On 12th October three males were detained near Nether Wallop on suspicion of **poaching**. This was as a result of information given by members of the public which enabled the police to take action against the poachers and is an example of how important it is to report events. Police continue to tackle **drugs** in Andover and this month there were 11 Class 'A' drug supply arrests. Six of these arrests related to persons coming from London and suspected of running 'County Lines' in Andover, while four related to local drug users suspected of dealing on behalf of London based 'County Lines'. £5,000 of Class A drugs (cocaine, heroin and crack cocaine) has been seized along with a substantial amount of cash. You may think this doesn't affect your area but drug related crime ripples out into the rural areas so please report any suspicious activity as above.

Hate crime is defined as "any criminal offence which is perceived by the victim or any other person, to be motivated by hostility or prejudice based on a personal characteristic, specifically actual or perceived race, religion/faith, sexual orientation, disability and transgender identity". The Home Office recently released national statistics for 2017/18, which showed an increase in hate crime levels of 17% compared with the previous year, recorded by police Forces in England and Wales.

Hate crime doesn't just happen in big cities, but living in a small rural community can make it harder to speak up about hate crime. The Police and Crime Commissioner and his team want to make sure everyone has the support they need, no matter where they are.
