#### GREENER STAPLEHURST GROUP

The GSG have recently spent a lot of their time keeping the village shrubs and flowers watered during the hot sunny weather, not an easy task with eighteen beds and planters to tend!



Maddie's Communal Herb Bed near the library is currently undergoing a face lift with ground cover sheeting being laid, beneath decorative bark, and spring flowering bulbs planted under the Women's Institute tree to further brighten this area.

Remember this area is there for you to plant any spare herbs that you may have and to harvest the leaves that you may need for the pot.

Two additional water butts are also planned for this area as we are preparing ourselves for hot, drier Summers in the future as a result of Global Warming. These were expected to be in situ by now but there have been some delivery problems on which we are working on.

A number of tree saplings have been planted along the Headcorn Road and we anticipate planting many more in other areas of the village this autumn.

raise their pupils' awareness of this local treasure. Nearly three hundred entries were displayed in the library and prizes awarded thanks to the generosity of our sponsors.

Our staff encourage all to love reading and there are many groups that meet here from Baby Rhyme Time through reading and poetry groups to the knit and natterers. There are DVDs and computers available to use and friendly people to offer help when needed. If you're not a member yet, come along and register.

#### **COMMUNITY EVENTS GROUP**

After a quiet few months, it's getting busier for us.

On November 27th (10.00am - 4.00pm) at the Village Centre, we're very pleased that the popular French Market/Christmas Fair is returning after several years'



break due to Covid. Besides the French stalls there'll be plenty of craft stalls to tickle your fancy.

## NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN REVIEW GROUP

The Neighbourhood Plan was published in 2016 and in May 2017 a group of councillors and residents was formed to keep the plan under review. Since then, the group has met monthly. The Plan has been examined, section by section and amendments and additions suggested to the Parish Council. During the last five years slow, but steady progress has been made and the main work of the group is coming to an end. The group has recommended to the council that it should finance the cost of a new Housing Needs Survey and this will take place next spring. It is hoped that early in 2023 the council will be in a position to discuss the proposed revisions with the original authors of the plan and to seek an estimate of the cost of producing a revised edition.


