Dear resident


Welcome to this Spring edition of our Parish Council newsletter. We hope you enjoy reading about what we have been doing on your behalf and some of our plans for the future.

If you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor please come along to our Annual Parish Meeting in the village hall on Tuesday 16th May where you can meet existing Councillors and find out more about the role.

A great deal of the Parish Council's time is spent on planning issues, considering both the here and now and the future of our parish. The Parish Council does not approve or refuse planning applications, we are a statutory consultee and comment on the effect applications would have on our residents and the local area, using planning policy to guide us. The majority of planning applications are decided by delegated powers to MBC planning officers however we do have the ability to insist an application is decided by elected members and in this instance we attend the relevant MBC planning meeting to have our say. Parish Council planning meetings are always open to the public and advertised in advance on our website and the Church Street noticeboard. Do come along and make your views known.

Another area of our work is highway issues. KCC are the responsible highway authority and have sole responsibility for maintenance of roads throughout the county. We meet regularly with KCC officers and your elected KCC member, Cllr Lottie Parfitt-Reid, to discuss issues affecting us in Boughton Monchelsea and we lobby for improvements and report faults (which any member of the public can also do

As advised in the last newsletter we now have agreement from KCC to install programmable flashing lights either side of the pedestrian crossing on Heath Road which will turn on and off automatically at school run times. We hope to install these lights later this year. KCC are also looking into further minor improvement works on Heath Road including additional painted speed limit roundels and visual narrowing at the entry points to the 30mph limit. We appreciate these measures will have limited effect on the speed of traffic but we have been pleased to see the Police carrying out speed enforcement several times over the last few months. There have been several recent accidents on Heath Road which concerns us all. Highway safety has always been high on our agenda but we will be meeting with KCC very soon to discuss what else can reasonably be done.

We take great pride in the appearance, maintenance and protection of our semi-rural parish and spend much time and effort, with the help of our landscape maintenance contractor, volunteers and our close links with BMAT to make improvements and keep the parish looking good. Our projects are often small and would otherwise go unnoticed – we recently installed a bench on the new accessible path along Green Lane, somewhere new to sit and enjoy our lovely village.

We are often not directly responsible for issues with a negative effect on the parish but we work closely with the relevant authorities and regularly report problems such as fly tipping and overgrown footpaths. As a resident, you can play your part by using the relevant online portals to report issues as and when they arise. For public rights of way, use https://www.kent.gov.uk/environment-waste-and-planning/public-rights-of-way/report-a-problem-on-a-right-of-way For fly tipping report via https://maidstone.gov.uk/home/primary-services/street-care-and-cleaning/litter,-bins-and-street-sweeping/report-fly-tipping. With fly tipping in particular, MBC act very quickly to remove dumped material and have been successful in finding and prosecuting offenders.

2022 saw the passing of our dear Queen and we have recently installed a memorial bench on the village green. We have also agreed to rename the rec the 'Queen Elizabeth II recreation ground' and will be holding a naming ceremony on 1st July 2023, the day of the village fete. We would be very happy to consider further benches in the north part of the parish so please get in touch if you have any ideas.

With the arrival of Spring our allotment plot holders are already hard at work digging and planting. We have recently installed two new water tanks at our Langley Park allotment site to make watering easier over the summer months. We also have an allotment site in the village, off Haste Hill Road. There are no vacant plots at either site at the moment but if you live in the parish of Boughton Monchelsea and would like to join the waiting list please contact the parish clerk

Speedwatch

We have long been concerned about the speed of traffic on Heath Road and despite the speed limit reduction from 40 to 30mph, we are disappointed that some motorists continue to drive far too fast. We have been lucky enough to recruit a number of new Speedwatch volunteers over the last year and we are very grateful to all our volunteers for their time and help, the group has racked up a total 336 speeders reported to the police.

As part of Speedwatch, registered keepers of vehicles exceeding the speed limit are contacted - initially with a letter explaining the potential risks and consequences of their dangerous behaviour. Repeat offenders will receive a visit from the local police, irrespective of where they live. Beyond these friendly gestures, focused enforcement and criminal prosecution follow, based on collated evidence.

Boughton Monchelsea village hall remodelling project

The village hall was built in the 1970s before climate change and renewable energy were topics of conversation. The building was poorly insulated, equating to high energy bills and the layout was not conducive to current and future needs. At present we have a large main hall and a smaller committee room, a large unused stage area and poorly arranged storage. The remodelling project will address all these issues to give a more flexible, usable space, improved energy efficiency and other features to increase income, ensuring the hall is self-sufficient into the future.

Building work has already started and completed work includes a new, insulated roof, cavity wall insulation, air source heat pumps, roof mounted solar panels with battery storage, electric heaters and improved wifi. The remaining scope for phase 1 includes building a small extension to house childrens toilets and a new store room, to be accessed from the main hall. In addition, a partition wall has been constructed in the committee room to form a new entrance for all hirers. The existing kitchen and foyer areas are also being remodelled to retain a kitchen for the main hall as well as creating a self-contained coffee shop area complete with its own small kitchen.

Future phases will include reconfiguration of the internal space at the rear of the hall to provide additional rooms for hire, improvements to the external façade and car park works.

We look forward to sharing more details of the remodelling work as the project proceeds.

BMAT progress on Nature Recovery

BMAT owns land around the parish and is working hard to provide improved habitat for nature and for the community to enjoy. We have had great support from volunteers who have joined Friends of BMAT and this year have joined several work parties to help create a fabulous future for our area. In addition to helping reverse the decline in biodiversity, good habitat creation enables us to fight climate change through a process known as carbon sequestration. Additional benefits include cleaner air, flood and drought protection and help for agriculture though boosting pollinator numbers.

Salts Wood

The trees are doing very well and the regular presence of buzzards and kestrels indicates healthy small mammal populations living in the wood.

Volunteers regularly restore tree supports that have been damaged, pick up litter and ensure bramble encroachment is reduced.

Firmins Field

This year gaps in the trees have been in filled with a selection of native species, the wildflower area has been raked and a new hedgerow has been planted. We aim to be on top of the thistles with an earlier cut and regular maintenance around the trees this year.

Walk Meadow

There is a lovely new pond which needed restoration following unfortunate vandalism. Local volunteers are keeping the area litter free and ensuring the trees are given the best opportunity to thrive. The wildflower area is ready to start blooming and will hopefully be as magnificent as last year.

Lyewood

The footpath running parallel to Green Lane is open and well used. Residents joined two big tree planting events and over 600 trees have been planted. This year the site will be prepared for a species rich meadow with ponds and further walking areas.

Furfield Park

The open space continues to be enjoyed by many residents and this large area provides rich habitat for wildlife

Langley Park

Residents organised a major litter pick and the country park has recently been transferred to BMAT ownership although a management company is responsible for its maintenance.

BMAT would like to thank all the volunteers and Friends of BMAT who are helping nature recover in these lovely areas, providing opportunities for residents to enjoy the countryside and gain many health benefits from exercise, fresh air and nature connection.
