

#### Creating a cycling network

Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) has launched a survey to understand what cyclists like or dislike about cycling in the county and any problem locations they have.

Feedback from the survey will help OCC to draw up the first Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plans (LCWIPs). These will then be used to help create a network which is attractive, comfortable and easy to use for all cyclists. LCWIPs will identify preferred routes and priority areas for further development over the next 10 years, with the programme dependent on Government funding. The survey closes on September 6, please take a moment or two to highlight the B4449 as a route that you would like prioritised. To take part please click the link Oxfordshire Cycle Survey 2019 and then click the box "other ways to respond to this consultation".

#### Oxfordshire Minerals and Waste Development Scheme

OCC has started work on the 'Minerals and Waste Local Plan: Part 2 – Site Allocations'. This plan will allocate specific sites for waste processing and mineral working including other minerals development for the period to 2031 and will set out detailed policies for management of development of those sites.
