In the July Newsletter I set out some details of the preparation work being carried out for the Winter Leagues, and this was presented in more detail in the pack sent out to all members in early August titled Winter Leagues 2022-23.

This included details of the handicapping system the purpose of which is to try and make games more competitive for all level of players - to try and stop the trend of some teams getting beaten each time by large margins and quitting leagues to play in roll-ups with their friends of similar ability.

Most players will have a zero handicap but those who have played in teams that finished 1st, 2nd or 3rd last year will have handicaps of between -1 and -3. These will be displayed on the notice boards in the coming weeks.

It also mentioned that I was working on the assumption that if you captained a team and/or played in a team last year that would continue UNLESS you told me to the contrary. If you are not planning to continue, please let me know urgently.

I hope to resurrect the triples league Friday 12 - only two teams at the moment so would, of course, welcome more.

Also, we could do with more entrants to the pairs leagues on Tuesday and Friday playing 8pm to 10pm.

The leagues are due to start w/c 3/10 and I hope to get paperwork out to captains in a couple of weeks.

To answer some questions posed by several new members especially in respect of the meaning of various headings such a KCIBA:-

The following is especially for new members either new to bowls or to indoor bowls. The world of bowls is not alone in being complex with world and international 'forums', not covered here, as well as a variety of more local organisations. However, here a very brief outline of the Centre and indoor bowls and local connections.

BIBC Ltd that is **Bromley Indoor Bowls Centre Ltd** is run by a Board of Directors elected at an AGM of the Company presently held in January each year.

Members of the Company are the members of **Bromley Indoor Bowling Club** ie **BIBC** and **Bromley Indoor Bowling Club Outdoor Section** ie **BIBCOS.**

The Company is responsible (in brief) for:-

- the upkeep of the premises and grounds, including the replacement of the indoor and outdoor carpets.
- employment of the administrative, reception, caretaking and cleaning staff and in the absence of a catering franchise, also the catering staff.
- arranging a catering franchise when appropriate.

We will concentrate mainly on the indoor club.

BROMLEY INDOOR BOWLING CLUB [BIBC]

Responsible to the Board for the organisation and administration of their indoor bowling and social activities.

BIBC exercises its delegated powers through a Management Committee [ManCom]..

The Management Committee is responsible for:-

- all arrangements for the playing of bowls such as match fixtures, competitions, leagues, casual bowls, coaching etc and social activities;
- responsible for the rules and codes of practice for bowls
- It is also responsible for raising funds* to meet its obligations in respect of membership and all members affiliation fees to National and County Bowling Associations;

It is governed by its current **Constitution** including the **Complaints, Discipline & Appeal Procedure and The Rules & Codes of Conduct** *** [copy to be found hanging above the book stand, The Codes of Conduct are also displayed on the notice board at the far end of the bar area by the steps leading down to the rink]

- * Funds are raised as follows:-
- > By tickets purchased through the 200 Club on joining/renewal of membership.
- Profit from Match, Christmas and Easter raffles.

- Money raised through social events.
- Donations

BOWLS ACTIVITIES:-

Organised & Individual Arranged Roll-Ups

Arrangements usually by the reception staff. Rink income goes to the Company.

Club Leagues, Club Competitions, Social Events

Responsibility of the Management Committee which sets the rules for them and administrates the local requirements for National competitions and County games and competitions.

To participate in National and County events, the Club has to be affiliated to the following organisations

1. EIBA Ltd [English Indoor Bowling Association Ltd]

Sets the standards for bowls wear (and sells) and guidelines for constitutions and safeguarding for example.

It runs national competitions that players of affiliated clubs can enter

'Prestigious', National [EIBA] Team Competitions

Ladies: Yetton Trophy; Yetton Plate; Vivienne Trophy; Mason Trophy;

Men: Denny Cup; Denny Plate; Over 60 Double Rink

Mixed: Egham Trophy; Top Club Open: Under 25 Two Rink Triples

National Inter County Championship: Atherley Trophy & Liberty Trophy

Men Under 25 County Double Rink

Men Over 60 Inter-County Championship Under 18 County Two Rink Triples Mixed

On an individual basis, members can enter a variety of competitions – Ladies and Men's Singles, Pairs, Triples, Fours, Under 18s Singles(men only), Under 25s Singles, 2 Wood Singles and Champion of Champions, Also Mixed Pairs, Fours. There are also 50s and over 60s Competitions.

2. KCIBA [Kent County Indoor Bowling Association] [MEN'S]

&

KCLIBA [Kent County Ladies Indoor Bowling Association]

Both organisations have matches – their teams made up from members of Kent indoor clubs, that play Kent clubs during the winter season. Also run the following competitions.

Prestigious', Kent County Team Competitions*

KCIBA Men: Dudley Hoile

On an individual basis, members can enter a variety of competitions Singles, Under 25's Singles, Pairs, Triples, Fours, Unbadged Singles, Mixed Pairs, Over 55 Pairs, Over 55 Triples, Over 55 Four.

KCLIBA Ladies: **Valanndor** (- for the 3 ladies who 'founded' this competition – Valerie, Ann and Doreen.)

On an individual basis, members can enter a variety of competitions Singles, Under 25's Singles, Under 18's, Pairs (Senior & Junior), Triples, Fours.

3. KL [KENT LEAGUE] – look in your Fixture book to see the matches with KL

This is an <u>independent</u> group of Kent Indoor Clubs including ours, with a Ladies and Men's Sections. Each club plays the others twice in the season - one at home and one away. There is a scoring system with penalties for clubs failing to meet the agreement made when the fixture was arranged (pre-season), for example playing only 5 rinks instead of the 6 agreed or cancellation of a match and not rearranged, with prizes at the end of the season. All are single sex matches!

4. BB&DBA [Beckenham, Bromley & District Bowling Association]

Aims to stimulate interest in the game of Bowls within the London Borough of Bromley and surrounding Districts playing matches and competitions during the outdoor and indoors season among members of the constituent clubs.

A lot to take in?

A little more

EIBA introduced a "Plate" competition 'Yetton Plate' and we were the first club to win it [- our summer section then introduced and now our indoor season has done so.] What it means is that if you lose in the first round then you go into the Plate competition (2nd chance) and Bromley Ladies won the Plate in its first year – see the photograph on the wall in the restaurant.

The £200 prize purchased, with some addition, the 9 raffle ticket cups, the box in which they are kept and the gavel and stand to call 'us' to order. [so please treat with care!]. The maker was then a member who mainly charged for purchase of extra wood to what he already had and engraving of the cups and plate.]

Last season our ladies won the County Valanndor - great achievement.-We had to engrave the cup - can keep for a year - with the £75. Prize!!

Also individuals have had various successes. Why not have a go at competitions? – you will never know what you may achieve until you try!!

Over all types of bows there is an organisation called the
