It is a bit like the Church - especially the Portsmouth Diocese and change and transition. They got to the point where they simply could not carry on as they were. The moneys coming in and going out couldn't reconcile, they had to think ahead and try to change, and try to manage the change slowly, but then Covid struck. This made the need for change even greater, as all sorts of ways of giving dried up, making the change needed more drastic. So drastic that it has upset a lot of people.

Now, just like my hair where I am trying to manage the change from dyed to grey and white, that doesn't mean I like the process, doesn't mean I am enjoying it, but sadly it has to happen and cannot really be put off. The hair dye isn't great for the environment. It is time I started to embrace the transition. The process of change can be messy, frustrating, and at times seem pointless, but we need to remember why we are doing it. With the church it is so that it doesn't go bankrupt, as some Dioceses have done.

The New Year is a time to think about change. Changes to ourselves and our lifestyles - lose weight, book a holiday. Changes to how we manage our money - start to save, open an ISA; how we give - which charities we support and also how we Worship.

Churches are a bit like High Street banks. If we don't use them we could lose them, they cannot stay open indefinitely, waiting for one day of the year when we wish to visit, or want to go to a wedding. They need more of an investment of time than that.

Some people offer to mow the grass or polish the woodwork, even if they don't wish to go to church. Others will help fundraise to keep their local church open. Sadly, we all have to adapt and help to keep our churches open if that is the present and the future we wish to see.

In the churches we have different ways to worship. Some like the words and poetry of the Book of Common Prayer, introduced in the Elizabethan Age and still going strong. Some like the structure of the Common Worship which can be found in a lot of churches and has a good following, others prefer something 'hot off the press' or rather not even printed, but put onto a screen and deleted at the end of the day. How to reconcile all these? Well, the beauty is that there are so many different churches doing things differently we can look for the one which suits us. You may have to travel for it, but once there you will be welcomed with open arms.

The process of change and transformation the Diocese faces will be messy, it may even be turbulent, it will certainly be long! There will be good days and bad, but let us hope that at the end will be the same Church which has nourished the country for centuries. More streamlined perhaps, able to withstand another few centuries of care and worship, definitely. Still able to inspire and nurture local communities - let's hope so. It is down to all of us to get involved.

In our society we are encouraged to think we should 'manage change', and yet there are times in our lives when we actually have to 'Let go and let God'. This is an expression I first heard in the eighties, but it holds true today, even if the grammar of it makes you shudder! We think we are in charge of ourselves and our lives, but if we want to be true Christians it is God who is in control. He asks us to lean on him, to pray for the things we need and to turn to him in trouble.

God wants to be bothered with our minutiae because if it is something bothering us then it comes between ourselves and our ability to feel at one with him. Prayer and listening to God can help us 'indwell' in him through our changes and chances of life. Perhaps for this new year we need to 'Let go and let God' a little and see what happens. Otherwise, our burdens may





New footpath under consideration in Warnford Parish

An application had been made to Hampshire County Council (HCC) to restore a public footpath to the network that appeared to have been omitted when the Definitive Map of public rights of way was created under the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949.



HCC has now reviewed the evidence presented to it and is evidently satisfied that the path should be added to the Definitive Map. It also includes a link from the verge of the A32 south of the Middle Lodge entrance to the Park, through the grounds of Abbey House and to the top of Beaconhill Lane. The heavy traffic on the A32 and the lack of verges between Middle Lodge and Warnford Village means that the value of this additional section (C to A) would be limited.

The footpath, if confirmed, will complete a public right of way between the Meon Valley Trail and Beacon Hill, via Peake New Road and Beaconhill Lane. (Beaconhill Lane is already shown on the Definitive Map as a public footpath. Peake New Road is a public highway).

The possibility of creating this link (D to C) was discussed and publicised in the Parish in 2019 and the response was positive. A number of new circular walks from Warnford, West Meon and Exton will be possible via the new connection. It will also form a potential alternative route for walkers on the South Downs Way.

HCC has told WPM that an objection has been received, which means that the matter must go to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS). HCC will refer it to PINS early in 2022 but it may be quite some time before a decision is reached on whether to confirm the footpath. PINS has quite a backlog of cases so will not be able to deal with this one for some months, and will

then need to consider how to proceed ie. by written representations or Inquiry. Whichever is adopted, there is unlikely to be a decision within 18 months, and it could well take longer.

- Growing your own food can be a fantastic way to cut down on food waste as you can share your extra produce with a neighbour or friend. If you would like to give back to your community and have surplus food on your allotment, Foodshare encourages growers to donate fresh produce to local charities who feed people, for example hospices, care homes and homeless shelters. You can register with them to see the charities that are looking for donations in your local area. www.foodshare.org.uk/grow-your-own
- When doing your weekly food shop there are simple ways you can shop smarter saving you money and reducing your carbon footprint! Choosing the food with the longest use by date, choosing wonky fruit and veg in supermarkets where it is available and creating a shopping list to ensure that you only buy the food you will use. Shopping in this way could save you on average £700 a year!
- If you do end up with extra non-perishable food items you could donate them to your local food bank. Often your local supermarket or corner shop will accept donations on your behalf. A Parliament of Owls

Owls are among our most captivating birds and, with a good view, are easily distinguished from other UK birds. But how to tell one owl from another? Here's a guide to the UK's five resident species:

Barn owl

A very pale, slender owl, typically white on the underparts and golden-brown with grey markings on the upperparts. It has a white, heart-shaped facial disk with dark eyes. Usually seen over grassland or farmland at dawn and dusk, though can be seen at night or even during the day.

Its call resembles eerie squeals and a shrieking 'shreeee'.

Tawny owl

A mostly brown owl with a large, rounded head. Slightly larger than a barn owl and usually seen in woodland. Plumage is mottled brown but can vary from greyish to reddish brown.

In flight, it shows broad, rounded wings and flies with quick wingbeats in long, straight glides. The tawny's rich vocal repertoire includes a short 'ke-wik' contact call and a quavering 'hoo, hu-hooo' advertising call.

Short-eared owl

A sandy-brown owl similar in size to a tawny, but with longer wings. It has a streaked breast, but a pale, un-marked belly with thick dark barring on the tail and piercing yellow eyes.

In flight, it shows long, narrow wings that are slightly longer and slimmer than long-eared owls, with black wingtips. Flies with slow wingbeats and wavering glides.

Males perform display flights at breeding grounds, giving a fast series of deep hoots and short, quick wing-claps. Other calls include rapid, rasping barks when alarmed.

Long-eared owl

This streaky brown owl looks very similar to a short-eared owl but has darker feathers and less of a yellow hue. The facial disk is buff with a well-defined blackish border and white 'eyebrows' extending towards the beak. It has deep orange eyes and long 'ear-tufts' atop the head.

In flight, it's tricky to tell from the short-eared owl. Slightly shorter and more blunt-tipped wings, with fine black barring on the wingtips and no white trailing edge to the upper wing.

Males advertise with deep, soft hoots without inflection given every few seconds, while females have a more nasal call.

Little owl

A small owl with a flattened crown. The upperparts are dark brown with whitish streaks and spots, with whitish underparts featuring bold brown streaks. Facial disk is greyish brown with prominent whitish 'eyebrows' giving a stern expression. Eyes are yellow.

Flies with a fast, bounding flight like a thrush. Hunts by swooping from perches but will also run across ground to pursue prey.

The little owl's various calls include a fast 'chi-chi-chi' alarm call, a low-pitched hoot and a mewling call.

Snowdrop Sundays

The Snowdrops can be viewed on four Sunday afternoons in February: 6th, 13th, 20th and 27th from 2pm - 5pm. They are in Warnford Park, which is off the A32, post code SO32 3LA. The Park gates will be opened by kind permission of the owners, at 2pm.

Please, for road safety reasons, do not come any earlier.

When you arrive, go through the gates, and follow the Park (Capability Brown?) drive up to the Car Park, where you will be assisted to park by Stewards. If it is wet, you may wish to wear suitable footwear. Entrance is free, but Welcomers by the Church will invite you to donate to Church funds and you will be given a leaflet.

The Snowdrop Walk takes you past the Church and through the 13thC ruin, through the wood, along a path beside a Grade1 listed house, out to a lake (typical Capability Brown) and back to the Church. Do please go in, there will be teas, the organ playing, and cards can be purchased. On Sunday 6th February, our vicar Philippa will hold a short Snowdrop Service in the Church at 4pm. To adhere to Covid regulations, the wearing of masks will be required in the church.

Call for Nature Sites in the South Downs National Park

The South Downs National Park Authority is looking to hear from landowners, land managers, communities, businesses, and conservation groups to put forward possible sites where new wildlife habitat could be created, contributing to nature recovery in the South



Downs National Park. Currently, 25% of the National Park is managed for nature. Their goal is to increase it to 33% by 2030.

There are a range of delivery opportunities, including funding, currently or soon to be available, which can support projects for nature recovery.

The SDNPA would like to work with interested landowners and land managers to identify and develop nature recovery projects by providing specialist advice and help to match-make funding opportunities for suitable sites. From 17th January 2022 submitted sites will be evaluated for their potential and opportunities to contribute to nature recovery by supporting bigger, better, and more joined up nature. Following the evaluation, discussions will begin as to how the SDNPA can work together with landowners to develop projects further. They hope this will take place from Spring 2022. SDNPA


