40th Anniversary and Club Uniform

The Committee, in looking at how we should celebrate in 2018 the 40th Anniversary of the Club' establishment establishment, has decided that this would be an opportune time to update our Club uniform. A Sub Committee comprising Kevin and Janie Vickers, Sue Dixon, Barry Lee and Christine Williams was therefore set up to look at possible shirt designs, suppliers and costs. This Sub Committee has now reported back and, as a result, the Committee has agreed:

• A design for the new sublimated shirt – see picture



- Shirts should be obtained from ACEIT, an Australian company which is not only the Bowls England uniform supplier but also supplies shirts and jackets to a number of County Associations and Clubs
- Playing members will receive one free shirt with the shirts being introduced for 2018. It is planned to have them available at the November AGM.

The new shirt will be registered for play in 2018 and should be worn by Oakley players when competing in County and Association Competitions and Leagues.

In addition, the Committee has agreed that we should introduce a shower proof jacket (similar to those worn by Bowls Hampshire) which will complement the current fleece obtained from Cotswold Bowls. This jacket in the Club colours will also be obtained from ACEIT.

There is still work to do in deciding the numbers and sizes of shirt to be ordered and establishing how many individuals will wish to purchase additional shirts and the likely demand for jackets. The Committee felt, however, that members should be made aware now of the changes so that they do not in 2017 go out and buy shirts that will, by next year, have been superseded.

On the Green

April 22nd, Opening Spoon Drive. When I was given that date at the beginning of the year it seemed an eternity away so no need to panic Mr. Mainwaring! Even in the second week of March when work started to ramp up, with very cold winds blasting across the Green outdoor bowling was nowhere to be seen on the agenda. Now, as I write this, only 3 weeks to go and with a multitude of jobs to be completed, there is also a slight tightening of the buttock muscles to contend with!

I suppose members could be forgiven for assuming that after the Closing Spoon Drive the Green Team either went off on holiday, went indoor bowling or just put their feet up until the start of the next season. Far from it!! Following the 3 or 4 days of extensive renovation work at the end of September the Green has been aerated every 3 weeks, topped off with the mower occasionally to keep it at around 10mm long (yes, it does keep growing!), sprayed several times to contain the moss, disease and leatherjackets plus a daily visit, except when frost prohibited, to brush off the dew and wormcasts. Now since the beginning of March it's been mowed twice a week, rolled 4 times, aerated twice, scarified once with another to go before the start, fertilized and the summer season spraying regime started. And that's just the green itself! The rest of the gardens and surrounding grass have needed work, plus the maintenance work on the pavilion, sheds and equipment. The good news is, it's all been worth it as it looks pretty good at the moment!

Now, some food for thought for you. From now until the end of September there will be at least 30 man hours per week spent by volunteers keeping the Green and its surrounding in the pristine condition we all expect it to be in. Should we not have those volunteers and have to contract for that work, taking £15 per hour as a conservative cost, that equates to a cost of £450 per week, £1800 per month and a staggering £21600 per year – and that's just the summer. Indeed, clubs who do contract out just for the very basic work on the actual green in most cases get very little change from £10000 a year. All right, maybe we on the Green Team don't graft as hard as a younger worker earning a living would so it takes us a bit longer, and that's the point. None of us is getting any younger and we're all, particularly me, are beginning to feel the strain a bit after 3 or 4 hours work and then wanting to go out for a game of bowls. We really do need one or two more volunteers, who are mechanically minded enough to work the machines, and who are prepared to commit to a few hours regularly a week to help us out. Of course, it's not all graft, the team also gets to natter at coffee breaks and I'm told there is something profoundly rewarding and satisfying about working out in the open air after maybe a lifetime of office work (just ask Keith!). As I've pointed out on many occasions, if we come to the end of the road and the club has to contract out the main work at £10000 per annum, that could potentially add to 120 members around £80 to EACH subscription. Think about it.

OK, let me just change hats and put the happy hat on and hope the Green meets all your expectations for the season and wish you well in any competitions you've entered and have a great bowling season.
