It was agreed that the committee would produce a Feasibility Study before committing to the project. This will cover options for: location (Salto Car Park or is there a better alternative), requirement (do we need a traditional Village Hall or would a Community Hall such as the one at Hurstbourne Tarrant be appropriate) and some rough estimate of costings for the build and for its management and maintenance. Neighbourhood Plan

Cllr Clive Ward – Chair of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group

The Charlton Neighbourhood Plan submission needs some finessing due to circumstances beyond our control. The Plan remains with the Independent Examiner with a new date for agreement around about Christmas (this year before you ask).and with a fair wind, the Plan should be put to Charlton residents in a referendum when the Government allows (May 2021).

Speed Indicator

A new speed indicator has been installed by the bridge near Tesco. Data can be collected remotely and it is already showing us the amount of traffic and the speeds of cars entering and leaving the village. From what we have seen so far most of the traffic does seem to keep to the limit but there are some worrying trends with a significant number of cars travelling over 40 and 50 mph. Something residents knew

intuitively but the data clearly backs this up. Highest recorded speeds are over 60 mph! We are hoping to use the evidence and get the police to take action at a time most likely to catch the worst offenders.

Defibrillator Outside the Pub

We need a volunteer to monitor and inspect the defibrillator mounted on the front of the pub It's a vital capability to have but it must be checked so that it works when required.
