



<u>19/00149/LDEU</u> (refused 17th May) Nunnery House Tunworth Road Mapledurwell. Certificate of Lawfulness for the continued use of land as residential in relation to garden area, garage, drive, and area around the garage.

<u>18/03675/FUL</u> (validated 24 Jan) Parrotts, Greywell Road, Mapledurwell. Change of use and extension of agricultural building to form 1 x two-bedroomed dwelling. To be decided by Development Control Committee, date to be re-arranged.

Report from the Parish Assembly of Wednesday 15th May

Lorna Cuthill welcomed everyone to the Assembly and thanked all members of the Parish Council and the parish clerk for their work during the year.

- David Ellison and Alan Hutton have both recently stepped down from the Parish Council, with Matt Heywood
 and Hugo Cubitt welcomed as new members. Thanks are due to David Ellison, in particular, for orchestrating and
 overseeing the complete refurbishment of the sports pavilion and the improvements in the playground and the
 village hall surrounds. He put a great deal of effort into his six years as a parish councillor.
- It has been a controversial year regarding planning. The Parish Council seeks consistently to protect the rural character of the villages and countryside so they may continue to be enjoyed by those from within and beyond the Parish.
- Matt Heywood presented a brief analysis of the Parish Council accounts which are available on the website.
- Tom Horsey thanked Lorna Cuthill for her service to the Parish Council. As well as being parish clerk for two years, Lorna has served as a parish councillor for 12 years, and for the past six years as Chairman. She has put her heart and soul into the work she does for the Parish and has been prepared to take difficult decisions. Lorna has stepped down as Chairman but will continue as Parish Councillor for the meantime. Hugo Cubitt has been elected Parish Council Chairman for the next 12 months
- Ward Cllr Onnalee Cubitt explained that the Ward Boundary changes will be implemented in May 2020 when elections will take place for all Ward Councillor seats. The rationale is that all Wards should have three Borough Councillors representing roughly the same size of electorate and this will reduce the total number of Councillors from 60 to 54. Basing Ward already has three Ward Councillors but neighbouring Upton Grey & the Candovers is presently a one-Councillor Ward and so will be divided, with half merging with Basing. The resulting 'Basing & Upton Grey' Ward will lose one Councillor seat overall and will include Old Basing & Lychpit, Newnham, Mapledurwell & Up Nately, plus Cliddesden, Winslade, Herriard, Tunworth, Weston Corbett, Weston Patrick and Upton Grey.
- Cllr Cubitt also spoke of concern that Basingstoke and Deane will be asked to build a lot more houses. The new Government methodology for calculating housing need is complicated but includes measures of past delivery and of affordability which result in BDBC's housing figures going up while Hart's have gone down. The Local Plan five-year review process is about to begin. It is likely that the Local Plan figure for housing delivery will increase from 850 dwellings per annum to 974, which will increase the pressure of maintaining a deliverable five-year land supply. A call for sites is imminent and new sites may be needed.
- PC Reid joined the Assembly, hotfoot from Bradley's meeting. He commented that across his beat area, poaching is on the rise and more from devilment he said rather than for profit. Vehicles are driven through crops chasing deer, until the deer are exhausted and then dogs are set on them. In the Parish, he reported that an incident of sheep worrying had been dealt with. It was also noted that the skip by the Village Hall is being used by people to dump their own rubbish; need to raise awareness of this and post notices to discourage.
 - PC Reid was congratulated on his High Sheriff's Award (for which he was nominated by Candovers Parish Council). He was thanked as always for his effective policing and level of service to the Community.
 - PC Reid received his award from Mark Thistlethwayte, High Sheriff of Hampshire on Wednesday 20th March at a Reception in The Great Hall, Winchester.

It's almost father's Day!

On Sunday June the 16th we will be celebrating Father's Day. This is a day not only to remember our dads, but all male role models in our lives.

Have you ever thought about how amazing dads are? To us they might be a lift to football, the best cheese on toast chef in the world or the giver of the most amazing hugs, but to others they're something quite different – maybe a loving husband, a kind boss, a teacher, a son... one person, yet so many amazing people!!

On the 16th June we also celebrate Trinity Sunday, which is when we think of God, Our Heavenly Father (as well as God the Son and God the Holy Spirit!) You see, God's a bit like our Dad:



We think of God the Father as the creator of the universe – powerful, creative and generous. He's the part we pray to in The Lord's Prayer.

God the Son is Jesus. He came down to Earth to show us how to live. He died on the cross to take away our sins and then came back to life on Easter morning.





God the Holy Spirit is the part of God which He left on Earth to comfort us and show us how we should live. He's like God inside of us.

One God, but three amazing parts! Trinity actually means there are three parts to God (tri means three – can you think of any other words starting with tri that are connected with the number 3?)

Let's Draw a Simple Trinity Knot!

- 1 Sketch a dividing line, putting a dot to the lower left and lower right, and at the top.
- 2 Draw a fat arc starting at the top dot, arcing to the right of the divider, and over to the left hand dot.
- **3** Draw another arc from the top dot, down to the left of the divider, and over to the righthand dot.



- 4 Join the left and right dots together with an arc that bows upward in the middle. This completes the basic outside shape of the trinity knot.
- **5** Now draw a second trinity knot line on the inside of your first line. Keep the width even throughout.



6 Weave your overs and unders to complete. Study the knot above and see which intersecting lines from Step 5 need to be erased. Fill in with a colour of your choice.

Owens Farm – thanks you

Newnham Parish Council would like to record its thanks to everyone who contributed to the developer's decision to withdraw the Appeal for 700 houses at Owens Farm.

This is to everyone who responded to and attended the Appeal Inquiry, and to those who spoke at the Inquiry, including Nigel Bell; Su Turner for Newnham Parish Council; Hook Parish Council; Hook Neighbourhood Plan; Hook Action Against Overdevelopment; John Fleming for the Whitewater Valley Preservation Society, plus Ward Councillors.

Also to those who contributed their views on 'works to common land' and de-registering Village Green at Jubilee Green in Hook. These applications and the level of objections were also brought to the Appeal Inspector's attention

The reason given for withdrawing the Owens Farm Appeal was the Local Plan Inspector's letter / preliminary report of 26th February indicating the submitted Plan and its housing figures (subject to ammendments) to be sound.

Though this surely would be the most important factor, the appellants knew this before the start of the Inquiry. It good to consider that the developer withdrew at 9.30am on the Friday morning 22nd March, following the Thursday given over to evidence from the action groups, residents and parish councils.

The Jubilee Green applications have also subsequently been withdrawn.

The Parish Assembly will include discussions on measures to help further protect the 'local gap' for the future

CANCELLATION OF OPEN GARDENS

Unfortunately there are now no longer sufficient gardens able to open to host this year's Open Gardens event and so it is having to be cancelled. Hopefully next year we will have the numbers to be able to run it again.



Basingstoke and Deane Local Plan Review

The current Local Plan was adopted in May 2016 and covers the period 2011 to 2029. National guidance now promotes the concept of an on-going cycle of plan making and review, which is reinforced by a legal requirement to review Plans every five years. Following an initial review, which considered recent changes to national planning policy, including the introduction of a new approach for assessing local housing need, BDBC has taken the decision to update the current adopted Local Plan.

How Long Will it Take to Update the Local Plan?

The council is required to publish a Local Development Scheme (LDS) to set out which planning documents will be produced and when. The new LDS, is available to view on the council website at https://www.basingstoke.gov. uk/LDS.

The LDS includes a timetable for the production of the Local Plan Review.

How to Get Involved

BDBC will be undertaking a number of formal consultations throughout the Local Plan Update. It is currently considering the suitability of holding an initial consultation later this year on the issues and options which the update should cover. More details of the consultations will be available nearer the time, via our newsletters, online and social media.

Call for sites

To assist in the Local Plan Update process, BDBCl need to understand what land is available for new housing, business, leisure, and other uses. The council will shortly be announcing a 'call for sites' exercise to identify potential land for development. Sites submitted will then be assessed for suitability through the update process.

Sites can be put forward by anyone or any organisation. In the past, land has been typically promoted by land owners, developers, agents, local businesses and individuals in the borough.

The Call for Sites opened on Wednesday 22 May and will run until Wednesday 3 July 2019. More information on how to submit a site can be found on the BDBC website.

Newnham Amphibian and Reptile Survey

The Amphibian and Reptile Conservation Trust (ARC) are surveying land in Newnham (with landowners' permission and including Newnham Green) as part of a national survey, the National Amphibian and Reptile Recording Scheme (NARRS). NARRS volunteers are allocated a one-kilometre grid square within which they carry out several survey visits on foot using simple techniques to search for amphibians and reptiles. A copy of the survey will be available when complete.



Letter from the Local Churches Leadership Team

I wonder what your earliest memory is?

I'm a very keen sailor, and for me, one of the earliest things I can remember is as a young boy on holiday on the Isle of Wight, when my father tried to rent a sailing dinghy for us all to take out for the day as a family. I was really excited at the prospect, but then my hopes were dashed when the owner of the boatyard said that unfortunately he didn't rent out boats 'until Whitsun.' I always wondered what 'Whitsun' was, and it wasn't until many years later that I discovered that Whitsun is the Christian celebration of Pentecost.

You will be receiving this edition of the Parish News at about the time we celebrate Pentecost this year – Sunday 9th June 2019. Going back two millennia, at this time of year Jesus' disciples had only recently witnessed Jesus' death on Good Friday, his remarkable resurrection on Easter Sunday, and then his ascension into heaven just a few weeks later.

And they will have remembered Jesus telling them before his ascension, to wait in Jerusalem for the gift of his Spirit – the Holy Spirit. Jesus told them that they would receive power, and that they would be his witnesses throughout the world.

In the Bible, we read that at Pentecost, seven weeks after Easter, 'the disciples were waiting together, and praying, when a violent wind filled the whole house, and what seemed to be tongues of fire came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit.' (Acts 2:1-4) Later that day they started telling people about the good news of Jesus and his love for them, and we read that in one day more than 3,000 people became believers. The church had been born — and it must have been an exciting time!

There are now more than 2.3 billion Christians around the world, a figure growing by more than 30 million per year. Here in North Hampshire we too are rejoicing at new growth in our churches, from new services starting on Sundays, to 'Messy Church' services mid-week, new youth groups, holiday clubs, and so much more.

Just as Jesus promised the Holy Spirit to his disciples, so he makes an amazing promise to each one of us. He says:'I have come that you may have life, life in all its fulness.' Jesus promises that there is more to life than we can imagine. It may be that going to church is a distant memory for you. If so, why not come and join us afresh, this season of Pentecost?
