Thank you to all those who responded to the surveys and engaged us at the St Thomas' Christmas Fayre. The feedback we have so far, confirms that residents want a Community/Village Hall that is big enough (100-150 seated), that is suitable for the normal range of activities (gatherings both social and village business, birthday parties, events, perhaps wedding and wakes) and a second smaller hall for meetings. Adequate parking, a modern kitchen and good toilets are seen as essential.

However, getting permission to lease land from Salto is proving problematic. Negotiations are still ongoing with TVBC and the Parish Council involved. Until this is resolved a second PreApp for the Charlton Village/Community Hall is on hold.

Unfortunately the unit in the bus shelter has been vandalised beyond repair. The remnants have been removed and the Parish Council is currently looking at other alternatives. – We will keep you informed.

Letter from our Priest in Charge, Alex Randle-Bissell

Dear friends

I remember vividly as a teenager reading a rather angry forward from one of Richard Bachman's (who turned out to be a pseudonym for Stephen King) books called The Running Man which served as a warning about the fractious relationship between the media and those in politics, and as I recall also warned about how easy it was for those of us looking on in disbelief, and sometimes despair, to become distracted by the theatre of it all. I wouldn't go as far to say that those now very wise words were prophetic in nature, but they have certainly resonated enough in my mind to not only recall them now but to apply them to the events that we are currently witnessing at the heart of our democracy. Just what are we to make of it all? I have written many times over the past few years about the nature of what we think we know to be true, and how important it is to exercise critical thinking to get to the truth and not to blithely accept information (and yes, that does include this article) as the definitive message. It is part of our human nature that when we see things we simply don't like or witness unfairness and injustice to want to redress the balance. However, some of the questions that often



arise after the dust has settled are, in the end, the deeper issues really brought to light, wrestled with, and solved? It reminds me of the story of Mary and Martha in the gospels of Luke and John. Jesus went to visit them and Mary chooses to listen to what Jesus has to say whilst Martha is distracted by rushing around preparing food and cleaning the house, and then gets very angry with both Mary and Jesus for sitting around whilst she seemingly does all the work! Many have surmised about this passage for centuries because someone must do the work in the end surely? For me, the passage speaks clearly about the importance of focusing on what is truly important and not being distracted by what we often think should be central. Of course, this can be difficult because when we heap on things like expectation, preference, prejudice and so on we realise how complicated and distracted we can be at times. But perhaps this is why it is important to take some time out and to pause if we can and seek what is really important to us. We are running, during Lent, a course I have humbly written entitled 'What in Heaven does it really mean?' Where we will be examining some of the astonishing claims made in Christmas carols and then put them to the test – to this end I would like to encourage doubters and supporters alike to gather together to debate these ancient claims, and to look at what was really important in the messages they seek to give. A taste of Norway by Gilly Summers



120g short grain rice 750ml whole milk 250ml single cream 3 tablespoons caster sugar

1 teaspoon cardamom seeds - lightly crushed. Open the pods to remove the little black seeds inside.

1 vanilla bean, sliced lengthways and seeds scraped

Cranberry jam made from cranberries gently bubbled with sugar and a splash of water

Place the rice, milk, cream, sugar and cardamom seeds in a deep saucepan. Add the vanilla bean and seeds, stir well and bring to the boil. Simmer gently for 30-35 minutes, stirring now and then, until all the liquid has been absorbed and the rice is just cooked.

Holiday Advice from our local Foxcotte Vets

Spoon the rice pudding into bowls, discarding the vanilla bean and top with the cranberry jam.

With the relaxing of the current covid guidelines, thoughts are turning to adventuring overseas possibly with our furry friends. During the pandemic, the rules have altered regarding taking your pet abroad and the Pet Passport scheme is no longer valid for travel to most European countries. Instead, an Animal Health Certificate is required, along with a microchip and a valid Rabies vaccination. The Animal Health Certificate is issued by a vet and is a lengthy document to complete. The certificate should be issued no longer than 10 days before travel and is valid for 4 months in most European countries and for your return to UK. A new AHC needs to be issued for each trip abroad. The Rabies vaccination must be administered 21 days before travel. If you are planning on taking a pet abroad this summer, contact your vet to discuss the arrangements you need to make.



Whilst on our voyage, we were treated to a wonderful range of fine dining showcasing the best of Norwegian ingredients and recipes. Finding cloudberries, lingonberries and reindeer is not that easy in the UK so here is one recipe which would be easy to recreate at home and perfect comfort food for a chilly day.

Cardamom Rice pudding with cranberry jam

The recipe serves four but the delicious nuttiness of the al dente creamy short grain rice perfumed with cardamom and vanilla makes it somewhat irresistible so I'd recommend doubling the quantities to ensure there's enough for everyone!

Interesting Facts regarding Spring

Spring begins on the Vernal Equinox. The word Vernal means Spring in Latin while Equinox is the Latin word for equal days. On the first day of Spring the hours of daylight and night are almost equal with daylight being slightly longer.

Nowadays, when we say 'Spring', we know that we are talking about a season. However, this word was not available in English before the 14th Century. Earlier, people would use the word 'Lent' to refer to the spring season.

The first day of spring, the vernal equinox, has 12 hours of daylight and 12 hours of darkness.

The warmest spring on record was 2011 with an average daytime temperature of 9.2 °C. The coldest was the spring of 1962, with an average daytime maximum of 5.8 °C

Spring is often associated with the start of the pollen season. However, some pollen types can release as early as January

1947 saw the wettest spring to date with 331.7 mm of rainfall.

Bee bombs

Packed with seeds and ready to plant, this crafty activity is an easy way to add a splash of colour to the garden, and is perfect for little green fingers.

What you will need: Flour, soil, mixing bowl, Water and Native British wildflower seeds



Step1 - Mix 10 parts soil to 1 part flour

Step 2 – Slowly add water and mix until the mixture is like dough

Step 3 - Roll into a gold ball size ball

Step 5 – Fill a tray with Wildflower seeds and roll your mud balls around until covered

Step 6 – Leave to dry for a day or two and then they are ready to throw in your garden.
