Season's Greetings

How to stay warm and well this winter

Winter is coming, and with it comes the challenge of keeping ourselves warm and healthy. Cold weather can affect anyone, but especially older people, people with long-term health conditions, pregnant women, young children, and people living in poor housing conditions. Exposure to cold can increase the risk of illnesses such as flu, pneumonia, asthma, and falls. Therefore, it is important to follow some tips to stay warm and well this winter.



Keep your home warm

One of the most effective ways to protect yourself from the cold is to keep your home at a comfortable temperature. The UK Health Security Agency recommends heating rooms you spend a lot of time in, such as the living room or bedroom, to at least 18°C¹. You can also reduce draughts by fitting draft excluders around doors and windows, and closing curtains at night. If you have a fireplace, make sure it is clean and safe to use. You can also use electric blankets or hot water bottles to warm up your bed, but be careful not to burn yourself.

If you are worried about the cost of heating your home, you may be eligible for some financial support, such as grants, benefits, or discounts on your energy bills. <u>You can find out more about the available schemes on the government website</u> or by contacting <u>Shropshire Council</u> or your energy supplier.

Eat well

Another way to keep warm is to eat well and drink plenty of fluids. Hot food and drinks can help you maintain your body temperature and boost your immune system. Try to have at least one hot meal a day and several hot drinks throughout the day. You can also snack on foods that are high in energy, such as nuts, cheese, or chocolate. Aim to eat a balanced diet that includes fruit and vegetables, which can provide you with vitamins and minerals that are essential for your health.

It is also a good idea to stock up on some basic food items in case you cannot get out to the shops due to bad weather or illness. You can use frozen, tinned, or dried foods that have a long shelf life and are easy to prepare. For example, you can make soups, stews, casseroles, or pasta dishes with canned tomatoes, beans, lentils, or meat. You can also use bread, crackers, cereal, or biscuits for breakfast or snacks.

Get your winter vaccinations

Winter is also the season when infectious diseases such as flu and coronavirus are more common and can cause serious complications for some people. Therefore, it is important to get vaccinated against these diseases if you are eligible. The flu vaccine is free for people who are aged 65 or over, pregnant women, people with certain health conditions, and carers. The coronavirus vaccine is free for everyone aged 12 or over in the UK. You can book your appointments online or by calling 119.

Getting vaccinated not only protects you from getting sick, but also helps prevent the spread of these diseases to others who may be more vulnerable. Vaccinations are safe and effective and have been tested by experts. They may cause some mild side effects such as soreness at the injection site, headache, or fever, but these usually go away within a few days.

Keep moving

Physical activity is another way to keep warm and well this winter. Moving your body can help you improve your blood circulation, strengthen your muscles and bones, and lift your mood. You do not have to do strenuous exercise to benefit from physical activity; even gentle movements can make a difference. Try not to sit still for more than an hour at a time; get up and walk around your home or garden every now and then. You can also do some simple exercises such as stretching, bending, or lifting your arms and legs while sitting on a chair or sofa.

If you feel confident enough, you can also go outside for a walk or a bike ride when the weather is fine. Just make sure you dress warmly and wear appropriate footwear to avoid slipping on ice or snow. You can also join a local group or club that organises outdoor activities for older people or people with health conditions. This can be a great way to meet new people and have fun while staying active.

Stay connected

Last but not least, staying in touch with your family, friends, neighbours, and community can help you stay warm and well this winter. You could join a local club or group and socialising with others can lift your spirits and prevent loneliness and isolation.

Support service returns to help keep people well this winter

The Winter Support Service has returned for a fourth year. During the coming months the service will assist residents (18+) who may need a little additional support to maintain their independence and remain well at home or following a hospital discharge. The Winter Support Service, running until 31 March 2024, has been reinstated to support people to avoid a health and care crisis over the winter period.



Shropshire's Winter Support Service will be run by Shropshire Council, in partnership with British Red Cross, Shropshire Mental Health Support, Age UK Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin, Qube (in Oswestry), Mayfair Community Centre (in Church Stretton), Royal Voluntary Service and, new to the partnership this year, we are delighted to welcome Hands Together Ludlow.

What will the service provide?

The service will connect people to a range of support including: -Collection and delivery of medications -Shopping and delivery –Wellbeing 'check in and chat' –Companionship for isolated or lonely people –The expertise of a mental health outreach worker –Signposting towards meals provision –Community transport (subject to local availability, fees may apply) –Cost of living advice and support –Connectivity into wider support offered across the voluntary, community and public sector.

It will also ensure safe and supported discharges home from hospital. This includes: Transport returning home from hospital, Settling people in at home following discharge from hospital and Simple aids and equipment following hospital discharge.

Shropshire's Winter Support Service does not offer a crisis response or personal care, but will work as part of the health and care system to ensure people get the support they need through appropriate referrals and signposting to local sources of support.

Shropshire's Winter Support Service is part of the council's commitment to support people to remain both physically and mentally well, particularly during the winter months.

How do I find out more? Individual residents, their families and those who support people across Shropshire's communities can call the Winter Support Service helpline on 0345 678 9012 to find out more and be referred where appropriate. The phoneline will be open Mondays-Fridays, 9am to 5pm.

Much Wenlock & Cressage Medical Practice Update

As we approach the end of another year, we are reflecting on yet another busy year in Primary Care. Over the past 14 months we have seen 2 of our long-standing Partners retire, Dr Bailey in October 22 and Dr Hay in October 23. In November 23 we welcomed Dr Maurice Price as a new Partner, who is working 3 days a week at the Practice.

Dr Moussa and Dr Hmon completed their GP Placements with us, and Dr Moussa has since returned as a long -term locum, covering maternity leave. Dr Redgate joined us in April 2023 on a 12-month contract. We also welcomed Dr Ruemu and Dr Amara on their 12-month placements as GP Registrars.

We have consolidated our nursing team with the additional of Zoe Williams as Practice Nurse and Holly Hensley as Health Care Assistant. Our Clinical Nurse Lead, Sister Leitch, gained her spirometry qualification enabling this service to be restarted at the Practice. Our Health Care Assistant, Leonie Emery obtained her General Practice Assistant qualification enabling her to work closely with the GP's and hopefully reduce some of their administrative burden and provide clinical support to the administration team.

In March 23 Chloe Allmark, a member of the reception team, completing a Business Administration Apprenticeship with us and continues to develop within the Practice. Chloe was awarded "The Most Committed Apprentice" County Training Award. The Practice also received the "Employer of the Year" County Training Award.

Changes in administration and dispensary teams; all settling into their roles, including a member of our reception team, Sarah Fenton, who has taken over the Community Care Co-Ordinator role.

In the 12 months from 1 Nov 22 to 31 Oct 23 over 44200 appointments (including flu clinics, homes visits, visits to care homes) were provided by the Practice and associated clinicians caring for a total of 6737 patients (with 1225 DNA's).

2023 GP National Survey

In the 2023 National GP Patient Survey we achieved a score of 83% for good or very good the overall experience of this Practice compared to the national score of 71% and score for Shropshire Telford and Wrekin in of 73%.

97% of patients said their needs were meet either definitely or to some extent. The Practice scored less highly on satisfaction with the general practice appointment times available, scoring 44% as compared to the national average of 53% and Shropshire Telford and Wrekin average of 52%. We have introduced an easier online appointment system this year via 'Online Triage' to improve patient access and have introduced additional roles such as Health and Wellbeing Advisors.

We will continue to review and develop our systems in the coming months.


