Update from Lucy:

BDBC IT people have advised that a forum on Sharepoint would be the best option. Lucy is waiting to have this set up and will chase.

The Community Summit will now take place in July. April has been ruled out due to the purdah period before the elections on 7 May and there is a meeting of the Basingstoke and Deane Association of Town and Parish councils in June.

Green Week 2020 will take place at the end of September. Lucy will advise on the date once confirmed with the steering group. Communities are welcome to include any activities in the Green Week programme or if carrying out their own week, Lucy can arrange the graphics work and printing. Also printing for any flyer/posters/banners. Some funding is available for speakers, room hire etc. Contact Lucy to discuss.

It would be great to develop a directory of local 'green' businesses and Lucy can pull this together and get printed. Communities can start collating who they would include from their area and email to Lucy - you could have your own mini directory if you wish alongside entry in the Basingstoke wide version.

The council offers an energy efficiency loan scheme and grants for homeowners and landlords. https://www.basingstoke.gov.uk/energy-efficiency-loans
Lucy is working on accessing ECO funding for low income, fuel poor residents and will advise when this is available.

Greening Campaign - this is being relaunched and is a good way to get residents engaged, there is a small cost but this can be funded either by HCC or BDBC, a toolkit is provided along with some training. Lucy will advise when this is available to sign up to.

It was suggested that we establish a Calendar of Events throughout the year to appear on the BDBC website - Lucy will look into establishing this.
