

Dear friends,

I would normally speak of the wonderful signs of spring as March slides into April, but here I am writing with 7 inches of snow outside. I think it's the job of the British weather to keep us guessing! Our instinct is to see hope in the changes of the seasons. The movement of darkness into light, cold into warmth, and death into new life.

But we don't always have to look at the weather to find sources of hope, or even at the changing of the seasons. We are approaching the festival of Easter, and this celebration finds its heart in the most powerful story of hope humanity, or indeed the universe, has ever known.

It's a story that began with our celebration of Christmas in the depths of winter and the dark of December. We recalled the arrival of God's Son, Jesus, into the world; a light shining in the darkness. We marvelled at the mystery of the Incarnation; God becoming one of us in the person of Jesus. We thought about what it means for God to come into the most vulnerable of settings; a baby in a stable surrounded by animals.

Over the last few months in church, we have followed the growth of this child into a man; Jesus of Nazareth. We have listened to his teaching, heard of the amazing parables and stories he told, and wondered at his miraculous dealings with those most in need. We have spent time with him in the wilderness, and looked at our own lives and relationships with God and one another. And then we followed him on his final journey, beginning with him being betrayed by someone he loved, and finishing with him hanging on a cross.

On this journey, we have met the God who knows what it means to be human. A God who has experienced the whole range of emotions that we encounter in life. From joy, laughter, and love, to despair, isolation, pain and grief. In Jesus, God has been through it all. Seen it all. Felt it all.

But there was one thing left for God to do. To take all that we fear: darkness, pain, loss, sin, and even death itself...and defeat it. But more than defeat it. Transform it into something new. This is why the resurrection of Jesus Christ matters. Because in Jesus' death God took all of the above into death. And in the resurrection of Jesus Christ, God transformed it all into something new. Life. Love. Hope. Meaning that the things we fear the most no longer have a hold over us.

This is the true meaning of Easter.

And I wish you an Easter filled with all the hope, love, and life that God brings.




LETTER FROM HEREFORD FOR APRIL

On choosing a story

I always find Easter difficult to write about, which seems absurd because it is the most important and exciting time of the Christian year. The problem is that Easter- the Resurrection of Jesus- is massive and world-changing, but only if it is seen in the light of the human condition, life, suffering, and death. Without the context, it looks like a weird story of a dead god bounding back to life and scaring the big bad Romans and wicked religious people - Boo!

It's like something you might read in a book of myths and legends. And then there is the tricky business of the Christian claim that it is neither the stuff of myth nor legend because Jesus is still alive and active in billions of lives today. If you were creating a global religion from scratch you wouldn't start with all this. It's far too complicated.

But every day, I and countless others stake all that we are and will be on Easter and the person at its heart. We may be fools or we may be right. No priest or scientist, no philosopher or politician can prove it one way or another this side of the grave. And so we just have to choose which story we prefer to live by. Cue considerable decanal pinching from Bob Hartman, but it boils down to this:

The first story says: *A very long time ago, there was a series of accidents. Energy and matter and molecules collided and somehow, you are here today. By accident. Your fate is random and only fleetingly important to you and a few loved ones*

The second story says: *In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. And you are here, not by accident, but because he designed you and loves you and wants to be in a relationship with you.*

The first story goes on: *The fit live, the weak die, the vocal and the strong dominate. Survival is the game. Look out for number one.*

The second story goes: *Blessed are the meek, the poor and the peacemakers. Greater love has no one than this that he lay down his life for his friends.*

The first story concludes: *You die. You decay. The end.*

But the second story doesn't have an end. *For Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die".*

In church, we celebrate that second story daily, especially over Holy Week and Easter. It is your story and mine.

STRETTONDALE PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP NEWS

Patient participation groups are nationwide and set up to be a route for patients to advise and inform their medical practice on what matters most to them, identify problems and to give to patients information which may be useful. The means of achieving this may be different for each group. Your SPPG committee feels we should act as a conduit between patients and the medical practice, acting practically where we can help. We are all volunteers and meet every 2 months or so. At present the mechanism for patient comments and issues to be dealt with is by patients writing their comments and placing them in the comments box located in the surgery to the right of the booking in screen. These should be general and not concern individual/medical issues which should be communicated to the practice manager. Ideally the box comments should include the patient contact details so we can contact them about any response. The box is emptied regularly and the contents discussed at the next committee meeting.

The medical practice has struggled for about a year to recruit more staff particularly for reception to deal with the increased work load but at last has succeeded. There is a new telephone call-back system but anyone using it should remain close to the phone as the system will only make 3 attempts to call back once your position is at the top of the queue. There are now sessions available at the library and Mayfair for patients with smartphones, tablets, I pads etc to book if they are not yet able to use this technology for e-consult, patient access etc. Ability to do this reduces some of the workload for the practice reception staff, freeing time to deal with patients who have no internet access.

Healthwatch Shropshire and Healthwatch Telford & Wrekin, the local health and care champions, collected experiences and shared them with the local NHS and councils.






