#### Letter from our Rector, Rev. Steve Stewart:

"Little darling, it's been a long cold lonely winter". So go the words of the Beatles classic from the Abbey Road album, penned by George Harrison. This year it feels like winter didn't really end until May, and only now can we say, "Here comes the sun"! Here Comes the Sun is a song of great hope after a long time of longing and waiting.

Sometimes life can feel like a long cold lonely winter, where it is hard to find hope, let alone meaning. Yet this sense of longing in the face of the world which looks like despair was an emotion expressed in the Psalms of the Bible long before the Fab Four put it to music. Time and again the Psalms speaks of the soul's aching for the life of Winter's anxiety and despair to be over:

Have mercy on me, LORD, for I am faint; heal me, LORD, for my bones are in agony. My soul is in deep anguish. How long, LORD, how long? Turn, LORD, and deliver me; save me because of your unfailing love. (Psalm 6:2-4)

If this is how you are feeling, know that God hears you when you cry out to him. If you are seeking – as every human soul is – for something deep and solid and true and meaningful, then hear what the Psalmist says:

Those who know your name trust in you, for you, LORD, have never forsaken those who seek you. (Psalm 9:10)

This is the Lord Jesus Christ whom the Church has proclaimed from the earliest times, and still knows and loves and proclaims right to this day in the villages of Hanborough and Freeland. We know that life can be incredibly tough, and our spirit can be so often in despair – but we also know the love of Jesus Christ, resurrected, alive, ready to pour out his life-giving Spirit on all who call upon his name.

For in Jesus Christ, the Sun has truly come, and puts an end to the winter of despair:

For the LORD God is a sun and shield; the LORD bestows favour and honour. (Psalm 84:11)

And

For you who revere my name, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its rays (Malachi 4:2)

Wherever you are in your life right now, we welcome everyone in our villages at **I 0am** each Sunday morning to the churches of the Hanborough and Freeland to come and enjoy the warmth of the sun of the love of God.





#### **Green Tip**

Did you notice this spring was quieter than usual? Fewer insects; less of a dawn chorus? We've heard that mammals, insects and birds are becoming extinct at an alarming rate. However, this cold, late spring on the back of the scorching dry summer also hit insect populations badly in some parts of the country, and we have seen the results locally with first bird hatches struggling to survive.

There is a lot of conversation around the climate crisis, and we can see its effects around us. But we also have the crisis around loss of biodiversity. Amazingly, England is one of the most affected countries. Usually, in Freeland we are lucky enough to be surrounded by nature, it's just difficult to know exactly how much. And without knowing what we have, how are we meant to appreciate it and save it?

Well, here is one way you can get to know what birds we are lucky enough to have in our gardens and our woodlands. It's an 'app' called Merlin, developed by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology in the USA for use anywhere in the world, that you can install on your phone. In real time it allows you to listen to the birds singing around you and know which is which. Finally, you can tell the difference between a robin and a blackbird, and be amazed by the number of blue tits and chiffchaffs.

Perhaps try using the app on the walk past the allotment where the Parish Council have let some of the grass grow long and start to understand how lucky we are to so many beautiful little creatures around us, feeding off the insect populations we can encourage through longer grass,



wildflowers and ponds. Just search for 'Merlin' in your app store and look for the logo, as shown here.







## FREELAND ORCHESTRA and WOW'S CONCERT REVIEW

The concert on Saturday 20th May in St Leonard's, Eynsham, was a treat for all musical tastes, with both orchestra and wind band enthusiastically conducted by Wendy Marks.

First on the programme was Haydn's popular Clock Symphony, written during his 2nd visit to London in 1793. Haydn the pop star of his day! The ticking of the clock is heard in the second movement with bassoon and lower strings ticking nicely, taken over later by bassoon and flute. There was some accomplished playing from wind and brass throughout this piece which had a lively finish from the entire orchestra.

This was followed by Soirées Musicales by Britten. There was assured playing from all sections of the orchestra with lovely flashes of colour from wind and brass, and a particularly lyrical violin solo in the Canzonetta, all brought to a close with a lilting Tarantella.

The second half of the programme saw West Oxfordshire Winds, WOW for short, taking over the stage, where again Wendy brought an inspired choice of pieces together. Here we had Beethoven's Turkish March, beginning on a pianissimo, managed confidently, leading on to a jolly Ragtime followed by a lovely American piece called Ashokan Farewell which featured a beautifully played saxophone solo. A medley of Elton John songs included some hand clapping from the middle of the band was next. They were having fun and so were we. This section of the evening finished with Best Years of your Life from Shrek. All in all, an eclectic mix where players and audience alike were clearly enjoying the rendition. 'WOW' indeed!

Finally, a first for all concerned, both orchestra and wind band came together for a huge finale, the church seating still seemed packed with audience, so where had everyone been hiding? Dance of the Tumblers by Rimsky-Korsakov...wind, brass percussion and strings in one joyous bonanza.

# FREELAND NATUREHOOD UPDATE

## Freeland Bat Walk

The bat walk was planned for the 13th May. A few days prior to the walk it was a little wet but luckily on the day we were blessed with good weather. We met in the church yard around 8.30pm to

be given a short introduction about what we might come across. A further demonstration on how to use the bat detectors from a local bat ecologist was then given and we were set to start searching the skies.

Eighteen species of bat are present in the UK, and Oxfordshire hosts around eight. We were able to identify five species within a few hours. A brown long eared bat was recorded in the same location as the previous walk two years ago which could confirm this species is hibernating somewhere in our village.

Thank you to all those that attended. The next bat walk is due in September. Further details of the date will be provided closer to the walk. The donations provided helped us to raise £60 which is fantastic! Steven (the Ecologist) was happy for the group to spend this on a rather fancy bat box to put up in the village.

If you have any knowledge of bats within or close to your property, please get in touch. Bats are protected in this country and a licence is required to approach a suspected roost so try not to disturb any active roosts.

This will be a far more effective insulator than glass, saving energy and helping us reach our green goals. The project is expected to finish later this year in autumn. We would like to say a huge thank you to all of our visitors, without whom this unique conservation project would not have been possible.
