Candlemas Bells

As I sit in front of my fire, listening to the storms swirl around about, one small little flower nods its head to me, heralding the welcome arrival of spring. What is this flower, I hear you ask? Why the humble snowdrop!

Many legends surround this wonderful flower and one of my favourites is this ancient German tale;

At the beginning of all things when life was new, the Snow sought to borrow a colour. The flowers were much admired by all the elements but they guarded their colour's jealousy and when the Snow pleaded with them, they turned their backs in contempt for they believed the Snow cold and unpleasant. The tiny humble snowdrops took pity on the Snow for none of the other flowers had shown it any kindness and so they came forth and offered up to the Snow their colour.

The Snow gratefully accepted and became white forevermore, just like the Snowdrops. In its gratitude, the Snow permitted the little pearly flowers the protection to appear in winter, to be impervious to the ice and bitter chill. From then on, the Snow and the Snowdrops coexisted side by side as friends.

But what is the true origin of snowdrops in our countryside as these flowers do not originate in England, coming from southern Europe, and only spread into the wild in the late 18th

You too can celebrate the humble snowdrop at Warnford Park this month in this the 50th year of Snowdrop Sundays, with thanks to Andrew and Candi Sellick. Indeed, the park is open every Sunday afternoon in February for your enjoyment.

As you perambulate around the Capability Brown designed pleasure gardens of Warnford Park, through the remains of St Johns House and the woodland belt, past the Memento Mori bridge and return on the formal walk past the Dower House, please rejoice in the beauty of the park and the humble snowdrop.



West Meon CofE Primary School

The children designed Christmas Cards for a competition at the Village Christmas Fair, as well as singing some of their Nativity songs.

The older pupils led on assemblies during our Safety Week on Road Safety, Online Safety and Anti-Bullying and classes also had Fire Safety lessons from the Fire Brigade.

Our Junior Road Safety Officers walked Church Lane and took photos of signs in place and other ideas to make the journey to school safer. They then sent them to the Parish Council for further discussion and they also led an extra assembly on this and the importance of wearing reflective or bright clothing when it is dark in the mornings and evenings.

Everyone dressed up for Children in Need and raised £75.21 and then on the day Father Christmas visited, they dressed in Christmassy clothes and another £60 was raised for Save the Children.

The Nativity in the church was a wonderful event as usual and we also had a lovely Christingle workshop and service supported by the church team and parents.

Group 1 swimming at Bedales has started and the children got off to a flying start and Bikeability starts for Y5 at the end of January.

Our parents association, FOWMS, are busy planning another Popcorn (Cinema) Club and they funded the coach so we could take the whole school to see the Wizard of Oz Pantomime at the Theatre Royal in Winchester, which was a great show.

If you are able to help with a gardening club at school or if you are a trained minibus driver who could help with trips sometimes, we would love to hear from you. Alternatively, we could train you up to drive the minibus, so you could help us on an ad hoc basis. You would need to be over 25 and obviously all safeguarding checks would need to be carried out.

You are very welcome to look around the school at any time. We now have a Facebook page and we welcome children from outside our catchment area as well.

Rainfall December 2022 and Annual Summary

The first proper rains came on 18th December with 33.9mm 1.3" and to the end of the month 139mm (5.5") fell, with only one day with nothing recorded.

In summary 2022 was the driest year in the last decade at 919mm (36.1") and the wettest year was 2014 with 1364mm (53.5"), while the decade annual average was 1028mm (40.4").

Looking back over the records, and this is the 50th year we have been recording, there were only 3 months wetter than November 2022 (9.32") 237mm and they were January 2014



305mm (12.0"), October 1987 280mm (11") and November 2000 258mm (10.2").

2023 has so far given us rain on every day with a total of 135.5mm (5.3"), which may go a long way to explaining why the Meon is flowing down the East Meon road at the east end of the village!

Admiral Sir Kenneth Eaton

One of Warnford's most distinguished residents is sadly no longer with us and in this edition of the Parish News we pay tribute to his life and career.

Admiral Sir Kenneth John Eaton, who died aged 87, was Controller of the Navy – and was, according to his obituary in the Daily Telegraph, 'always in demand for his organisational, administrative and innovative skills.'

K e n n e t h Eaton married Sheena Buttle in 1959 and they have two sons,

Andrew and Richard, and a daughter Caroline.

Ken was born in Plymouth on 12th August 1934, the son of John and May Eaton. The family moved to Sheerness dockyard in Kent where Ken undertook an apprenticeship as an electrician and his father worked as senior attendant at the surgery. Later he attended Borden Grammar School in Kent and Fitzwilliam College, Cambridge, gaining a degree in Mechanical Sciences Tripos.

His first appointment was as flight-deck electrical officer in the carrier Victorious, 1959-61, but he soon become involved in the Navy's operational information systems. In 1965 he returned to sea as action information engineer in the carrier Eagle.

Promoted to commander in 1971, Ken served at the Defence Communications Network Headquarters at RAF Medenham, and as weapons electrical officer in the carrier Ark Royal, 1976–78. He was appointed assistant director of Communications Planning in 1979, assistant director of Command Systems in 1981, Director of Torpedoes in 1983 and Director-General of Underwater Weapons for the Navy in 1985.

Promoted to rear-admiral in 1987 he went on to become Commander of HM Naval Base Portsmouth and, with promotion to vice-admiral, he became Controller of the Navy in 1989.

Controller of the Navy is a role of deep historical significance in Navy command dating back to the 16th century when the postholder was responsible for co-ordinating shipbuilding and weapons acquisition. Working on the Navy Board, and increasingly with the Ministry of Defence Chief of Defence Procurement (CDP), Ken is said to have developed a reputation for quiet, sensible and unemotional advice to solve complex technical, and internationally sensitive issues, for example, with the development of air defence systems with France and Italy to counter missiles such as the French-developed Exocet used against the Royal Navy by Argentina in the Falklands War.

Ken also successfully oversaw the introduction into service of the Vanguard class ballistic missile submarines and the American developed Trident missile system, ensuring their first patrol took place as planned in November 1994.

He was promoted to full Admiral in 1993 retiring later the following year. He was appointed a Knight Commander of the Order of the Bath in the 1990 Birthday Honours and advanced to Knight Grand Cross of the Order of the British Empire in the 1994 New Year Honours. He was appointed Rear Admiral of the United Kingdom (an honour awarded by the Queen), 2001-07, but he always kept a picture on his desk of a Victorian stoker: this, he explained, was his grandfather, George Eaton, and he did not want to forget where he came from, or how far he had come in life.

In retirement Ken served as Chairman of Guy's & St Thomas' NHS Trust from 1995 to 1999, the United Kingdom Atomic Energy Authority from 1996 to 2002 and the Mary Rose Trust from 2001 to 2007, taking over when the fate of the recovered hull of the Mary Rose was still in doubt and steering it towards being a major tourist attraction. He was a member of the Society for Nautical Research since 1986, then served as a council member in 2010, chairman in 2011 and finally became President in 2020, a post he remained in until his death.

Ken was chairman of the Warnford Parish Meeting and the Winchester Science Centre & Planetarium. He took up watercolours and went on many painting holidays, and loved opera, supporting the Wessex Glyndebourne Association, West Green Opera and Grange Festival Opera. In 2004, Ken was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Sciences Degree from Aston University.

Sir Kenneth died at home on 20 July 2022, at the age of 87 after a short illness. His funeral service was held at The Church of our Lady of Warnford on Wednesday 17th August 2022.

A waxwing winter?

Waxwings are perhaps one of the most beautiful birds imaginable.

Their buff colouration with flashes of yellow and red on the wings, elegant 'eyeliner' and silky large crest really make them stand out from the crowd.

Part of a family of three species, the Bohemian waxwing (Bombycilla garrulus) is the species native to northern Europe. The bird's English name refers to how they travel in large nomadic groups (bohemian) and the red tips to their secondary wing feathers that look like seal wax droplets (waxwing).

But it's not all about the looks. Their trilling 'sirrrrr' call sounds like a small ringing bell – perhaps akin to Santa's sleigh dashing overhead – as flocks of up to 100 birds move from tree to tree.

Bohemian waxwings breed within the northern parts of Europe's coniferous belt, often in remote, damp, mossy mature forests nesting high in pines. In winter, they escape the numbing temperatures of north-eastern Europe and western Russia and head west in search of more temperate conditions, feeding on fruit-rich trees including apple, rowan and hawthorn. During winter, a relatively small number of these starling-sized birds travel to UK shores; first seen on the east coast before spreading west and south from there.

Waxwings are referred to as irruptive, which means on occasion large numbers of the birds migrate beyond their typical range. Some years, hundreds of thousands of waxwings will land in the UK, often labelled as a 'waxwing winter'. But why does this happen?

Waxwings are pushed away from their breeding grounds in search of food, and it's the yield of fruit trees that determines how far afield waxwings must travel. Most fruit trees of the same, and of similar, species bear fruit at the same time. This can result in a bounty of fruits in some years, and practically none in others. During years of bad yields, large numbers of waxwings will migrate large distances. Recent reports of poor berry crops in Finland and Sweden suggest an irruption is possible this year!

In Hampshire, waxwings are not seen every year – they are a rare visitor. However, when they do turn up, it might not be where you'd expect. The ASDA supermarket in Totton and Whiteley shopping centre in Fareham are common hotspots. These commercial areas often feature car parks planted with aesthetically pleasing, berry-laden fruit trees – and these always prove popular with waxwings. The last irruption in Hampshire was in the winter of 2010 when over 2,000 birds arrived.

So, keep your eyes and ears open for these punk rock-looking winter birds over Christmas and New Year and you might just get lucky enough to spot one!



A True Story of West Meon in Wartime



Ron Stone has a book of photographs published by Tricorn Books. It combines Ron's memories from 1939 to 1945 with excerpts from his mother Agnes' *Comforts Book* which lists her charity funding activities with Mrs. Hale. He talks about joining the Territorial Army, his two stepbrothers being sent to Dunkirk, soldiers billeted at Warnford Park House and training on Old Winchester Hill, the arrival of evacuee children and the villagers' efforts to grow food and help each other out.

This follows the 1918 publication of *West Meon Remembered* which covers Ron's period at the New Inn (now the Thomas Lord) and famous visitors to Hall Place and visits of Camilla Shand through her relations the Cubitt family.

In addition David Lock has contacted Ron to ask about others who were in the village at the time. David left West Meon in 1942 because of the war after living at 3 Doctors Lane and 1 Lippen Cottages.

"My father was the AA scout at the West Meon Hut prior to the war. I have two brothers who were both born in West Meon: Raymond, who now lives in High Wycombe, and Michael, who lives in Swindon. I am now retired and

live in Maidenhead."



"I often wonder about other 'mates' I went to school with and other children who were there at the same time. It was pretty dramatic and during the war!"

"Such names as the following spring to mind: Eric Simpson, Betty Simpson, Mary Gallop, 'Digger' Hunt,





Reg Samways, Joe Appleton, Peter Taylor, Stanley Kimber, Roy Dennis, Ken Dennis, Esmie Dennis, Ray Stone."

After leaving West Meon David moved to Swindon where he spent two years at Sanford Street Boys before leaving in 1944 and joining the Post Office.


