Parish Council Meeting - Thursday, 14th December

Christmas Decorations - Harry, Steven and Maurice were thanked for decorating the Hall for Christmas

Crime & Disorder - Mel Thorne has been invited to the next meeting on January 11th to talk about crime and disorder. If you see anything suspicious in the village, phone 01636 605999 ext. 7143 or 01909 473875.

Village Hall - A new cleaner has been appointed. Quotes are being obtained for decoration of toilets, kitchen and the lower half of the Hall and for polishing the floor.

Road Safety - A representative of Nottinghamshire Council visited the village, meeting with members of the Parish Council, the PTA and other villagers. While some work may be done to improve water on the road and mend potholes, it seems little can be done to introduce traffic calming measures. Speed warning lights will be trialled for a year at Upton before there is any chance of roll out elsewhere. The Parish Council is now exploring the availability of walk to school grants. Please remember to notify a parish councillor if you see an accident or a near miss as this evidence may help our case.

Street Lights - If a street light is not working, note its number and phone 01636 673625 to report it. Village Map - It was reported that the two side panels showing village occupations and interests are nearly ready and that a date will be set shortly for these to be viewed with a second chance to see some of the old photos of Halam.

Finance - Audited accounts for the year ended 31st March 2000 were circulated and will be posted in the notice boards shortly. Income for the year was £11,844 with £7,000 coming from the precept, £3,801 from Village Hall lettings and the rest from fund raising activities and other sources. Expenditure totalled £8,322 with £4,049 of this going to pay the mortgage on the Village Hall. The precept will be set at the next meeting.

Motor Bikes on Village Roads - Enquiries have been made about the problem of motor bikes on our "White Roads" such as Cultersforth and Gray Lane but it seems little can be done as bikers are within their rights to use them. The Clerk will write to the police to let them know there might be a problem with bikers speeding within the village itself.

Millennium Trees - These have not yet been planted Those responsible will be contacted.

Planning - The application for an extension to Kempscott, Gray Lane was approved unanimously. Enquiries will be made regarding the landscaping of the meadow next to Manor Farm which was part of the planning application for the new houses to the rear.

Village Hall - The electrical circuits will be checked and repaired if necessary as there has been a problem with fuses tripping. Some parishioners have kindly volunteered to raise money to refurbish the kitchen.

Parish Council Meeting - Thursday, 8th March

Village Hall - The electrics have been fully inspected and found to be safe. It was agreed that £970 should be spent on decorating the main hall and the toilets (3 for, 2 against, 2 abstentions).

Village Hall Open Day - It was agreed that Halam should take part in a Village Hall Open Day on Friday, 8th June when it will be open for visits from District and other Parish Councillors. In association with this, it is likely that the Open Day will extend to Saturday, 9th June to allow villagers and their friends to see the completed Millennium Map (including the two new side panels) and to see again the collection of village photographs. Helpers for both days will be required.

Small Rural Primary School Policy - Document to be read by councillors and two nominees agreed to discuss with Peter Thomson, Chair of School Governors to agree village response.

Road Safety - Pot holes on Radley Road are being dealt with. More information on traffic calming is being sought from the Council for Protection of Rural England. A questionnaire from Notts. County Council regarding work required on the roads (traffic schemes, surfaces, drainage, hedge maintenance, gritting, street lights etc.) will be completed, although the issues with the roads have been raised many times, often to little avail. The Parish Council agreed to work with the School

Governors to see what benefits might be available from the Travel to School Scheme. Please also remember to notify a parish councillor if you see an accident or a near miss so a record can be made. **Planning** -

Alterations to Dovecote and Barn and erection of conservatory at Manor Farm, Radley Road approved 6 for, 1 abstention

Amended plan for dwelling at land adjacent to Mardale Cottage, Back Lane - approved 5 for, 1 against, 1 abstention

Conversion of outbuilding at Goldhill Farm to dwelling - approved unanimously

Application for new house on land at rear of Plough - rejected unanimously. The two storey design, despite minor attempts to reduce its height and size, is still considered to be totally unsuitable for such a location in terms of its size and height. The Council's response will, once again, stress that this plot is only suitable for a single storey dwelling. Three letters against the plan and one from the architect were received by the Council.

<u>Landscaping of meadow next to Manor Farm</u> - Newark & Sherwood are following up this issue as landscaping was part of the planning application for the new houses to the rear.

Finance - A number of payments were agreed including wages to be paid by the Council, Village Hall insurance and Christmas decorations. A discussion on whether to pay off some of the Village Hall loans will be discussed at the next meeting.

Next Meetings - Note no meeting on 12th April as previously advertised. The Annual Parish Meeting will take place at 7pm on Wednesday, 18th April, followed by the next Parish Council Meeting. All villagers are particularly welcome to attend this review of the year and comment on any aspect. The Annual Parish Council Meeting will take place at 7.30pm on Thursday, 10th May.

Annual Parish Meeting - Wednesday 18th April

Two members of the public were present.

The Chairman gave his report. There were 13 Parish Council Meetings in the year and 22 planning applications were discussed. Once again there had been a successful Open Gardens' Day and Harvest Supper. Successful lobbying of Nottinghamshire Council has at last resulted in a decision to resurface and attend to drainage on the main route through the village. The Chairman thanked the Clerk and Council for their support, Mrs Rickett and Miss Bagguley for cleaning the hall, Mr Kemp for cleaning the bus shelter and Mr Laughton, Mrs Armstrong and Mr Stewart for their support in other Councils. Members of the Council thanked the Chairman for his chairmanship during the year.

Members of the public present thanked the Council for their wisdom in allowing the After School Club to use the Village Hall as it generated funds for the village. Questions were raised regarding the exact nature of the imminent road closure and the impact on buses. The Clerk was able to confirm that school Buses would be unaffected but no information had been provided on the public service. Notices would be placed on the village notice boards when more information was received.

Parish Council Meeting - Wednesday 18th April

Attendees: Mr Brown, Mrs Herbert, Mr Rickett, Mrs Gathercole, Mrs Davies. Apologies: Mr Bust. Small Rural Primary School Policy Framework. Mrs Herbert had pulled a response together on behalf of the Council based on contributions from other councillors.

Model Code of Conduct. This will be discussed at the next meeting as not all councillors had seen it.

Village Hall Electrics. These had been fully tested and certified as sound. Payment of £146 was approved. The Clerk will investigate the legal position regarding individuals using their own, untested electrical equipment.

Village Hall Floor. A proposal to sand and re-polish the Hall floor was approved 4 for, 1 abstention. Village Tidiness. In the course of discussing correspondence on village tidiness, the Council noted that many individuals take it upon themselves to pick up litter on their regular walks round the village and the Council expressed their thanks for this.

Planning

- 1. Detached garage at Barn Cottage, Radley Road accepted unanimously
- 2. Stable block on land at rear of Forge Cottage, Gray Lane Unanimous decision not to support the application until more was known about the exact site and size of the building. It should in no way interfere with the public footpath which crosses this land.
- 3. <u>Division of Farmhouse into two dwellings and erection of garage at Manor Farm, Radley Road</u> accepted 4 in favour, 1 abstention. Materials used should be in keeping.
- 4. <u>Land at rear of Plough -</u> A parishioner had advised a councillor that the application for a substantial dwelling on this site had been approved. The Clerk was asked to find out if this was the case and, if so, write to the Government Office for the East Midlands to ask the Secretary of State to call it in using the arguments used consistently by the Council for many years.

Finance The Clerk has been asked to look into the implications of paying off £10,000 of the mortgage outstanding on the Village Hall as the fixed interest rate is very high. Payments of £15 to the Rural Community Council and £202 for the Auditor's fees were approved.

Next Meeting The Annual Parish Council Meeting will take place at 7.30pm, Thursday, 10th May.

Election of Officers. Officers were elected as follows: Chairman: Mrs Herbert, Vice Chairman: Mr Brown, Halam Christmas Charities: Mr Rickett & Mr Bust, Press Officer: Mrs Gathercole, Transport Officer: Mrs Herbert, NALC Representatives: Mr Brown & Mrs Davies, Internal Auditor: Mrs Gathercole, Snow Warden: Mr Bust.

Best Kept Village. Halam will enter again this year. Everyone is encouraged to play their part, taking special care to keep footpaths and public areas free of weeds and litter.

Public Footpaths. Nottinghamshire County Council asked for information on paths which might be reopened as they do not cross fields containing animals. It was agreed that none should be recommended for reopening in Halam in the immediate future.

Village Hall Open Day It had previously been suggested that another exhibition of the Village Photographs would be held on June 9th. This has now been postponed until September.

Car Parking in the Village Residents are asked to take care about where they and their visitors park so as not to obstruct other road users, especially near road junctions or near busy areas such as the Church, the shop and Radley Terrace area.

Drains and Sewers Concern was expressed about the drain leaking near the cross-roads as it is believed to be from a sewer and not surface water. Residents concerned have tried to get something done about it. The Council agreed to write to all relevant authorities to get some action taken.

Planning

- 1. Division of Farmhouse at Manor Farm, Radley Road information on the dividing line noted.
- 2. <u>Land at rear of Plough</u> Newark & Sherwood have approved the latest plan. The Council will write to the Government Office for the East Midlands expressing their disappointment that this has been approved despite a long standing objection from the Parish Council.

Finance It was agreed that £10,000 of the loan for the Village Hall should be paid off, hence substantially reducing annual interest payments. Payments were approved for decorating the Village Hall, additional insurance for the side panels for the Village Map and attending a seminar.
