# 2. Minutes of previous Annual Village Meeting held on Monday 7th April 2022

## 4. Book Group

The Book Club continues to be well supported with 8-10 ladies attending the meeting and 20 or so members in total. # 5. Buckinghamshire Council - Cllr Paul Irwin and Cllr Ashely Waite

Cllr Ashley Waite: Roads are the worst they have been for a considerable time. The newly formed 'Buckinghamshire Highways' is now in operation and is an alliance between Buckinghamshire Council and Balfour Beatty Living Places and Atkins (as well as a number of specialist framework contractors). The new arrangement covers all elements of highways maintenance and repair, including pothole repairs, gully cleansing, street lighting, winter gritting and resurfacing works, as well as larger improvement and development programmes. The county's network is almost 2,100 miles of highways and 1,500 miles of footways. Fix My Street is being expanded and relaunched. Most of the parishes in the area have received some funding from the Haddenham and Waddesdon Community Board (H&WCB). Out of sixteen Community Boards in the county, H&WCM board has had the highest level of contributory funding. The Council has won several court cases against fly tipping. There are now four community buses. Commercial trips are now offered which contribute to, and enable, community activity. Food banks continues to go from strength to strength. The lending library will be in operation soon.

# 11. Ashendon Parish Council, Chair, Chris Rand

The Parish Council has enjoyed a reasonably busy year. Over the 12 months, a considerable amount of work has gone into Boughton's Peace, a new defibrillator has been installed at Upper Pollicott and a defibrillator training course has taken place. The Bouncy Fun Day was a great success and will be repeated this year, thanks to Clare. The SID has been installed in the village and data is being collected. Huge thanks were paid to the Speed watch team. It was appreciated that the SID is required in different areas of the village but Chris Rand noted that, after 4 months of equipment breakdown, some catching up was now required. The Parish Council has instructed some tree works which may be subject to planning permission. The PC eagerly awaits a feasibility study from Buckinghamshire Council for the well documented Wotton Road/White City footpath. If approved, the Parish Council is hopeful of a sizeable grant from HS2. The Parish Council continues to help the APFA with a contribution towards its grass cutting. Chris asked the meeting to continue to report the state of the roads via Fix My Street. A Financial Report was circulated which detailed expenditure in 2022-23, grants and projects received and planned expenditure for 2023-24. The Precept was raised from £16,000 to £17,000 to reflect the increase in costs incurred by the Parish Council.
