OL to look at Statutory Guidance before contacting HE.</p> <p>RC spoke of the issue with the Village Hall disabled access which slopes down to the A35 – a barrier is needed but HE says this cannot be done because of the narrow pavement despite the Village Hall Committee offering to increase the width by removing the wall.
