

Do you have a spare room in your house?Share your home and make a difference

Do you feel that you could offer support to someone in order to make a difference to their life? If so, you could be just the person we are looking for!!

The Oxfordshire Shared Lives Scheme supports carers to provide paid care and support in their own home to vulnerable adults.

People who use the service need practical and emotional support in order to live their lives more fully and independently and feel part of a family household. They may have a learning disability, physical disability or mental health need or they could be an older person or someone with dementia. Here in Oxfordshire we are keen to recruit people from all walks of life who feel they can offer this type of paid support in their own home. It could be anything from occasional short breaks or day time support through to a longer term full time arrangement. The support that our carers give makes a huge difference to the lives of people using the service, often enabling them to experience new opportunities and reach new goals.

No matter what type of arrangement our carers provide, they all receive on-going support and training from a team of qualified social workers to ensure delivery of high quality, person centred care. They could also be paid up to just over £400 per week for each person they support.

There are also regular opportunities to meet up with other carers and people who use the service at social and information events so a wider support network is also available.

If you have a spare room to offer and would like to play a key part in making a positive difference to someone's life, then we really want to hear from you!

Next Meeting Monday 3rd December 7:30

Public Consultation – Improving Transport along the A40 Corridor

Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) is currently consulting on their proposals for the A40 corridor, the date are:
Saturday 1st Dec 3-6pm Cassington Village Hall
Monday 3rd Dec 4:30 - 6pm Eynsham Village Hall
Wednesday 5th Dec 1 - 5 pm Witney Methodist Church Hall
Tuesday 11th December. 5pm - 8.30pm - Witney Corn
Exchange

This Consultation closes on 6th Jan 2019.

The current proposed Phase I changes (Growth Board and Phase 2 (HiF bid) would mean that there are more than ten obstacles in the flow of the traffic from the new Witney bypass roundabout to Duke's Cut. It is difficult to believe that this would enhance the efficiency of the A40 nor the proposed 50 mph limit. 14,950 houses are forecast to be built in West Oxfordshire in the next ten years and over 3,000 of those are around Eynsham so the problem will only get worse. Spending money on traffic flow initiatives and Park and Rides scheme may not be the most effective solution; a new approach is needed. I believe the OCC should consider other actions such as connecting the A40 before Duke's Cut with the Pear tree roundabout, solving the Swinford bridge queues by persuading the owner to smartcard immediately resurrecting the Cassington road to the B4449 by repairing the bridge at the A40 end, reviewing the effectiveness of the Witney Road lights etc.

In order to get the OCC to consider a broader and more innovative transport solution for the same cost we need to get our voice heard. I would encourage all residents to attend the consultation meeting and put forward their suggestions follow up with email confirmation to Cllr Yvonne Constance (yvonne.constance@oxfordshire.gov.uk/
