#### HISTORICAL PARISH WALK

A Parish walk is being planned for *Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> June*, *starting from The Stag car park at. 2.00 pm*. The walk will take us round Mentmore Park and golf course to Crafton Lodge, up to Helsthorpe Farm, returning through Crafton village past Crafton Stud Farm, taking in the mediaeval settlements and will arrive back in Mentmore at aprox. 5.30 pm.

Short talks will be given at appropriate points along the route on subjects such as the local history and wild life. There will be a refreshment stop in Crafton, where tea and delicious homemade cakes will be provided.

A secondary starting and finishing point at Crafton Lodge would be an alternative for those who do not wish to do the whole walk. Walking boots and suitable clothing are recommended.

### WILDLIFE NEWS



This year seems to be heralding a good year for most of our local wildlife, despite the somewhat dry weather! From a personal point of view we have been delighted to see more brown hares than we have seen for probably five years or more – but the real bonus has been the evenings spent quietly watching them and getting a few good photos too! Hare coursing is still a problem, so if you see anything suspicious please do report it to the police.

My work with BORG has also been proving successful – with over 14 Tawny Owl chicks ringed in the area Lynne and I monitor (echoed by our colleagues across Bucks). We are now into prime time for Barn Owls, Kestrels and Little Owls and so far so good. Nests have been showing signs of high occupancy and egg numbers, together with plenty of stashed food, so we could be in for a very busy season if the weather and food supplies remain good...

Our colleagues in other parts of the county have been finding some very unusual, if not to say odd, inhabitants in our boxes. We thought that finding a Mandarin Duck in a Barn Owl box last year was interesting, but this year has seen a Barn Owl box with a Gooseander in residence and several others with a combination of eggs from upwards of three different species of birds!
