Letter from our Curate:

Dear friends.

All of life is bittersweet. We have learnt this in so many ways this year in particular - the challenges and deep grief of this pandemic has been tinged with so many reasons for hope and thanksgiving. And this letter too is bittersweet - I write to you for the final time as your curate. I will be leaving Hanborough and Freeland in December, to take up a new post as the Priest in Charge of St Mary Magdalene, Hatfield Hyde, which is in Welwyn Garden City.

I leave at a time of transition and great hope for the community and the churches in this place, with the expansion of our communities, and the imminent arrival of your new Rector, The Reverend Steve Stewart, on January 20th. I pray that the God of Hope would fill you with all joy and peace - even in these bittersweet times.

May the Lord bless you and keep you, may God's face shine upon you and be gracious to you, may God look upon you with kindness and give you peace.



SALT CROSS CONSULTATION DELIVERS POSITIVE OUTCOME

Planners at West Oxfordshire District Council say they are pleased with the results of a key consultation surrounding the Salt Cross garden village.

A total of 59 responses were received to the consultation on the draft Area Action Plan (AAP), the majority of which were supportive of the Council's approach which has climate action at its core.

The AAP will provide the next level of detail in the legislative framework against which the recently submitted outline planning application will be measured.

The next steps will involve the AAP being submitted to the Planning Inspectorate and a hearing will be set up in due course.

Cllr Jeff Haine, Cabinet Member for Strategic Planning, said: "It was very encouraging to see such a positive response to the consultation.

"With the help of the AAP, our vision is to set a standard for sustainable living which will hopefully act as a blueprint for future developments both in the District and across the country."

FREELAND PARISH COUNCIL – LISA'S NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS HELD ON 19th OCTOBER AND 16th NOVEMBER 2020

New storage building on field

The new storage building is progressing well, although there has been some delay in getting the concrete floor installed. This will be done shortly, and then work will be carried out to slightly relocate the current footpath by Blenheim Lane to maintain access to the field in this corner.

New salt bin

A new winter salt bin has now been installed by the entrance to the village hall car park so that it can be used as required if we get a hard winter.

Gigaclear - fibre to the premises

I know many residents have raised concerns about letters they have received from Gigaclear about digging up the road near their property to install fibre to the premises to enable faster Broadband speeds to be obtained. Some further details are as follows which I hope will be helpful.

Essentially Gigaclear will install fibre to properties, in narrow trenches dug in the verges or roads. This will give ultra-fast broadband and allow much greater downloads and uploads than currently possible.

Outside of properties they will install POTs (Points of Termination) in the ground. Then, if residents join the system, they will link these POTs to CDCs (Customer Drop Cabinets) next to their homes. If residents wish to link to the fibre network, they need to register for Government paid vouchers (£1,500 for residential properties) which Gigaclear claim and then fit the system for free to the POTs. The link from the POTs to individual home CDCs is also free - provided certain standard criteria are met such as having less than 10 metres of tarmac or concrete to dig up. If they need to dig up longer stretches of driveways than the standard amount allows, there is a charge for the extra work involved.

They hope to start digging by the end of November/beginning of December 2020 (weather permitting) with completion of the work by the end of 2021.

Gigaclear can also be a broadband service provider in place of current service providers but this is an option and residents can continue with their current service provider using the new fibre connection provided that their current service provider is willing to use the Gigaclear network (which currently not all are).

Clearly the digging phase of this operation will cause considerable disruption in the village but the future benefits will be considerable. Further information can be found at www.gigaclear.com or by calling 01865 591137 or emailing networkbuildcare@gigaclear.com.

obtaining food shopping or prescription collections, please don't be afraid to get in touch with me and we will provide some assistance (my contact details are at the bottom of these notes).

The Co-op in Long Hanborough are doing food deliveries again for essential items, and this is available Tuesday – Saturday. Simply call the Co-op's dedicated food ordering line on **0800 435902**, lines are open **08.30-17.00**. One of our volunteers will collect your shopping from the Co-op and deliver it, contactless, to your door between **18.00-20.00**.

For anyone who is particularly worried about managing with prescription collections, please speak to the pharmacy on **01993 880351** to see if you can be put on their list for direct deliveries from them, or alternatively get in touch with myself and we will do our best to help.

The food bank is still in place for the time being, so please continue to donate as and when you can (non-perishable goods only please).

Poppies

Although this wasn't discussed at the meeting, I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to Angela Spriggs for ordering a wreath on behalf of the parish council that was placed on the war memorial on Remembrance Day, and to all those who placed the crosses by the trees and polished the brass plaques. All these small acts make a real difference and are very much appreciated.

Potholes!

As this is the time of year when potholes seem to appear literally everywhere, I thought this was worth mentioning!

If you spot a pothole, the quickest and easiest way to report it directly to OCC Highways is via the Fix my Street website at https://www.fixmystreet.com/
Just put in the postcode or road name, give details of the problem and it will get sent to OCC Highways to be fixed. Photos are often helpful to include as well to help identify where the problem is or how big a pothole it is.

Electric Vehicle Charging Points

For anyone who currently drives an electric car or are considering buying one, WODC are planning to install Electric Vehicle Charging Points (EVCP) in six of the car parks that it owns. This will be done in 2 phases.

The six Council-owned car parks selected for EVCP as part of Phase One are: Carterton (Black Bourton), Chipping Norton (New Street), Eynsham (Back Lane), Witney (Woodford Way and Woodgreen Council Offices) and Woodstock (Hensington Road). Most of the car parks will have 6 charging points (with each capable of charging 2 cars simultaneously) and 12 parking bays each, with the exception of the Woodgreen Council Offices car park which will have 5 EVCP and 10 parking bays. It is estimated that installation of Phase 1 of EVCP will begin next spring and be completed in the summer. Details of Phase 2 EVCP are subject to further viability, site assessment and funding availability but must be completed by March 2022. This project is part of a County-wide scheme that is fully-funded through Innovate-UK and managed by the County Council.

I would like to hand over the troop to a new team, so they have the opportunity to plan how they wish to take the troop forward when normal Scouting is allowed to resume, so do let us know if you would like to get involved.

I have had the best time ever at I st Hanborough Freeland and achieved so much with the Scouts, it has been an absolute pleasure to be a part of the group and I am so proud of what we have accomplished but when the time is right, you just know, and even though it is so difficult to leave something you love, my heart knows I need to step back now. I am not sure what my Scouting future holds, but I will still be in the background with the group.

The week's camps have always been a highlight of the Scouts' year since the first one I ran in 1991 to the Brecon Beacons up until 2019, the only year we didn't have a camp was 2000 as we attended a District Millennium Camp, so 28 weeks camps which is 7 months at camp with well over 500 young people taking part over the years! We have usually had 2 or 3 other weekend camps every year too.

Another highlight would be in December 2002 when I led the County contingent of 4 leaders and 36 young people to the World Scout Jamboree in Thailand for 3 weeks, having spent the previous 18 months fundraising the £100,000 needed to attend. It was a tremendous experience to be with 30,000 young people from all over the world, for 10 days. The first part of the trip was with the 3,000 from the UK staying in one hotel having Christmas dinner together and a service on the beach!

During my time in Scouts I have been presented with a commendation for good service in 1997 followed by a medal of Merit in 2011 and last year a bar to the medal of Merit.

It's been great to get to know many of you in the village over the years many still friends now. Thank you to all the Scouts and also to the other leaders who have put up with me for so long and allowed me to do the things I have done. It's been a fantastic experience. I will still be around to help and support the group as and where I can.





EYNSHAM MEDICAL GROUP - VACCINATION UPDATE FOR PATIENTS

FLU VACCINE

Due to the pandemic, the Practice has seen a vast increase in demand for the vaccination compared to previous years. They have successfully run several flu clinics which have proved extremely effective for delivering the flu vaccinations to large number of patients in a short period of time and will continue to do so.

Ages 18-65 At Risk Patients

The Practice is working through the eligible patient list as quickly as they can and have recently had confirmation that they will be receiving more stock of the vaccination for this group very soon. They are contacting those who are at the highest risk directly but may be releasing more appointments soon which can be booked via the dedicated flu booking line 01993 880786. Please note - the line is extremely busy and will only be manned between 10am and 2pm Mon-Fri. You must listen to the greeting message which will confirm whether there is availability or not. We want to avoid disappointment if you hold to get through and only then find there are none available. Appointments for this age group cannot be booked online.

Age 65 and over

There are some appointments left which can be booked either online via Patient Access or by calling the dedicated flu booking line **01993 880786**. As explained above, the flu line is only manned **10am-2pm Mon-Fri** and you must listen to the greeting message to confirm there is availability.

Age 50-64

The flu vaccination will also be offered **free** to the age group 50-64 from 1 December, but the Practice will need to make arrangements for how this will be done. **Please do not contact the surgeries just yet but check the news section of the website regularly for any updates to this.**

COVID VACCINE

It has been well publicised in the news recently that there is a Covid-19 Vaccine that the Government intend to roll out once all the final safety checks have been made. The Practice is awaiting further guidance from NHS England and will inform their patients as soon as possible. Appointments for this vaccine are not available at this time.

FREELAND SPEEDWATCH

Due to the impact of Covid-19, Speedwatch was one of the many activities that had to be suspended back in March. Thames Valley Police have now confirmed that Speedwatch sessions can now be resumed.

It will be apparent to all local residents that many vehicles speed through the village. The group have previously recorded some drivers reaching speeds in excess of 50mph. The presence of members of the group along Wroslyn Road and at The Green had a positive impact and saw a reduction in both the number of drivers speeding and the speeds recorded. During lockdown it has been noticeable that speeds have crept up once again.

The collection of data is not only important for Thames Valley Police but will also be a useful tool in discussions with Oxfordshire County Council when considering the impact of the proposed Park and Ride and building of Salt Cross, the new garden village. This will be particularly relevant to us if we do not want Freeland to become a route for heavy construction vehicles or to become a rat run.

We are a small group of volunteers and would encourage more people to join us. Could you spare an hour or two a week to help record the number and speed of motorists at various times of the day and on different days of the week?

FREELAND GARDENING CLUB

How quickly the year seems to have gone and it is time to wish all our members and fellow Freelanders a Very Happy Christmas. It has been a very unusual year which we hope is never repeated. However the garden and nature carries on in such a wonderful way, and there are still lots of jobs that can be done when the weather allows us to get out.

One of the main jobs for many people is raking leaves off the lawn and possibly some flower beds. Put them in a plastic bag, such as an old compost bag, press them down firmly and leave to rot down into a good mulch in about 2 years' time. Remove all spent crops such as courgettes and together with dead annuals etc. add them to the compost bin or heap. If you have a greenhouse and use it to keep delicate plants in during the winter, line the glass with bubble wrap to insulate it. Clean the greenhouse thoroughly first. Watch out for pests such as slugs hiding in damp place and woolly aphids which appear on apple trees. These can be scrubbed off or washed off with water with a drop of washing up liquid added.

Soft fruit can be pruned at this time. Check on line or a gardening book which and how they can be cut back. Cut back buddleia and rose bushes. New bare root roses are a cheaper way to grow new bushes.

Garden birds will be hungrier soon, so keep bird feeders clean and topped up. They also need a source of clean water to drink.

During winter house plants are just the tonic. Some house plants enjoy a time in the garden in the summer so bring them in now and give them a clean and tidy up. Most will benefit from a good source of light. Turn them from time to time to prevent them leaning one way to get the light. House plants can improve the air by filling it with oxygen as a by product of photosynthesis. Having a variety of leaf shapes and colour can revitalise us, also they can benefit us when we tend them and fuss over them! Misting them helps to improve humidity.

Winter need not be a dull time for gardeners as we continue tending our plants inside rather than outside.

We still do not know when Gardening Club meetings will be allowed, but as the nights are dark and cold maybe restarting in the Spring would suit many of us.

NORTH LEIGH ROMAN VILLA SITE OX29 6PZ

The remains of North Leigh Roman Villa are set within a peaceful landscape on the banks of the River Evenlode in Oxfordshire. This 'courtyard villa' is considered one of the larger villas of Roman Britain. It was at its most extensive in the early 4th century when it included four bath suites, 16 mosaic floors and 11 rooms with under-floor heating.

Today, the rectangular arrangement of the villa is visible. However, the most important feature of the site is a nearly complete mosaic tile floor dating to the 3rd century. Read more about the history of North Leigh Roman Villa at https://www.english-

The mosaics in the Villa are only accessible during Open Days. The next Open Days will be in the Spring of 2021.

Access: Access to the site is via an uneven farm track, which can become muddy in wet weather and may be unsuitable for wheelchairs or mobility scooters.

Opening times: The site is open all year round.

Parking: There is parking space for several cars in a lay-by on the roadside, directly opposite the farm track down to the villa. There is a walk of approximately 0.5km down a farm track to the site entrance.

Facilities: There are no facilities onsite.

Group visits: Our volunteer team may be able to facilitate group visits to view the mosaics. Booking is essential and is subject to availability, please

Dogs: Dogs on leads are welcome.


