Minutes of the Monthly Meeting of Stockton Parish Council Held in Stockton Village Hall at 7.15pm on 26th September 2022.

The Chairman welcomed all to the meeting.

The Chairman brought forward agenda item 15, and 16 to accommodate Principal authority members in attendance.

Item 16. District Council Issues.

District Cllr.Adam noted that there are still issues with the bin collections in various parishes but pointed out that if there are villagers still having problems please let him know and he will take each case up individually.

With regard to the planning issues at Stockton Hall Farm Cllr.Adam noted that a new planning application will be forthcoming and the District Council will look at the application rather than pursue enforcement action. It appears that the District Council seems to think that this will be the most effective way of dealing with the matter.

Item 15. County Council Issues

County Cllr.Crump noted that a letter has been sent to all residents adjacent to George Street green regarding the parking of vehicles on the green and access across the pavement, and also pointing out that a new bollard will be erected. Cllr.Crump noted that there have been issues with school buses not stopping in the correct places.

Cllr.Crump also noted that problems with school places have mostly been dealt with except for one case in Stockton.

The County Council has noted that the increase in inflation is having an effect upon its budget.

Cllr.Crump noted that Severn Trent Water want to close High Street from the 20th to 22nd of November.

Cllr.Crump noted that there are still HS2 traffic lights on the A425

Cllr.Crump noted that the County Council is investing in a tree nursery (with trees for sale to all authorities.

Cllr Crump noted that with regard to the potential speed signs through the village the County Council officer to advise is Scott Tompkins.

Cllr.Crump indicated that the County Council are aware of the issues with Stockton Hall Farm,

The Chairman thanked both Cllrs, for their attendance.

Item 1. Open Forum

The member of the public in attendance raised the issue of a letter delivered to residents at Jubilee Fields telling residents that the children should play in the memorial field rather than the green at Jubilee fields, other residents indicated to the member of the public that this would be disrespectful. After discussion the Parish Council reiterated the view that children can play where they choose on either green.
