# Minutes of the meeting held on 16th January 2019 at 7.00pm

#### 1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

There were no apologies for absence.

## 2. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING OF 21st November 2018 (previously circulated by email)

The Minutes of the last meeting were approved and signed.

## 3. MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES (not covered elsewhere on Agenda)

Jan R and Wendy T have completed the annual inventory check. There were just a couple of minor changes.

Lizzy C has not been able to make contact with the person at Scrooby re Wassailing. She will do this at a future date.

Ben R informed that he had not been able to get details re book swap container but there would be a cost involved.

Spencer R reported that he had not written to Users re the crushing of milk cartons etc., but he has put a notice above the bins for all to see and hopefully adhere to.

Spencer R informed that he is still working on an Emergency Tradesmen list.

Spencer R, David H and Reg T have tidied the shed and Reg T has disposed of the rubbish. David H thanked them for their help.

Ben R informed that he had asked people to see if they would be interested in a Cycle Proficiency Course for children, aimed primarily for Yr.2 and Yr3.. He had had positive feedback.

Jan R reported that she has spoken to both the Angel Inn and The White Horse Inn about co-ordinating events. All parties are keen not to duplicate events or hold on the same day. The Angel Inn said they would contact us to let us know what they have planned, but as yet have not done so.

David H said he had spoken to The Angel Inn re a proposed Music Festival but he would need to speak to them again to ascertain the date.

Jan R had spoken to Wendy T re 'Michael J Jackson (singer) and Wendy T has now postponed the event for 23rd February with the possibility of booking him in the future.

David H informed that due to organisational problems, the Abbeydale Singers will not now be performing on 23rd March. It is hoped that the event will be rescheduled at a later date.

### 4. TREASURER'S REPORT

Spencer R presented his report indicating that the bank balance was what he would be reporting at the AGM. The 2018 accounts had been passed to Pat Swift for examination and will be signed by Steven Darby FCCA. Spencer R reported that EDF (Electricity) had reduced the monthly DD from £52 to £42 and we were £132 in credit. David H queried the representation of the various bank balances. There were no other questions.

## 5.2 Review of recent Events

### Christmas Fayre - Sunday 2nd December

This event was more enjoyable due to the fact there were fewer stallholders. Some queried if the event was too long. It was pointed out, however, that although there did not seem to be lots of people at any one time, there was a constant flow of people, giving them time to come either before or after lunchtime. David H informed that Charlotte Duncombe had donated a flask to be raffled. As we did not hold a general raffle, this will be used at the next possible event. Thanks went to Lizzy C for organising the Fayre and to all the helpers.

### 65+ Christmas Lunch - Wednesday 19th December

All agreed that, once again, this was an enjoyable afternoon. Positive feedback has been received. It was made more enjoyable by the fact that there were two long tables, rather than the usual restaurant set up. Jan R said that if more people came to the lunch this coming December, another table would have to be used at the top end of the restaurant.

The only thing everyone agreed to change for this year is to have children singing carols and not adults.

Thanks have been conveyed to Michael and Elaine for hosting the event.

David H thanked Jan R for organising the event.

# 5.3 Future Events

# Film Afternoon/Evening - Saturday 19th January 2019

David H reported the following:

It was reported that we would be making a loss from the event and that the Misson Marine Club would be paying the balance from funds already in our bank account.

When selling tickets, Ben R said he had some people saying the price was very cheap. It was suggested we have a comment slip for people to view their opinion of the event in order to make improvements if we were to put on a similar event.

## Other Future Events

Ben R has been in contact with the Sloe Badger, which will soon be changing ownership. Other ideas for future events were discussed.

Family Treasure Hunt - Joan C has already planned the Hunt, together with Anne Rowe. It was agreed that a Friday evening during the summer months would be a better time to hold the Hunt as it would be light. Date to be decided.

Misson Feast - If on the village green, new gazeboes or similar would need to either be purchased or hired. Reg T had obtained a brochure on buying. These would be in the region of £700. Jan R said storing them could be an issue. David H informed that a Music Festival was to be held at the Angel Inn, also the usual Car Rally and possible Duck Race.

Easter Egg Hunt - This was discussed with various ideas muted. It was agreed to hold this on Easter Sunday 21st April. It was suggested that children make eggs each with a number on. A small number of children could make eggs at the Community Centre on Saturday 6th April at the same time as the Book Swap. It was agreed to ask Pre-School and Messy Church to make some. Brenda L will think about how the event could be run and asked that all entrants be given a small prize. This was agreed.

Young persons disco - It had been suggested we hold a disco but after discussion decided not to pursue this.

Spring Village Clean-up - This is to be held on 27th April. Andrea W agreed the WI would provide refreshments.

Village Show - It was decided to hold this on Saturday 31st August 2019 with the Auction on Sunday 1st September 2019.

### 7. COMMUNITY CENTRE

Spencer R said that he would like to replace all the toilet seats as they were very old and did not fit properly. This was agreed. He also said that he had cleared the gutter at the front as it was full of leaves but the other gutters would need clearing.

Reg T said he had fixed the loose tile in the kitchen. Jan R mentioned the loose tile in the ladies. Reg T will fix this.

#### 8. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Joan C asked about a Christmas Tree on the green. Andrea W said that this was on the PC Agenda to do something for next christmas.

Spencer R asked if we could contact the MPC with regard to removing the large cabinet in the boiler room as it was proving very restricting.

Wendy T asked if helpers could dress in 'fancy dress' for the village clean-up to encourage more families to help. Andrea suggested flyers to all householders. Ben R said that in his opinion, people respond to text messages. People would need to sign up to give permission. It was also suggested using WhatsApp as this is free.

Ben R enquired about the possibility of Indoor Bowls at the Centre. Spencer R said he had obtained some information from Barlborough and would pass this on.

Lizzy C suggested that some of the £500 of Dr. Moore money left, we could plant some trees in the village. The majority thought this to be a good idea. David H said that some of this money was needed to replenish plants. Permission might need to be sought from MPC for trees to be planted.

Jan R informed that Tanya Wheewall's circumstances had changed and she was no longer able to clean the centre. Cleaning to be covered by Jan R this coming week and Andrea W had agreed to act as Temporary Cleaner until further notice.
