THANK YOU SUE





MAIDSTONE BOROUGH COUNCIL CORE STRATEGY UPDATE

The Core Strategy planning document sets the general direction of development in the borough from now until 2026. It deals with homes, jobs, shopping, leisure, environment, transport issues and provides the overall framework to guide development. It was hoped that the next draft of the Core Strategy would be placed before MBC Cabinet in June 2012. However it has now come to

TESCO SUPERMARKET PLANS

Tesco Stores submitted a planning application on 14th February (MA/12/0232) for a new supermarket at the station. The supermarket itself, its 235 customer parking spaces, a petrol station and a bus turning area would occupy most of the land now used for car parking at the station. A 660-space car park for rail users would be built north of the railway, with access from George Street.

Staplehurst Parish Council arranged a special meeting on 6th March to consider its response. This was well attended by local residents who had two hours to express their views for or against the plan and to ask questions of the Tesco representatives present.

Parish councillors then discussed the application and noted that some residents favoured a new supermarket. However, a majority of councillors voted to recommend MBC to refuse the present application as there were a number of serious concerns which needed to be resolved. These included amongst others the scale of the new store, traffic problems with Lodge Road, the principle of a major development north of the railway, the danger of peak-hour traffic at the A229 junction with George Street and the liability to flooding of the new station car park. The next step will be for MBC to decide on the application, for which no date had been set at the time of writing.

DEVELOPERS EXPLAIN THEIR HOUSING PLANS

When two development companies asked to present their plans to Staplehurst Parish Council they were requested to do it at a public meeting organised by the Council. This took place on 26th March and was well attended by residents.

Taylor Wimpey have owned land at the top of Oliver Road for many years (the "Wimpey Fields") and are now planning to build about 50 houses on just over one-third of the land. The remainder would be dedicated as a conservation area and community woodland. An outline planning application could be submitted later this year. More details are available at www.pegasuspg.co.uk/staplehurst. The developers are planning a public exhibition about the scheme at the end of May – look out for details.

Gleeson and Miller Homes have an option to buy a large area of land at Hen and Duckhurst Farm, north of Marden Road and west of the Lime Trees estate and the Lodge Road industrial estate. Their plans are less advanced, but they are thinking of a phased development of 250 to 260 houses, plus some open space. Vehicle access would be by a mini-roundabout on Marden Road although they would

our attention that due to the number of responses to last year's consultation and further work required that there will be a delay in the process. It is not clear how long this delay will be, but any delay creates difficulties in the development of the Neighbourhood Plan. The local Rural Settlement Group continues to monitor the situation. Some volunteers litter-picked rural lanes separately from the organised event.

The community spirit on the day was amazing and some residents are carrying on being a volunteer picking up rubbish at their own risk. A huge thank you to everyone who has helped! Let's keep Staplehurst tidy by not dropping rubbish for others to pick up.



create walking and cycling routes to the station.

Residents raised a number of issues with the representatives of the companies, including traffic, drainage, impact on schools, local facilities and the effect on the environment.

SAINSBURY'S DEVELOPMENTS

Sainsbury's Supermarkets submitted a planning application on 17th February (MA/12/0220) for a new petrol filling station on the Staplehurst Service Station site. The planning committee of the Parish Council considered the proposal at its meeting on 19th March and recommended MBC to approve it, subject to some comments intended to reduce its impact on neighbours, particularly those in Cornforth Close.

At the time of writing MBC had not set a date to decide on the application by Sainsbury's for a new supermarket near the station (MA/11/1944) or the associated application for a new factory for DK Holdings (MA/11/1943) which were submitted in November 2011.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

In the previous Village Update I mentioned that Sue Bassett our Clerk for over 16 years will be relinquishing her post and taking up a new part time position as the Responsible Finance Officer (RFO). We have now carried out a series of interviews and I am pleased to report that we have appointed Mick Westwood to replace Sue as the Clerk to Staplehurst Parish Council. Mick is very well qualified and as a local resident has an extensive knowledge of the issues affecting our community. I should like to welcome Mick on board and to wish Sue all the best in her new role as the RFO.

We have received a lot of positive feedback on the two new security cameras that we have installed so we are actively considering purchasing an additional camera. This would allow us to retain a camera in Market Street while fulfilling the original requirement to install one at Jubilee Field. The Market Street camera could be moved if there was an issue elsewhere in the parish.

As part of developing the communication process with residents we have introduced our own Parish Council surgeries and these are now well established. These usually take place at the Library on the second Saturday in the month. Two Councillors are present to listen to your concerns and views; please take this opportunity to come and meet us.

We have made some significant progress towards resolving how services undertaken by parishes on behalf of MBC are funded. However, there are still some issues outstanding and we are making every effort through the auspices of the Kent Association of Local Councils (KALC) to reach agreement with MBC. As one of the largest parishes in the Borough Staplehurst continues to play a leading role in ensuring that the views of the parishes are taken into account.

We are a proactive council delivering services to meet local needs and striving to improve the quality of life in the community; the improvements to the Jubilee Field drainage, the maintenance of the public toilets, the introduction of the expanded street cleaning service and the new security cameras are all part of this aim.
