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	<p>ROAD CLOSURES:</p> <p><i>Starting on 19 June 2017 for 5 nights (20:00 – 06:00)</i> LOCATION: A40, from A415 Ducklington junction to B4047 Asthall Barrow junction. TEMPORARILY PROHIBITS THE USE OF THE HIGHWAY BY ALL MOTOR VEHICLES REASON: to facilitate carriageway maintenance works (Traffic Regulation Notices cover a maximum of 5 consecutive days.) ACCESS: Limited access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles and for frontages within the closed section of road, subject to the progress of the works SUGGESTED ALTERNATIVE ROUTE: B4047, A4095 Tower Hill, A415 Ducklington Lane and vice versa.</p> <p><i>Starting on 24 June 2019</i> The anticipated completion date is 25 June 2019 (date included)(Traffic Regulation Notices cover a maximum of 5 consecutive days.) LOCATION: Standlake, B4449 -A415 to Main Road B4449 Roundabout REASON: to facilitate Routine Carriageway Surface Dressing ACCESS: limited access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles and for frontages within the closed section of road, subject to the progress of the works The “No Waiting” restriction means that wherever there are in place yellow “No Waiting” cones, you will not be able to park vehicles on the highway. SUGGESTED ALTERNATIVE ROUTE: via B4449- A40-A415 Standlake Road and vice versa</p> <p><i>Starting on 27 June 2019</i> Stanton Harcourt – Main Road - Prohibition of Through Traffic This Order is being introduced because of installation of new sewer main which are anticipated to take 4 weeks to complete.</p> <p>The effect of the Order is to temporarily prohibit any vehicle proceeding in a section of Main Road, Stanton Harcourt near to Steady’s Lane.</p> <p>Appropriate traffic signs will be displayed to indicate when the measures are in force. Exemptions are included for police, fire and ambulance services and for the works and for access to premises which are only accessible from the closed section of road.</p> <p>The alternative route for traffic affected by the closure is via Standlake and Hardwick - B4449 – Standlake Road A415 – Abingdon Road A415 – un-named road – Standlake Road – un-named road – Main Road and visa versa.</p> <p>TG confirmed the notices had been circulated via the email list and posted on the website – MJ asked for copies to be displayed on the main notice board on the Green.</p>
