On the 12th of the month the complete contents are handed over to a member of the layout team, whose role it is to present the magazine as attractively as possible, squeezing in all the information in a busy month, or spreading it out in a quiet month!

After a final edit the magazine is ready to be printed.... or, more accurately, photocopied! On the last Thursday and Friday of each month the Kingsmill room is transformed into a sweatshop, with the printing and assembly teams collating, stapling and overseeing the insertion of fliers.

Finally the distribution team get to deliver the magazine to the 1,700 homes in the village. There is an army of committed volunteers involved in producing the Tower, and we're proud to find ourselves playing a small part in the process.

Nature Notes

At last, we have had a good year for butterflies. Not only are there more of them this year but there is a good range of species. The commonest coloured butterflies (in August) have been Peacocks with their bold eye patterns, followed by Small Tortoiseshells, a welcome come-back as we saw only two last year and a good spread of whites and browns. For much of the



Summer Brimstones were common but it has definitely not been a Painted Lady year as only one bedraggled specimen seen.

Where topsoil had been stripped from a field in preparation for gravel extraction burdock had grown densely and to a height not seen before, some bushes to six feet. These are the familiar plants whose dried seed heads or burrs stick firmly to clothes, nature's Velcro. The average height is usually around three feet.

Some young flower plants belonging to the cabbage family had attracted small white butterflies intent on laying eggs. A cover of fine mesh chicken wire was put over the plants, no problem for the butterflies! They just folded their fragile wings and squeezed through, so strong is the urge to propagate.

As Ash is the latest on the list of diseased trees we were very heartened to note how vigorous some recently cut ones were. The plants in question were naturally seeded in a car park hedge. Ash now dominates the hedge and after radical pruning in April the new growth is abundant, healthy and about five feet tall.

Has your cat been neutered?

Each year, Cats Protection take into care many young cats as a direct result of owners not neutering. Often, mother and kittens are simply abandoned as the cost of many new furry mouths to feed becomes too much. What many owners are not aware of is that a female cat can be ready to breed from as early as four months old; five to eight months in most cases.

Neutering not only prevents unwanted pregnancies and a growing feral cat population, it can also improve your cat's long-term health. Neutered cats are less likely to wander, and are also less likely to spray if male. There is also a reduced chance of contracting some infectious cat diseases and tumours. Male cats in particular will improve in physical body condition and their urine will smell less pungent!

In 2011, Cats Protection spent over five million pounds either neutering cats in our care, or assisting owners to neuter if they matched certain financial criteria. If one of your cats still requires neutering, please do consult your vet.

This month we feature not one cat but two in search of a home, Mickey and his twin brother Rufus. They are about 10 months old and we would like them to be homed together. Memories: Blue Meadow, Garrett Close

The name Blue Meadow evokes happy memories of cattle driving as a youngster, from near where Rose Hodson Court has been built, crossing the A339 into Union Lane. Thankfully there was not a lot of traffic, nor a bypass.

My father, Arthur Foster, rented Blue Meadow from Mr Tom Garrett Senior, followed by his son, also Tom. This was the remains of Garrett's Farm. The family had this before the petrol pump and garage served the people around, before I was born.

Mrs Eddie Nash (née Wellman), when still a child, used to go from her home in North St to collect milk from Garrett's Farm, and deliver it to Headmaster Charles Stevens at the Schoolhouse, also on North St, (where the Medical Centre is now). Dad also rented a meadow in the marsh (Newbury Rd) from Mrs Alice Dollery who lived at Eastbourne Villa. This house was built in 1912 when her parents, Mr and Mrs Fisher, retired from The Star Inn. Mr and Mrs Dollery bought the meadow for £100 after winning a competition about gardening.

My father also rented a meadow from Mr William Ingram Drake (no relation), and later from Mrs Hardy. They both lived at Keeps Cottage, which Mr Drake had built when he retired about 1920.

Mrs Hardy found some dentures in the meadow and wondered if they were her dad's. Fortunately he had never lost his false teeth!

Later Gordon and I rented just one meadow from Hampshire Country Council, where later Rose Hodson Court was built, where we made hay for our steers.

At one time there was talk of building a middle school on the land. It was considered too far from the primary school in North St, where the pupils from the proposed middle school would share the swimming pool.

I have been so very touched by all the messages of love and support that members of St. Mary's have shown to us over the last few months, for Michael's health and well being, and their general concern. Hedgehog Conservation Project

A team of ecologists based at the University of Reading are conducting a project examining the possible impact of road networks on hedgehog populations, following a decline of approximately 20% in numbers over the last 20 years.

The team are looking to obtain genetic samples from hedgehogs in an area approximately 10 miles north and south of the M4 between Bristol and Reading. One source of these genetic samples is the bodies of hedgehogs that have been killed on the roads. As many hedgehogs now seem to be living in and around villages, the team are hoping to enlist the help of people living in this study area by getting them to report any sightings they have of dead hedgehogs so the team can collect the remains and take a small tissue sample for analysis.

The team would like people living around Ashford Hill, Headley and Kingsclere to report any sightings of dead hedgehogs on local roads via email: hedgehogs@reading.ac.uk
