Councillor Behaviour, Nolan Principles & New Model Code of Conduct BDAPTC 1 September 2021

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Background

- 1975 1st national code of conduct
- 1989 Code of Conduct given statutory footing and new code (1990); role of Monitoring Officer created. No real sanctions
- 1994 Committee on Standards in Public Life established - The Nolan Committee.
- 2000 Local Government Act new Model Code, Standards Committee and new Standards Regime (including Standards Board for England)
- Localism Act 2011 abolished the 2000 regime the current regime
- Report on Local Government Ethical Standards -Committee on Standards in Public Life (January 2019)



The current regime

- Localism Act 2011:
 - Duty to promote and maintain high standards of conduct by members and coopted members
 - Requirement to adopt a code consistent with the seven principles outlining conduct which is expected of members acting in that capacity
 - Parish Council may adopt the code of the principal authority



The Seven Principles of Public Life aka The Nolan Principles

- Selflessness
- **❖**Integrity
- Objectivity
- Accountability
- Openness
- **❖**Honesty
- ❖ Leadership



What's in place currently?

- BDBC Code of Conduct/NALC Code of Conduct/ New LGA model code of conduct & variations
- Arrangements for Dealing with Complaints against Councillors (BDBC Constitution)
- Any changes to the BDBC Code of Conduct and Arrangements have to be approved by full council of BDBC
- Standards Committee Borough Councillors, Parish/Town Councillors, Independent Standards Assessors (only Borough Councillors can vote)
- Monitoring Officer/ Deputy MO



Report on Local Government Ethical Standards – Committee on Standards in Public Life (January 2019)

Headline recommendations

- Recommended an updated model code of conduct
- Section 27(3) of the Localism Act 2011 should be amended to state that parish councils must adopt the code of conduct of their principal authority, with the necessary amendments, or the new model code
- Local authorities should be given the discretionary power to establish a decision-making standards committee with voting independent members and voting members from parishes, to decide on allegations and impose sanctions.
- Parish clerks to hold an appropriate qualification
- Presumption that councillors will be assumed to be acting in an official capacity - includes social media activity



Further Recommendations

- LA's to establish register of gifts and hospitality received over £50 or £100 pa from a single source
- LA to be able to suspend councillor for up to 6 months with agreement of Independent Person
- Right of appeal to Local Government and Social Care Ombudsman if LA imposes period of suspension for breaching the code (applies to Parish/Town Councillors also)
- Criminal offences under Localism Act to be abolished
- Councillors should be required to attend code of conduct training



New Model Code of Conduct

- Published in December 2020
- It encompasses the Nolan Principles
- Applies when you are acting in your capacity as a councillor which may include when:
 - You misuse your position as councillor
 - Your actions would give the impression to a reasonable member of the public with knowledge of all the facts that you are acting as a councillor



New Model code of conduct

- It applies to all forms of communication and interaction including:
 - At face to face meetings
 - At online or telephone meetings
 - In written communication
 - In verbal communication
 - In non-verbal communication
 - In electronic and social media communication, posts, statements and comments



New Model Code of Conduct

Standards of conduct:

- Respect
- Bullying, harassment and discrimination
- Impartiality of officers of the council
- Confidentiality
- Must not bring role or council into disrepute
- Must not use position improperly
- Must not use resources for political purposes
- Agree to undertake code of conduct training and co-operate with investigations.
- Interests DPIs/Other registrable interests
- Gifts and Hospitality (£50 or more)
