Parish Council Elections – 2nd May 2024

Your Parish Councillors are your voice at a local level. Without a Parish Council you lose that voice. Due to low numbers of candidates there has not been an election for many years. Now that the current term has come to an end, all seats are up for re-election. Any current councillors wishing to, will need to stand against any new nominees. It is a simple first past the post system – the six nominees with the most votes will create the next Parish Council. If there are no additional nominations for this year's elections the Parish Council will continue as is.

If you are interested in standing as a Parish Councillor, you can contact any of our current Councillors, our wonderful Parish Clerk, Trudi, or the District Council for more information. Any members of the PC will be happy to explain what the role entails and the time commitment.

The parish nominations will be available from your parish clerk early in March, to coincide with the Notice of Election which is on Monday 25 March. The completed nominations can then be received by the Returning Officer of the District Council up until the deadline of 4pm Friday 5 April 2024 – details of which will be on the nomination form.

Road Closures in March

Eynsham Parish Council has been advised of two overnight road closures that may impact our residents in March. From 19-20 March, overnight from 8pm until 6am, a section of the A415 at Standlake will be closed with a temporary 'no waiting' restriction in place. This is to allow the carriageway to be patched. There will be a diversion in place whilst the works take place.

River levels in Oxfordshire

Heavy rainfall in early February has led river levels in Oxfordshire to rise once again. Below is useful information for local people to monitor the situation in individual parts of the county – especially when the Environment Agency issues flood alerts or the more serious flood warnings. If the Environment Agency issues a flood alert this indicates that an area should prepare, including making defences and staying up to date with the latest information. When a flood warning is issued, this indicates a greater level of severity. You can [sign up](#) to receive flood warnings from the Environment Agency. Alternatively you can call Floodline on 0345 988 1188 to register. The service is free and you can choose to receive notifications of flood warnings by email, text, or both.

Recycling, Reusing and Composting

For the 10th consecutive year, residents in Oxfordshire are the best in England for recycling, reusing, and composting.

Oxfordshire County Council has again been named the top performing county council waste disposal authority. In 2022 - 23, residents recycled, reused, or composted 57.2 per cent of their household waste, according to the latest government figures.

Councillor Pete Sudbury, Oxfordshire County Council's Cabinet Member for Climate Change and Environment, said: "We want to say congratulations and thank you to our residents for all their hard work and commitment in making it 10 in a row. It is quite an achievement. "We have successfully kept our waste per household down, and the biggest area for improvement would be food waste. A lot of that is still not being recycled. Wasting less food is good for our wallets and for the planet, and the food waste we do recycle is anaerobically digested, making methane to replace fossil gas to heat our homes and cook our food. "In tough times, we can all remember the old adage 'waste not, want not'. Waste less food, keep items in use for longer and reduce the amount of rubbish we produce – which benefits everyone financially and environmentally."

The total amount of household waste produced in Oxfordshire was 278,857 tonnes for 2022/23, with 159,732 tonnes being reused, recycled and composted.
