Apologies for absence had been received from Cllr Paul Bartlett.	
Declaration of interest in items on the agenda	
There were no declarations of interest.	
Minutes of the Meeting on 21 st September 2015 were approved as a true record and signed accordingly.	
Matters Arising from the Minutes The Clerk updated the meeting with regard to the litter bin in North Sevington, Ashford Borough Council have responded saying, "We are currently collating the data collected from the borough wide litter / dog bin survey so will hopefully be able to give you an answer soon."	
Public Session There were no members of the public present.	
 Borough Councillors Cllr White was welcomed to the meeting. A background to Cllr White's history was provided. Since being elected on to Ashford Borough Council Cllr White is on the Audit Committee only. The meeting was updated on the Borough Council's purchasing of properties in Ashford. The Borough Council need to become commercially minded and raise finances to assist with funding. As cuts are happening in Central Government pressure is placed on Borough Councils to raise finances in other ways. Ashford is to take 250 Syrians over the next 6 years, before they arrive, locations are being considered as to where they would be best placed, allowing for school places, jobs and housing. 900 jobs are to be created in Ashford from business expanding and a further 5,000 jobs could be created if larger businesses who have expressed an interest in re-locating come to Ashford. There was some discussions about the infrastructure of the road network being able to cope with the extra vehicles the new jobs would bring. Cllr White agreed that a need for a resolution to Operation Stack is required. Cllr Murphy said that he would like to see the funding Ashford Borough Council are looking into be approached on a greater community base, drawing on the example of the community funding The Farriers Arms. Cllr Bartlett had sent an updated map (circulated to all Councillors prior to the meeting) of the highlighted development sites. Albeit very informal the sites highlighted for development have had decisions made. A copy of the map is to be kept on file. 	
Report from Community Warden There was no report from the Community Warden or the PCSO.

Church Commissioners and English Rural Housing have now resolved the issue and are therefore allowing the local needs housing to go ahead.
