- 9. A review of the income and expenditure for the Village Hall over the last twelve months had indicated an income of £643 against an expenditure of £654. It was noted with satisfaction that the running costs had virtually all been met by income from lettings. This would allow profits from the Village Lottery to be used to finance future remedial works or other appropriate expenditure associated with the Village Hall.

Next meeting to be held on Friday 30th August at 7.30 p.m. in the Village Hall.

A meeting was held on Friday August 30th. 6 Councillors, the Clerk and 4 members of the public attended. Open meeting with Inspector Hurt from Newark and our own neighbourhood "bobby" P.C. Colin Chambers. Some general questions on home security and general police policy. The police would like assistance with unwanted callers - pedlars (for your information Nottingham is a very well known centre for "running" these pedlars - they should have a green card approx. 8" x 4" without a photograph) antique dealers, people offering cut-price potatos, fertilisers etc. Please contact them if you are troubled.

Points raised at Council Meeting.

- Sewerage on The Turnpike. Work will have to be done to put in new main to pumping station.
- Grant of £220 received from District Council for street cleaning, so we hope this can be started once straw casting finishes.
- Date for your diaries Harvest Supper in Village Hall on Friday, October 18th at 7.00 p.m. Tickets - Adult £3.00 Children £1.50 on sale soon.
- 4. Also further important date, next Parish Council on September 13th at 7.00 p.m. when Andrew Bird, Planning Officer, will be present to discuss the Village Plan. This could affect our long term future here in Halam so do please attend, we need your assistance to retain our village in its fairly unspoilt state and be able to keep our green spaces without having too large a new population thrust upon us.

PARISH COUNCIL

A special meeting was held in the Village Hall on Friday 13th September attended by 7 Councillors and the Parish Clerk together with a good attendance of local residents.

The meeting was called to discuss the future planning policies for Halam over the next ten years which were required to be submitted to Newark and Sherwood District Council for incorporation in the Southern Area Local Plan. Messrs. Burt and Anstey, Senior Planning Officers from Newark & Sherwood District Council, were present for part of the meeting.

After lengthy discussion, both before and in the presence of Messrs. Burt and Anstey who answered numerous questions, the overwhelming opinion of the meeting, endorsed by the Parish Council, was that the present planning policies for Halam should continue. It was felt that over the last decade sensible planning decisions had been taken allowing infill sites to be developed at the average rate of one dwelling per year.

Whilst the meeting rejected the idea of a "Village Envelope" it felt that no large estate type development should be allowed, but that the village should grow naturally as in the past and that each application should be decided on its merits. A village envelope would tend to concentrate development in the centre of a village, and this was not desirable in Halam which had several different pockets of habitation.

Local residents expressed satisfaction with the Parish Council's past performance and recommendations on planning applications and there was no desire for any change.

Following the special meeting an ordinary meeting of the Parish Council was held:

- The arrangements for the Harvest Supper to be held in the Village Hall on Friday 18th October at 7 p.m. were discussed. It was confirmed that an application for a bar licence for this function had been made.
- After discussion it was agreed that the letting charges for the Village Hall would remain the same until July 1992 when they would be reviewed.
- Street cleaning would recommence in the near future.
- A planning application by Mr. B. Giles for a vehicular access to the garden for It was agreed parking one car at The Cottages, Mansfield Road was considered. unanimously to recommend approval.
- The presentation of a Certificate of Merit and cheque for £50 by the Chairman of Newark & Sherwood District Council to the Parish for winning the best run village hall contest was made in the Village Hall on Friday 20th September. The presentation was followed by refreshments prepared by Mrs. Mandy Rickett and the event was greatly enjoyed by all present.

#### PARISH COUNCIL.

A meeting was held in the Village Hall on 29th November attended by seven Councillors and the Clerk. Both District Councillors representing Halam were present at the meeting together with two parishioners.

- Street cleaning was again discussed and the difficulties being experienced in getting someone to do this work. Further arrangements were agreed which hopefully will enable work to re-start.
- The question of changing the name of Radley Road to Church Lane was again discussed. Of the views received four had expressed support and five against such a move. It was decided by a majority of 5 - 2 against proceeding any further in this matter.
- 3. The profit on the Harvest Supper held in the Village Hall on 18th October had been £312.07, and it was agreed by a majority of 6 1 that this sum should be used to purchase more tables for the Village Hall.
- 4. A planning application by Mr. & Mrs. B. Lodder for alterations to the old barn to form a studio and demolition of an asbestos-roofed lean-to at Manor Farm was considered and it was agreed unanimously to recommend approval.
- An account had been received from Newark & Sherwood District Council, for £521.09 being the Parish share of the recent District and Parish Council

election charges covering the cost of ballot papers, transport, poll cards, staffing etc. It was agreed that the account was very unreasonable and that the amount would be queried with the District Council and advice sought from the Nottinghamshire Association of Local Councils as necessary.

- A request had been received from Halam School P.T.A. for a contribution 6. towards the purchase of security lighting for the school. It was agreed unanimously that owing to the lack of any surplus funds no contribution from the Parish Council would be possible.
- It was agreed to write to East Midland Motor Services to protest at the 7. reduction in the bus service through Halam from hourly to two hourly and request that the re-routed buses should use School Lane, Halam, instead of Station Road, Edingly.
- Arrangements for cleaning and controlling the heating of the Village Hall 8. and repair of the damaged guttering were: agreed.
- It was agreed Councillors Bust and Rickett would act as Trustees for the Edward Dickinson charity.

Future meetings to be held on 10th January, 21st February and 27th March 1992 in the Village Hall.
