But it's not all about repairing chairs.

New Chair Phil Courtney told the Frome Standard: "We've made some scooter racks for school children so that they could hang them up. Once, though we helped make some life-sized soldiers for a Boer War exhibition."

Mayor Mark Dorrington who sent the morning chewing the fat with the guys said: "It really impresses me, getting together doing something special and doing useful tasks. I am well aware of the aims and objectives of the Men's Shed, mainly through talking to former Men's Shed chair Patrick Abrahams and by commissioning some planters through the Trinity Community Group; now in place and looking great".

Doug Insall said: "What's great is that there are guys that are experts in everything. One was a silversmith, while Ray - who is 91-years-old was a football referee back in the day".

Courtney added: "It's not just about beating loneliness. It's about wellbeing which is really important to me. I did not know anyone here before but now I can name everyone!"
