Covid-19 Guidelines Update

The Government have now announced that from 14th October there will be a 3 Tier System of COVID-19 rules in England - Medium, High and Very High. This is intended to help manage and reduce the spread according to local conditions. We in Somerset are in the Medium tier (lowest) i.e. we continue to follow basic national rules for the present: masks in public places, social distancing etc., sanitising/washing hands, and the Rule of 6 indoors and outdoors. There are some exemptions to the Rule of 6 for 'COVID-19 Secure' community facilities where more than one group of 6 can meet indoors, providing the separate groups are socially distanced and do not go over and mix with each other. Let us all continue to follow the rules to prevent any spread and to protect both ourselves and each other.

The Department of Health & Social Care have issued a free NHS Covid-19 'Track and Trace' app for iphones and android mobile phones and we would encourage anyone who has one of these phones to download this app. It is the fastest way of knowing when you are at risk from Coronavirus. You can find out when you have been near other app users who have tested positive for coronavirus; it lets you know the level of risk in your postcode district; you can check into venues such as pubs, cafes and restaurants by using a simple QR reader; check symptoms; helps you order a test if you need to and; helps you keep track of your self-isolation countdown and access relevant advice.

It is critical that you follow all of the Government guidelines to keep both yourself and others safe. The virus is airborne. Guidelines are changing all the time about what we can and cannot do, and so you can find the most up-to-date information at:
