### **Rushbury Parish Council Information**

Over Christmas and New Year RAF Shawbury have shared a number of posts on social media regarding people getting drones for Christmas .

Received a new drone for Christmas? Fantastic! They are a great piece of amazing technology, but we need to share the air safely and responsibly by following the Civil Aviation Authority Drone and Model Aircraft Code. Did you know that Point 3 of the Drone and Model Aircraft Code says "Always look and listen out for other aircraft that may be flying below 400ft, such as air ambulances, police helicopters, and low-flying military aircraft." Helicopters from No. 1 Flying Training School, based at RAF Shawbury, routinely fly down to 100ft in Shropshire and surrounding areas, well below the 400ft maximum for drones.

Help us to all stay safe by being extra vigilant when flying in Shropshire and surrounding areas, and if you can, bring a friend or family member to keep a lookout too.

# News from Shropshire County Council...

### NEW WHEELIE BIN FOR RECYCLING CANS, GLASS AND PLASTIC

All householders in the Shropshire Council area can now request an additional wheelie bin for recycling cans, glass and plastic after a meeting of the full Shropshire Council approved an investment of almost £3m to fund the extra bin. The bin – which is optional and free for householders- can be requested online at <u>https://</u> <u>shropshire.gov.uk/requestmixedrecyclingbin</u> The first bins are set to be delivered from May this year, starting in the South Shropshire area, before being rolled out across the county. The bin will replace the existing black recycling boxes, and help to increase the amount of waste recycled by providing households with a larger container.

It will also reduce the amount of waste lost to the recycling process after being blown out of the boxes on windy days,

It will make the storage of recycling more convenient for residents, and reduce the amount of bending and lifting for residents and waste and recycling crews.

Some households may not want a bin due to housing layout or the lack of storage space for the bin. These residents would be able to continue to use their existing waste containers, as will those residents who simply prefer to use boxes.

People will also be able to use their new bin as well as their recycling boxes.

Those who no longer need their recycling boxes will be encouraged to retain and reuse them for different purposes – or take them to a recycling centre to be recycled.

#### about your recycling service You can now order a new bin to replace your black recycling boxes. The new bin - which is optional - will make it easier for you to recycle your plastic, cans and glass. But it is not for paper and cardboard, please continue to use your blue sack for these materials. 1 The bin which will have a purple lid is being introduced following requests from residents and will help us all to recycle more 0 How to order your new bin lastic, glas Please only call us if you cannot access the online request fo as we anticipate that our phone lines will be very busy. When will I get my new bin? Deliveries will start from Spring and will gradually be rolled out across the county over a number of months. What do I do with my black boxes? Please keep them - Veolia's collection crews will collect the mixed recycling from both boxes and bins. Use them for other purposes - for example for storage or

planters for the garden. Be imaginative with them! If you don't want to hang onto your black boxes, please return them to your nearest Household Recycling Centre to be recycled. Thanks for recycling







Dear friends,

Every winter I watch more films and dramas on TV. I think the darker evenings are to blame. The appeal of spending an evening with a good film while the wind and rain howl outside is too strong to resist. It's even more tempting if a take-away is thrown in for good measure!

This winter has been no different. But I feel like I have started to notice a bit of a trend. Mainly, that some films over- rely on violence to try and be appealing. Now, I know this is nothing new. Sometimes, my favourite films have some violence in them. But to watch James Bond kill somewhere in the region of 50 individuals over one or two scenes troubled me. It was troubling to watch as a 28-year-old used to films; it was even more troubling to watch as a Christian and a priest!

For me, the best films are ones that help us search for truth and meaning in our world. They spark wonder in our minds, speak to emotions in our hearts, and help us ask questions of ourselves and society.

One particular drama over the winter period both inspired and moved me. It didn't rely on big scenes or C.G.I. violence, or even a particularly large budget. Instead, it told the powerful story of a mother's search for truth and justice.

'Anne' tells the story of Anne Williams, whose son was unlawfully killed in the Hillsborough disaster. We watch as she says goodbye to her son on the morning of 15<sup>th</sup> April 1989. He is going to attend a football match in Sheffield. His favourite team, Liverpool, are playing in the FA Cup semi-final against Nottingham Forest at the neutral Hillsborough Stadium. We don't see the disaster itself. But, watching over 30 years or so later, we know exactly what happens, and we know, tragically, the meaning of her son not returning home that evening.

Over the course of the drama we are taken on a journey through grief and anger, through the breaking down and the establishing of relationships, through betrayal and disappointment before, finally, arriving at the truth. Along the way, there is an unceasing desire for justice. This desire for justice exposes institutional corruption, smear campaigns, and the question of ethics in the press. But, importantly, this quest for justice comes from normal people and their love for each other and their families.

Normal people, as prophets of their time. I use the word prophets, because a prophet is someone who speaks truth to power, usually in the face of resistance or persecution.

The Bible is full of prophets. They are normal people who God chooses to speak truth to power, even if the cost is great. They expose the failings of structures that exploit the poor, go to war unnecessarily, and oppress the weak. They declare God's intentions and plans for His people; plans that are often at odds with the societies in which they live. Prophets like Isaiah, Micah, or Jeremiah come to mind. But there are many others too; scattered throughout both the Old and New Testaments.

And, I believe, we too are all called to be prophets. We, as ordinary people, can point to extraordinary truths; that love triumphs over hatred, community defeats division, and hope drives out despair. We can do this even in the smallest of ways. But, collectively, we can change the world. Ordinary people, called by God to do extraordinary things.




## The Honeypot Book Reviews
