



The PCSO also indicated that there was no chance that Dunton Green would qualify for average speed cameras, currently on trial in Brasted, as Dunton



Green has no history of running Community Speedwatch campaigns - something Brasted has been doing for over a decade. However, as a result of residents responding to our request for support of a Speed Indicator Device (SID), we are now able to apply to have one in the village in the next few months.

As promised in our last edition, despite Covid closing the Pavilion for months on end, the Parish Council managed to make no percentage increase to our share of your Council Tax bill. Unfortunately, Sevenoaks District Council, Kent County Council and Kent Police are all increasing their shares.

I was honoured to be re-elected Chair of DGPC at this year's Annual Meeting of the Parish Council. I've been involved for over 15 years and throughout that time we have always had vacancies. I'm not sure what people think they have to be

What do you remember about your primary school days? Having fun with friends in the playground, school trips, sports days? Was it fun or a challenge? Perhaps you were at our local Dunton Green Primary School?

When your family are in financial difficulty you can feel 'different' and embarrassed at school. Perhaps you do not have the correct uniform for everyday or for sport; you love singing but do not join the choir as you know any trips will be too expensive, and there is no point thinking of being part of the drama or music club.

This is the reality **today** for children at Dunton Green Primary School – approximately one third of children are from families living on welfare benefits. That is why Dunton Green Education in Full has been established to ensure that every child has the opportunity to take part fully in all the opportunities that staff work so hard to make available.

Education in Full was established by local organisations raising money at a barn dance and auction of promises in the village prior to the pandemic. Over the last 18 months the legal paperwork has been done and 'Education in Full' is now a registered charity making grants to individual children at Dunton Green Primary School. 5 of the 6 trustees for the Foundation are local residents with a variety of knowledge and experience, and I have been a volunteer in the village for the last 15 years.

Can you help a child make the most of their time at school? Contact me if you would like to know more and/or would like to support us and ensure no child feels 'different' at our local school.

The Freighter cannot accept white goods, washing machines, dishwashers, fridges freezers, cookers, cast iron bollers or baths, long metal poles, building materials, manure, large parts of engines or vehicles or hazardous waste.

Hazardous waste now includes items like fluorescent tubes, televisions & computer monitors, batteries, oil tins and filters, paint and paint tins and chemical containers. These items cannot be accepted on the Saturday Freighter service and must be taken to your nearest Household Waste Recycling Centre.

Celebrating Local Talent - Marvin Menz

For the latest in our series introducing local talented creatives, we turn again to music, but this time more behind the scenes than in front of the audience. Marvin Menz only moved to Dunton Green in February 2022, after 5 years in London, and 15 years as a musician, but already feels at home in the village. Marvin is a mixing, editing and mastering engineer – operating his own studio: Tide.

It sounds very technical, but what does all that mean? Well, as Marvin says: "I can do magic with computers, to make a band sound like their favourite bands, like they do in their own heads!" Basically, when a band or musician records a track, they send the raw recordings to Marvin as digital files, and he makes it sound amazing!

Specifically: Marvin can clean a sound up, retime elements so it fits together tightly, resolve tuning issues, balance the levels so that all the instruments and parts can, as he says himself: "shine in their own space, that everything has impact and vibe and that the final result sounds engaging, exciting and cohesive." Then tracks are mastered to



"add the finishing touches after the mix to take your songs to that competitive standard." It's impressive stuff.

Years ago this would all need to happen with a massive mixing desk and rooms full of expensive studio equipment, and would be limited to the available tracks on that equipment (usually starting

at basic 4 track, moving up to 48 track recording at the higher end of the market) but, says Marvin: "With modern digital equipment, there are no limitations on the channels available, only the capabilities of the computer; I can create 100s of elements, each with its own track, and use AI to help me resolve the issues. All of which would have been impossible 5 years ago!"

Clever Marvin is also a recording engineer, working with local bands to capture their sound for albums, singles or demos.

So how did he get into this rather niche occupation? "I started off as a musician, a guitarist with 15 years' experience, and we were recording in Karma Studios (Thailand). I watched their sound engineer, and I was inspired to have a go." That was in 2015, and Marvin says it took him 5 years to learn the skills needed. He's now been working full time as an

engineer for 2 years.

As a musician, Marvin played guitar in a band called "Spring. Fall. Sea", and toured Asia, Europe and the USA, playing a melodic post rock/ post punk music rich in complexity and rhythm, power and heart. And it was here that Marvin learned to write and craft songs. You can check them out on YouTube, Spotify etc., they're really rather good.



So, what brought Marvin to our corner of Kent? "I left Hannover in 2013 and lived in Asia for almost 5 years. Then I moved to London. But we wanted to get a dog, and wanted more space, so we moved here in February. It's so beautiful. We love the local walks and countryside. Our dog is only 12 weeks old, but when she's old enough we'll take her out exploring more. I'm a runner too, so I plan to take her out running when she's bigger."

Moths

During lockdown I developed an interest as, well, I couldn't leave to watch wildlife, so it made sense to buy a trap and attract wildlife in! Over the summer and autumn of 2021 I caught (and released!!) over 200 species of moth just to my garden.

Typical garden species generally, but also some more unusual ones, largely due to the nearby ancient woodland at Rye Wood. One of the more interesting species included Ruby Tiger, which has developed an ability to jam Bat

echo-location in it's evolutionary

arms race.

My kids also loved getting involved, inspired by the larger and more beautiful specimens, such as the pink and tan **Elephant Hawkmoth**. We also found Gypsy Moth caterpillars in the garden, a species recolonising Kent after

its extinction in the UK in the

mid-20th century.



This led me to noticing moths elsewhere around the village, which produced three surprises in particular. Found resting on a wall, was the first

since pre-1950. This is a rare resident moth in the UK that occasionally goes decades without being seen at all!

The next two finds have been in the old cemetery by the vets - and I must congratulate whomever is responsible for its upkeep!! The grass is left long, the mowing responsibly avoids flowers like the lesser celandine - benefitting bees, moths and other pollinators, and the graves are left covered in lichen and algae.



The first find in the cemetery was Narrow Lichen Bagworm. This species long ago did away with its need for males and reproduces through parthenogenesis - that is, the wingless females (which look somewhat like woodlice) are born able to lay fertile eggs. This rarely recorded species feeds from a case on the lichen on the graves - an important habitat.

The final surprise was when a fellow Sevenoaks resident found and photographed the first ever Tree-Lichen Beauty caterpillar in the UK - evidence that this previously rare migrant is now breeding and thriving in our village - a species benefiting from climate change.


I do hope that this information can be shared with those responsible for the cemetery so that its sensitive management can be maintained.

dedicated as 'Happy to Chat' benches, plus one at the Rose Garden & one at Lusted Road




by the village green. We also hope to include a Ryewood estate seat in this project to help tackle loneliness in the village.

Bollards seem to be taking a bashing!






This bollard has been removed BUT KCC do have a works order to reinstate soon. The Station Approach ones have now been replaced with more substantial ones!

FROM THE ARCHIVES

DUNTON GREEN 100 YEARS AGO...

The Dunton Green Fire Brigade

Yes, there really was one! It is unclear exactly when it was started, perhaps there is someone in the Village who knows, but in the Parish Council minutes for June 1923 there is a proposal to move the Fire Station (which was actually just a shed) to ground next to the Village Hall. At that time there was a large Oak tree there and the shed was to be located under it. In the minutes for July that year it is recorded that Mr Wreford, who then owned the land, had agreed to the move on condition that it was not made a fixture.

The Brigade was made up of volunteers and did not have anything as grand as a Fire Engine, but were equipped with ladders, pumps and hoses, which were probably enough to deal with house fires which were much more common than today as all houses would have had coal fires and many were lit with candles or oil lamps.

In the minutes for October 1925, it was recorded that new equipment for the Fire Brigade should be purchased from Riverhead Parish Council. There are no details of what was purchased but the cost (£35) indicates that nothing very large was involved. In November 1925, Mr Lusted reported that the new equipment was in excellent working order and the Clerk was authorised to dispose of the old.

It may be wondered why the Parish Council operated a village Fire Brigade at all, but at that time there was no Statutory duty for the County Council to provide a Fire Brigade and the Sevenoaks Brigade were not obliged to fight fires outside the town. Also, with very few telephones in the village, a cottage would probably have burned to the ground before a Fire Engine from Sevenoaks could get to Dunton Green.

The minutes of the Parish Council for the 1920s do not record the closing of the Village fire service. The provision of a fire service did not become a Statutory duty on local authorities until 1938, so it was probable that the village brigade was disbanded at that time. It is, however, a fascinating reminder that in the 1920s rural villages had to provide services for themselves that we take for granted today.

Kidd & Son Brewery by Cllr Debbie Parker

It was with great interest that I saw the old sign for Kidd & Son's Brewery livery being revealed following the renovation of the Miners Arm frontage during the first lockdown 2020. My husband, Terry, and I ran the Miners Arms during the noughties, and I had first investigated details about the Kidd's Brewery following the discovery of a glass stopper with the name 'Kidd' engraved on it, which I unearthed when digging in the lovely back garden of the pub. I was, therefore, particularly pleased that the livery was re-instated back to its former glory by the current Landlord, Johnny Searle, faithfully recreating the old sepia-toned pictures that we had of the pub taken way back in the early 1900s.

The photo (pictured below) shows the Landlord at the time, John Bridges, standing proudly outside the pub.



CN Kidd & Son had 42 pubs mainly around the Dartford, Bexleyheath and Gravesend area, with the Miners Arm being listed along with the Five Bells, Chelsfield as outposts in this area. Although not listed, the Rising Sun at Twitton was also one of the Kidd & Son's Public Houses.

The website <u>breweryhistory.com</u> writes that Lieutenant-Colonel Charles Newman owned the Steam Brewery in Dartford from 1920 to 1951. The Steam brewery itself was much older, being originally called the Oak Brewery prior to its refurbishment in 1890.

As seems to happen with all too much regularity, the brewery was bought by Courage & Sons in 1937 and then demolished in 1939. However, the current signage is a great reminder of the fantastic history that Dunton Green has, from the miners digging the Polhill and Sevenoaks railway tunnels and who were the pub's original clientele, to the other breweries that served the Dunton Green pubs, such as the Golding & Co brewery sited at Bat & Ball and the Black Eagle Brewery in Westerham.

Perhaps something to investigate next! If you have any old pictures of the pubs in Dunton Green, we would be delighted to receive them.
