DANGEROUS PARKING

We would like to remind everyone that while it is not illegal to park on the pavement where the road is narrow you **MUST** leave enough room on the pavement for pedestrians. And please remember this means mothers with pushchairs and old people with walkers or wheelchairs, so a foot gap a child could squeeze through is not enough.

Homeowners, help by ensuring you cut back your hedges and bushes that protrude onto the pavement on a regular basis as well.

This is particularly important if you park a van or other tall vehicle, where people cannot see oncoming traffic if they have to step into the road to walk round your vehicle.

SANDBAGS

We are ordering 80 extra sandbags, which will be kept in the resilliance store. If floods threaten you should contact Nigel Fletcher, the flood warden, to receive sandbags.

NEW LITTER BIN & ROAD SIGNS

A new litter bin had been installed by the PC at the bus stop. We hope this will reduce the amount of litter in that area. We also managed to get some replacement road signs installed where they were becoming illegible.

RUBBISH AND FLY-TIPPING

Everyone can report fly-tipping and accumulations of rubbish in the area. The council are very responsive and keen to help. Just call the regular number (01636 65000) and ask to report an incident. We are arranging for signs to be put up at the layby as you exit the village southbound

reminding people that flytipping is illegal and carries a hefty fine.

PEARS' COMPLAINTS

The Pears' Action Committee lost their appeal against expansion of the Pears' plant. They are now campaigning to get oversight of the plant moved from Bassetlaw Council to the Environmental Agency, as they feel Bassetlaw have proved singularly ineffective in upholding the conditions laid down for the operation of the existing plant.
