On September 1st we had a gang of 'tarmaccers' in our area offering to sell tarmac at a cheap price, we are aware that a black Land Rover registration DA13 VSZ was calling on houses in Ellisfield and in Herriard they were engaged until stopped by a local neighbour. I urge all residents to seriously consider buying things from cold callers at your door, if you want what they have to offer I advise you to contact Hampshire Trading Standards on 01962833620 or check their booklet 'Buy With Confidence' where every company listed has been vetted by the Trading Standards and so you will not be conned to pay more for a job than is required.

As the evenings are now drawing in may I remind you to consider leaving lights on when you go out in the evenings, ideally use timers if away overnight. May I also remind all residents to not leave their car keys on display, recently in the Basingstoke area we have seen homes broken into where the keys to high performance cars have been found and the cars have been stolen, this is an area of concern and there have been several burglaries in the North Hampshire area, including in Hook of this type. Please keep your car keys safe and homes safe and secure. If you need any crime prevention advice please give me a call direct.




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Local History

Grants available for first-time central heating in Hampshire

Through Hitting the Cold Spots, Hampshire County Council and the Environment Centre (tEC) can help with the cost of installing first-time gas central heating in qualifying homes.

As always any food produce given as a gift during the services will be passed on to Camrose in Basingstoke, which is a drop-in centre primarily aimed at helping homeless and vulnerable people, It offers breakfast and a hot lunch, table tennis & games, advice on housing, employment, drugs and alcohol issues, telephone and computer facilities to assist with job applications, etc. and training in a variety of topics.

Adult Confirmation Preparation

At baptism, usually as babies when of course we're unable to speak for ourselves, parents and godparents promise to walk with us in the way of faith and are entrusted with our growth in faith. At confirmation we can speak for ourselves as we say yes to Jesus' call to follow him on our journey through life. Once confirmed we're then able to share fully in the Eucharist, which for many Christians is the most important act of worship. This is when, in communion with others, we repeat the action Jesus performed with his disciples on the night before he died. As the Eucharistic prayer says: "We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body because we all share in one bread", and we do this together in community as the people of Christ to remember him and all that he did for us and means to us still today.

From a Churchwarden (and mother of a young farmer)

Dear Friends,

I am lucky to have married into a farming family and we now care for three beautiful little farms in Old Basing. I thank God every day for the privilege of being a custodian of His most beautiful land. Over the next couple of weeks our villages will celebrate their Harvest Festivals and there is something very basic and satisfying that Mother Nature has once again "brought forth its increase". But let me share with you that harvest for any farmer or grower is a time of huge pressure and can be quite stressful. It starts in late May for the livestock farmers who battle with the rain and cold to make hay and forage crops which is their harvest. Moving onto the vegetable and fruit farmers who struggle with the risk of too much or too little rain and sunshine. And then the arable farmers who apart from battling with the elements, also have to worry if the price for which they sell their grain will actually cover the input costs. This is why we see the smaller holdings and dairy units going out of business. This country seems to have got the balance of subsidies whilst trying to retain cheap food totally wrong. Yet despite all of this we have the highest standards of crop and animal husbandry in the world. Our new generation of young farmers are totally dedicated to food production and farming in a sustainable countryside. They have also totally embraced modern technology with precision machinery at every stage of the growing cycle and chemicals and fertilisers that do not damage the land for future generations.

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The Old Testament had a lot to say about the fruitfulness of the earth, about rich and heavy crops being gathered in, connecting us to God through his bounteous gifts which feed us both literally and spiritually. The Gospels continue the theme. Jesus talked about corn, and the bread made from it, about grapes and the wine made from them, about olives and olive oil, about figs, honey and other good things; about the seasons, weather and the time of harvest. Jesus linked the spiritual and practical in simple and memorable stories and acts, not the least being the sharing of bread as a symbol of his continuing presence with us all.

So where are we heading? The weekend before last I walked our five churches as part of the Ride & Stride fund raising day which was a very wet day. My route took me from Greywell to Mapledurwell via Up Nately and then back to Newnham finishing at my base at Nately Scures. On foot one realises that we have some of the most twisting and winding roads in Britain. Over the years the way we think about our relationship with God and how we relate to His grace and bounty towards us also seems to have taken some twists and turns yet all the while gradually helping us to make progress, eventually getting us to where we need to be.

Please be mindful when shopping, look for the Red Tractor or Fairtrade symbol, and keep those farmers and growers in mind. We are the tools in the hand of the Master Gardener and He wants us to do incredible work in our church and bring about a bumper crop!

Food Bank Initiative Update

You will recall that we advertised the need to help the food banks in Basingstoke and Hook some months ago. This has received very good support from our five churches (although we could always do with more!), but we have recently been told by the food bank that the following items are of urgent need, namely:
