

ERM Report

The Local Plan resumes on 11th July at West Oxfordshire District Council offices. Session 2, concerning specific sites – public are welcome to the session.

The ERM Report (which is available to view on the PC website) will be discussed concerning the Airfield Planning in Matter 14 and the PC will have representation (allocated time is 18/07 am/pm or 19/07 am).

Speedwatch

The Sutton and Stanton Harcourt Group have been monitoring the speeds of traffic through Sutton (B4449) and Stanton Harcourt at Steadys Lane since October 2016. We have monitored several thousand vehicles and much to my regret we do not seem to have achieved the aim we set out in that the level of speeding

does not seem to have decreased. To date we have recorded over 838 offenders of whom 68 are multiple offenders with 18 having offended 3 or more times. These results have all been passed on to Thames Valley Police. The majority of speeding takes place at the entrance to Stanton Harcourt by Steadys Lane, the speed of traffic on the B4449 seems to be mainly self limiting in busy times but can be a problem when the rush hour is over. We will continue monitoring and hope we do not observe any of our villagers speeding!
