
2020 saw the club restricted by a 'Global pandemic' however members were still able to play within a strict cleansing regime on alternate rinks at a social distance.

May 2021 the club returned to normal play. A number of members entered National and County competitions and represented the Sussex VPs and Eastbourne Town and performed with distinction raising the profile of the club within the wider bowling community.

2023 saw the completion of better storage at the club and improved disabled facilities. The club had three teams in the Eastbourne League thus saving the second division of the competition and it was the C Team that went on to the finals of the Eastbourne Challenge Cup.
