### A Message from Rev Katie Cross



**Waiting.** I wonder what this word conjures up in your mind. The frustration of waiting for a bus or train that seems to be running late. Perhaps the space between tests taken in a hospital, waiting with some concern for the results. Maybe you are drawn to the wonder of a young child as they wander slowly towards a destination, encouraged on by a parent or grandparent. Or possibly the joy of watching things come to life in the garden or fields around.

As I write this there are snow flurries outside and the previous weeks of Spring sunshine seem like a distant memory once again. The bulbs pushing through the soft earth and the daffodils beginning to emerge, are now faced with an icy wind. Spring, it seems, will keep us waiting a little longer.





### **Nature jottings from Perrymill Lane**


We've seen more signs of springtime, with wild garlic sprouting in the verges and lambs bouncing around in the field beside Coughton Field Lane, but the recent frost and snow tells us that winter hasn't given up yet.



- 12<sup>th</sup> Feb. Peter from Coughton described a diving duck that he'd noticed in the river in Bidford on Avon. The description fitted a Tufted Duck a common resident.
- 13<sup>th</sup> Feb. On this sunny afternoon we noticed one Fallow Deer and a Peacock butterfly beside Coughton Park woods. Bats, presumably Pipistrelles, were flying over our garden at dusk.
- 16<sup>th</sup> Feb. Angela mentioned that when walking Freddie in local woodland they came across twenty deer probably Fallow judging by more recent reports.
- 17<sup>th</sup> Feb. As we arrived at the Church room for the evening of winetasting, we heard a Barn Owl call nearby. Ann mentioned having seen five Blackcaps in her garden. It seems that more of these birds are now spending winter in the UK instead of heading south. Pete reported a Raven feeding on chicken bones in his Middletown Lane garden.
- 24<sup>th</sup> Feb. A party of three Lesser Redpolls spent much of the day in the garden devouring sunflower seed hearts.
- 26<sup>th</sup> Feb. As we walked along a Glebe Farm footpath, we came across a flock of about a dozen Yellowhammers in the hedgerow.
- 27<sup>th</sup> Feb. The Redpolls are now a constant presence in the garden. Four Yellowhammers were in the same spot as yesterday. We noticed a herd of twenty-four Fallow Deer emerge from the woods and run a circuit of the adjacent field before returning to the woods.
- 1<sup>st</sup> Mar. We have a dilemma over whether or not to keep an oversize apple tree in the garden. We counted six species of birds in it at one time today, so they seem to be telling us that it should stay!
- $3^{rd}$  Mar. Bird numbers in the garden seem to be at a peak with feeders being emptied within a day. Roy watched a Red Kite flying over the centre of the village.
- 4<sup>th</sup> Mar. We spotted a large mixed flock of Fieldfares and Redwings in a field off Wike Lane and wondered if they were preparing to return to Scandinavia for the breeding season. Corin managed to capture video of about forty Fallow Deer running across a field beside Wike Lane.
- 5<sup>th</sup> Mar. We noticed two Siskins bathing in the brook where it passes under Wike Lane at the entrance to the village.
- $7^{\text{th}}$  Mar. We spotted a Meadow Pipit perched on a power cable near Glebe Farm.
- 12<sup>th</sup> Mar. We saw our first lambs in a field in Coughton near the ford.

# The arrival of spring at Coughton Court

Our award-winning walled garden re-opens from April, so come and take a gentle stroll around the labyrinth. It'll be a while before we see the arrival of the roses but the view over the lake is the ideal spot to catch a glimpse of a kingfisher and watch the swans glide across the water.

Don't forget, Easter is just around the corner, and we've got some exciting plans to celebrate spring and keep the whole family entertained throughout the Easter holiday at Coughton Court. Join us for an Easter adventure out in nature with a trail through the parkland this spring, give our rabbit racecourse a try, see who can build the tallest tower with our building blocks and finish up by stopping by our craft space to see what you can make to take home. Complete the trail, collect your chocolate egg and enjoy something delicious from the BBQ. Tuesday 4 – Mon 10 April, 11am – 4pm, £3 per trail which can be purchased on the day from the Easter tent.

Our pop-up jigsaw festival is also returning from 19 – 30 April, 11am – 4pm. The money raised from jigsaw and book donations has gone towards vital conservation projects such as tapestry and painting conservation as well as the re-wiring of the mansion. The money from every jigsaw and book sold at Coughton goes straight back into the property, enabling the National Trust to care for this beautiful place for everyone, for ever.

#### Casualties 1917

"Age shall not weary them....."

**Ernest Henry Ford** – 103375, Private, Labour Corps. Died on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> August 1917, age 41. The son of Henry, a painter, and Sarah Ford of Perry Mil Lane, Sambourne. Born in Inkberrow, enlisted in Warwick. Before the war he was employed as a printer in Birmingham. Formerly served as 56093 The Devonshire Regiment. Buried in the Rocquigny – Equancourt Road British Cemetery, Manancourt, Somme, France. Also commemorated on the War Memorial Board in St. Peter's Church, Coughton. War Medal, Victory Medal.

**Edward Philip Johnson** – 1778 Private 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion the Warwickshire Regiment. Killed in action Saturday, 1<sup>st</sup> December 1917, age 21. The son of Hannah Stokes of Station Road Studley. Buried in the Monchy British Cemetery, Monchy–Le-Preux, Pas de Calais, France. Also commemorated on the Studley War Memorial and on the War Memorial Board in St. Peter's Church, Coughton. War Medal, Victory Medal.

Frederick Henry Mason - Military Medal - Lance Corporal 11<sup>th</sup>
Battalion, Royal Warwickshire Regiment. Died from effects of gas poisoning on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> August 1917, age 21. The 3<sup>rd</sup> son of Richard, a coachbuilder, and Kate Mason, of Coughton. Born and resided in Coughton. Enlisted in Worcester, 1915. Awarded the Military Medal 9<sup>th</sup> July 1917, for bravery in the field. Buried in the Outtersteene Communal Cemetery Extension, Bailleul Nord, France. Also commemorated on the War Memorial in St. Peter's Church, Coughton. Military Medal, 1914-1915 Star, War Medal, Victory Medal.




