# Reporting back!

#### Keeping our streets clean

As part of our aims to keep our streets clean the parish council has installed three dog foul bag dispensers around the parish.

Located on Hillside East, Donnington Drive and by Lilleshall Primary School these are stocked with biodegradable bags and we hope that if these prove to be successful in reducing dog fouling in the area then we will look to install more in other locations.

#### Lilleshall to get it's third life saving defibrillator

In November the parish council assisted in organising some community training for using a defibrillator, thanks to Kath from Lilleshall Youth Centre and Russell from West Midlands Ambulance Service the training was a success.

We have identified that increasing the number of defibrillators in the parish is a necessary and proactive step to help keep our community safe and healthy. Therefore, the parish council will be installing a new defibrillator to the bus shelter just off the entrance to Barrack Lane off the A518 and will be looking at options for installing one near The Humbers area.

#### Road safety schemes - progress update

Since October 21 the lead Highways Engineer who was designing Lilleshall's scheme's has moved on and this gave the parish council and borough councillor an opportunity to review progress so far and give further consideration to areas such as The Humbers, Honnington and Brockton Leasows which had already been requested for review by a number of residents and parish councillors.



A new temporary Highways Engineer is in place with Telford & Wrekin Council and has begun looking at this draft scheme and has agreed to meet with councillors on return from holiday at the end of January to review additional areas and form an updated draft scheme before we consult residents again.

The parish council wants to assure residents that any road safety schemes will not commence until we have consulted with residents. We understand that while we may not be able to please everyone's desires, we will do everything we can to make the final plan one that makes our streets safer for everyone.

# Budget 2022-23

Parish councils are required by law to set a budget annually to meet local needs, these needs are often things that principle authorities no longer service or they are things that local people ask for and parish councils are the most local form of government that can deliver on community schemes.

As part of this requirement parish councils in England and Wales have to set a "precept" which is a percentage of the overall council tax base for every household within a parish.

For the 2022-23 financial year, **Lilleshall Parish Council has agreed to reduce their precept request to Telford & Wrekin Council by 10%** and use its reserves to set the base for supporting a wide range of schemes and projects, as well as meet the statutory needs of the council.

The parish councils budget for 2022-23 represents reductions in administrative and training costs and reductions in maintenance costs mostly due to the reduced electricity rates now that we have full LED coverage of street lights. The budget also represents a rise in community projects, namely work to be done with groups to improve and maintain footpaths, introduce flower planters around the whole parish and fund the first phase of a surveillance roll out.

Funds have been set aside to support Queens Jubilee events and offer grants to local groups.
