#### **Council News**

At the Annual Parish Meeting back in April, there was a presentation on the possibility of developing a Neighbourhood Plan for Hamble and a discussion followed, with parishioners asking questions and giving their views. Afterwards, the Parish Council asked the Neighbourhood Plan Working Group to meet and come back with further proposals. At the last Council meeting it was agreed to leave the decision to proceed with a Neighbourhood Plan to the newly elected Council in May next year. It will also give time to see if the new Local Plan is adopted and that it protects and covers most of the elements that could be included in a Hamble Neighbourhood Plan.

Also at the last Council meeting, representatives from Eastleigh Borough Council (EBC) attended to discuss the future management of The Mercury Library and Community Hub, changes to residents parking in the Square, and Coronation Parade.

The Mercury: The Borough Council

provided this facility and the Parish Council agreed to source, train and oversee the volunteers. Unfortunately, Hampshire Library Service decided not to support it other than provide some old books and some advice. This has meant the Parish Council's Deputy Clerk has spent most of her time undertaking the day-to-day management of this facility at the expense of her Parish Council duties. The Parish Council has made this clear that this cannot continue and the Borough Council is now seeking to appoint an appropriate organisation to partner them to manage. develop and operate the Mercury on a dayto-day basis.

An EBC Officer explained about the proposed changes to the Residents' Parking in the Village Square area with its aim to move from a paper-based system to electronic permits.

Borough representatives also said that there were a few small items still to complete on the Coronation Parade refurbishment including improving some

access issues; Royal Mail has agreed to move the post box to a better position.

The Council's Planning Committee received the results of traffic counts, which they'd commissioned around the village to add data and its knowledge concerning issues relating to Hamble Lane. It has asked the company that undertook the survey to provide an executive summary with particular reference to how this compares with other similar villages. A parishioner attended the last Planning Committee to express his concerns regarding cyclists using the footbridge adjacent to Hamble Halt. He explained accidents had occurred due to cyclists failing to dismount and he feared a serious accident is inevitable. He had over the years contacted the relevant authorities with little success in them addressing the issue. The Committee suggested some ways forward and gave support to him on this matter.

At long last it can be reported that the lease for the new Lifeboat Station and Slipway has been signed and final settlement of financial issues. Hamble Lifeboat has a 100-year lease for the Lifeboat Station itself and the Parish Council a sub-lease for the Public Toilets and other facilities. The route of the England Coast Path through our area has been published for an 8-week period for representations and objections. If you wish to make a response please submit it on the correct form by the beginning of September. Next year the Council will be creating a poppy trial alongside a prominent verge in the parish to mark VE Day.

The Parish Council has received the resignation of Philip Beach due to personal reasons unrelated to the Council. The Council wishes to thank Phil for his contribution to the work of the Parish Council and wish him all the best for the future. The Council has started the process of seeking a replacement and, if there is no request for an election, a new Councillor will be co-opted at the Council's September's meeting. If you are interested becoming Councillor for the last 9 months of this Parish Council's term, please contact the Parish Office for details.

The Council will be in recess during August unless a meeting is required for an urgent major planning issue.

#### **MESSAGE FROM THE CLERK**

This is the last edition of the magazine before the summer. Your next edition will be in October which is timely as a small working group has been set up to review the magazine, something which we do periodically. When we last mooted a few changes 18 months ago I was surprised by how few people were aware that the magazine was produced by the Parish Council and has been since its inception in 1986.

Over the three years of this Council there have been significant changes to the design and format, as well as how it is produced and the level of advertising that we include. Despite regular reviews we still haven't been able to cover all of the production costs with advertising income which remains an

ambition for us. Although we have always posted copies on the website, we are now sending them out digitally to those who subscribe to our email alerts and we will also be posting a link to the current edition on our Facebook page. As well as reducing the cost of production I am really keen to see a wider readership which I hope will come from using social media and online platforms. If you haven't already signed up for our email alerts go to our website home page and you will find the link. This is always the quickest and most reliable way of keeping track of what is going on, so don't miss out.

Each Council has a term which lasts for 4 years and the current term ends in May next year. Inevitably, during that four-year term people find that their circumstances change which can mean resignations from the Council. We start the summer with another vacancy following the resignation of Philip Beach. At the time of writing I cannot confirm whether there will be a requirement to call an election or whether we will, as we have with previous vacancies, invite applications and fill them by a process of co-option. If it is the latter then we will be publicising how to apply on our noticeboards, the website and our Facebook page; so, if you are interested keep your eyes open for further information. Work is starting on the replacement of the public benches at the Southern Quay which were originally installed back in 1998. There will be more information about the designs later in the year and people will have a chance to comment on their favourite. In addition to that we will be looking to retain specialist help to look at what options exist for the redevelopment of Mount Pleasant. The pavilion is long past its best and the play area is now 20 years old which, given the high level of use, is quite remarkable. The skate ramps also are showing signs of wear and we know that young people in the area are keen to see a new facility.

The project potentially is a very significant one and we want to get specialists retained that are able to work with the community and stakeholders to capture ideas and start to distil them into options that can then be tested for feasibility. It isn't something that we will be able to conclude quickly, not least as the funding of any such project will need careful consideration. It is clear though that everyone recognises the great service that the current facilities have provided over the years but also recognise the need for modern and functional buildings for the Hamble of today.

We also hope to work with Hampshire County Council (HCC) and Eastleigh Borough Council on the provision of parking at Hamble Halt Station. This has come out of the Hamble Lane Improvement Consultation and although at the very early stages, will none the less contribute to reducing traffic on Hamble Lane. HCC have promised to come back with more information about the project later in the year.

Lastly, I know many of you are concerned about the proposals for the Airfield. When Cemex came to see the Parish Council this time last year they set out a timetable which would have included a community consultation during the autumn of last year. This didn't happen. The latest update is that they will be contacting the council towards the end of the summer with a revised timetable. We will make sure that information is shared via our website and social media as well as at our Council meetings. Our next meeting will be on the 9th September so that is a further opportunity to raise issues with the Council.

And finally, just to say we are closed the week starting the 26th August to archive. If you need to get hold of us in an emergency during that period, we will still be monitoring messages and we will get back to you.





#### HAMBLE CONSERVATION VOLUNTEERS



Forthose who do not know Heather Gardens, it is the copse of mature trees bordering Hamble Green and the Donkey Derby Field on two sides. It provides attractive walks and is an important habitat for wildlife but also contains a number of invasive species. We are assisting the Parish Council in identifying the types and condition of its trees which will provide the detail necessary for a long-term management plan for the Gardens. In the meantime, we are helping the Parish Council's Grounds Team tackle the indisputably invasive bamboo on the south edge of the copse.

The Parish Council are apprehensive of using chemicals to treat the bamboo for fear of run off so we are trialling alternative techniques. The first of these is to cut back the bamboo and then place a heavy lightproof sheet over the surface in the hope that the bamboo will die back from lack of light. If this does not work we are short of options and if anyone knows a way of removing bamboo without the use of chemicals please contact us!

Regardless of the task we welcome volunteers, the tasks can be arduous but there are roles for a wide range of agilities. Furthermore we appreciate that many people cannot spare the time for the whole task so please do not be put off if you can only be with us for a short time.

#### THE MERCURY LIBRARY AND COMMUNITY HUB

A shared project was undertaken by the Hamble Needlecraft Group, with this textile map of Hamble.

The group was trying to make a map of the place we live in (minus all the houses of course - there would not have been room!), and the buildings that are important to all of us. That is the central panel. The border pictures are locations in Hamble now or in the recent past. When the work began The Harrier and Barclays Bank were still operational so that demonstrates how fast things change.

While not everyone will have been involved in the stitching there was much discussion at all stages and so everyone was involved at some point. Contributions varied as some people enjoy that sort of detailed handwork while others were busy knitting twiddle-muffs for people with dementia, very small items for babies in the neonatal unit at the hospital, gifts for the shoebox appeal and things to sell at church fêtes. Some people not interested in sewing/knitting helped by thinking with us about what needed to go in and then contacting people to find out more. Others took lots of the photographs we needed when planning each little picture. After the map was completed in Autumn 2018 following about three years work. Roy Baker made a stretcher for it, and it was displayed in the church at the Flower



#### HAMBLE LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY

Craig Lambert, Professor in Maritime History at Southampton University, will be giving a talk on his latest research about Tudor shipping in our area during Queen Elizabeth I's reign. His talk, 'Shipping, Seafarers and Trade: Southampton and its Associated Ports, 1565-1580', will focus on the shipping and trade of the ports and settlements that are located on Southampton Water, including Hamble. Since the early middle ages Southampton, and the clusters of coastal settlements located on the Water, had been important trading places. The accessibility of the Water with its double tide ensured Southampton ships were active in luxury goods, wine and wool trades. By the late middle ages, it has been suggested that trade from the port




