Ripairian duties – This is the time of year when we need to think about the state of Hampshire's land drainage network. As the rain begins in earnest and leaves begin to fall, all riparian owners (those who have watercourses on or bordering their properties) across Hampshire, and beyond, should be looking at the state of their drainage ditches, pipes, culverts and other watercourses to ensure there is unobstructed conveyance of rain water and a reduced risk of localised flooding.

Electorate 2,630


Number of votes cast 880 of which 255 were postal votes. This represented 33.46% of the electorate, slightly higher than average for a NP referendum in the Borough.

In light of the referendum result (more than 50% of the votes cast are in favour of the Neighbourhood Plan) the Plan now forms part of the statutory development plan for the borough used in the determination of planning applications. The Plan is due to be formally 'made' at the next Full meeting of Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council held on 18 October, although this is a formality.

Many thanks to everyone who voted. It is now up to the Parish Council to ensure that the policies and projects contained in our Plan are upheld!

Police Report

Summary of some of the crimes which occurred last month. In the month of July there were 16 incidents (12 in Kingsclere, 1 in Headley and 2 in Ashford Hill/ Wheathold) which have been classified as crimes by the

Burglary Residential - One

home office.

Burglary Business/Community - Three. At Woodhouse Farm, Ashford Hill, the feed shed was ransacked and a fence post was stolen. Twist Hairdressing in Kingsclere was broken into and items stolen and a vehicle smashed into Butlers Garage (ram raid) in Ashford Hill.

Traffic Incidents – Four. Two were damage only road traffic collisions (one on the A339) and one a minor injury traffic collision. Also a vehicle was seized for having no insurance or tax on Coppice Road.

Theft of Vehicle – Two. One from Coppice Road and one from Star Inn pub.

Theft – Three.

Shoplifting – One. A number of items were stolen by a regular shoplifter at the Kingsclere Filling Station.

Criminal Damage – One. A window smashed on a vehicle parked in South Road, nothing was stolen.

Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) - Three.

Suspicious Incidents – Nine. Of note, the Nottingham Knockers were sighted in Harrow Drive,

Headley; a vehicle was seen on Folly Farm (likely the same one involved in the ram raid at Butlers garage); and two spaniels were initially reported as stolen from Wheathold but they later returned home. It's possible they were "too hot to handle" so returned to their very grateful owner.

Nature Notes

A tiny butterfly, not seen in the garden before, has been identified as a Small Copper. The forewings are burnt orange and brown bordered with a scattering of brown spots while the hind wings are brown with an orange band on their edges. With an energetic whirling flight this butterfly defends its territory fiercely and is a tiny jewel among the larger butterflies.

We visited Greenham Common in late August to look for white Autumn Ladies Tresses orchids and, in spite of the extremely dry conditions, they were abundant but as they are so tiny they took some searching out. While the orchids are flourishing the usually prolific blackberries were disappointing. Many berries had shrivelled and pickable fruit was overripe and small. Better luck in 2019 we hope.

Despite some rain the scrapes on the common are dry and areas once walked around can be walked through, pondlife has gone and it will take much more rain to refill them. There is something however that continues to thrive and that is the abominable N.Z. pygmy weed, another introduction that defies being submerged, heat, cold and now drought.

The frogs are not happy. The green water plants have gone along with water lilies, shade and soft silky sediment that lined the pond bottom. The

> pond liner had been leaking for some time and could no longer be ignored, quite a major task, so out with the old and in with the new but of course it is now a sterile environment. They will return and, as if to reinforce this, a small yellow frog sprang into the pond as it was being filled.

mind as I think about bringing up my daughters. Being a parent really is the hardest job ever. I realise day by day how much I have to learn and take my hat off to many others in our villages who do this job so well.

As some of you will know our family has expanded in the last few months with the arrival of our youngest, Olivia. We're particularly grateful to our church family for being so supportive; for the lovely meals; and for their generosity in many other ways, as we adjusted as a family. She has been a great joy to us and we feel especially blessed to have her as our third daughter. But it has also made being a dad that little bit more intense! Just as we'd pushed through the baby and toddler stage, with both older girls in school as of the last few weeks, we were back to stairgates and bottles and nappies! Things certainly are messier than they used to be.

As I scrub mud off my older girls school shoes after their 'irresponsible' (in my grumpy opinion at least!) play in the garden straight after school, I'm so glad that I can talk to a God who understands all these things.
