

POLICE UPDATE

Dear Residents

I start this month with an information appeal, at 11:48 pm on Wednesday November 21st three men broke into the grounds of a house in Newnham Lane near the new house. At 11:50 pm that evening a car past the premises travelling towards Old Basing from the village. I ask if anyone can assist me with the car and if they know who was in it at the time. If you can help please give me a call direct. The men left and returned back forty minutes later where they stole a red Honda quad bike pushing it through the hedge onto the road.

I also wish to make residents aware of two house burglaries in Oakley and another near Preston Candovers, all were broken into with the intention of stealing car keys and consequently two car were stolen. In another the burglar(s) have placed an article through the letter box and pulled the door handle which opened the door! this type of entry is preventable, simply inside your house place a cover over the letter box, lock the door so even with the handle it will not open or just take the handle off and turn it around to opposite the normal way of opening, hence turn it another way to open.

On many plastic external doors the letter box is in line or not far from the lock and handle so please be aware that some burglars will actually place their arm through a letter box to open the door, other things I have known used include a fishing rod used to 'catch' keys left on the unit etc. in the hall way where people often place their keys when they come in so they know where they are. Some burglars have actually devised a tool for opening doors from the outside using the handle on the inside by putting it through a letter box. I urge all residents to please remove keys from view and possibly take them upstairs or place in a cupboard.

As Christmas is approaching at an alarming speed I wish to remind all residents to please take extra care on the security of your homes and property. In Herriard two cars were broken into during the night of Sunday November 11th when the thieves used an electronic device to open secure cars and steal property from within, please take all valuables out, we had a similar crime in Brown Candover recently.

In the February edition of this magazine I will provide a breakdown of the crime of 2018 within your parish, at the time of writing in November crime across the whole area is slightly down, that of course may be due to a more increased awareness that whilst we do live in a wonderful area we are very susceptible to being a victim of crime due to our close proximity to large urban expanse and a good motorway network.

I wish you and your families a very happy and peaceful Christmas, please also don't drink and drive and remember you may still be over the legal limit in the morning from the night before. The Police annual drink drive campaign will be starting soon and morning after drivers will also be targeted.

Hart Local Plan Examination in Public

At the time of going to press, the first week of the Hearing, starting Tues 10th November (Tues Wed Thurs), is over. Due to length of discussion the reserve day and an extra day 18th December will be allocated.

Fleet/Crookham's FaceIT website is keeping an up-to-date summary: http://www.faceit-group.org/community/face-it-group-13510/the-hart-local-plan/ extracts below...

'The "duty to cooperate" seemed to pass successfully on the first morning, so good news on this first hurdle (which Hart's Plan failed on last time).

'Much time was spent on arguments regarding the Sustainability Assessment. This is the work that ranked the different strategic options on a number of criteria and recommended the current choice of strategy. Most of the people round the table were representing developers whose sites were not included in the Plan. It was notable that developers representing Owens Farm and Pale Lane were the most vocal. These sites are urban extensions which is not the preferred strategic option agreed in Hart's Plan.

'The Inspector also covered the Vision and Strategic Objectives of the Plan, in particular whether they are justified and consistent with National Policy.

'The Inspector reasserted that, under the transitionary arrangements between the 2012 and the 2018 versions of the NPPF, the 2012 policy and methodology should be used. This means that the Government's new "standard methodology" which states a base number for housing need, allocated by central government, cannot be used for Hart's Local Plan. Instead the Hart Local Plan must revert to the Objectively Assessed Housing Need (OAHN) based on an independent assessment of local housing need. This assessment is based on a Strategic Housing Assessment in a strategic market area (SMA) comprising Hart, Rushmoor and Surrey Heath and is also the basis of their Local Plans.

'Hart reinforced its position that it has followed Government guidelines, which however have been changing. There was much discussion about the need to provide homes for the unmet housing requirement from Surrey Heath under the duty to cooperate. The Inspector may put an obligation on Hart for a review of their numbers after the Local Plan has been adopted, when other factors are clearer.

'The "New Settlement" policy is clearly very important for everyone, the number of people round the table reflected this and the Inspector prioritised this in the running order. Hart and the promoters of the New Settlement were supporting the policy, with all the other developers, Winchfield Parish Council, and others, criticising it as unsound.

'The Inspector will make his judgement known in his report after the examination has closed... The examination continues on the 4th December.'



The trunk of the tree (T4 in the schematic) has been split for some time but it has recently worsened by getting longer and wider, possibly as a consequence of the recent storm. It is now about 80cm long and about 6mm wide at the widest point. Letter from Alison, Parish Priest Odiham

Dear Friends.

We are becoming increasingly familiar with press reports about the state of our nations mental health and particularly in regards to loneliness.

Research by the British Red Cross suggests over 9 million people, almost one fifth of our population are always or often feel lonely with almost two thirds, 6 million people, who feel uncomfortable admitting it.

Loneliness is often heightened over the Christmas period. Perhaps the memory of how it used to be? Happy family celebrations with loved ones who are now just simply not around?

Most of us thrive when we are in a loving relationship with others, with family or friends. The God of Christianity is a God of relationship and this is never better witnessed than in the Christmas story of the birth of Jesus, Son of God. God desires a relationship with all, with those who seem successful, and with those that find life challenging or who struggle to do the right thing.

Over this coming year keep your eyes peeled for advertised events we will be hosting, initiatives that are open to everyone. I am hoping that together and with All Saints Odiham and the other churches in our Benefice we will be part of the solution to tackling the problem of loneliness in this community.
