#### Our speakers this year have included:

#### Other activities included:

Ashendon WI archives dating back to when we were first formed in March 1939 are now held in the church vestry by kind permission of the church wardens. They are available for any interested village member to examine.

County Show Co-operative – This competition highlights the many talents of members within the County WI. The entry in August 2016 was to depict an afternoon tea to which we had invited the Queen. Unfortunately we were not as successful as we have been in previous years.

The WI runs Denman educational college where members and non-members can attend courses on practically anything from crochet to antiquities. To create a building maintenance fund all WIs nationally have been asked to raise funds. We held a coffee morning with a raffle at Hill Farm and as a result were delighted to be able to contribute £410.

We set up a cake stall at the village ride to provide much needed sustenance to the riders at the end of the course, and this also helped our funds.

We continued with our bulb planting scheme around the village and this year it was snowdrops outside the church gates.

We hosted a visit from Areley Kings WI in Worcestershire and provided high tea for them after their visit to Waddesdon Manor. Two of our members hold the basic hygiene certificate which enables us to provide outside catering services.

Film Nights – In May 2016 we renewed our public licence so that we could continue to show films in the village hall. The 3 films shown have been well supported:

Craft Group – The centenary commemorative tablecloth is now complete and in use. It fits on the village hall rectangular tables and has the names of all the members hand embroidered upon it together with a group photograph and views of Ashendon village. We also made Christmas bunting to string in the hall and have repaired the banner so that we can hang it during meetings.

One of the other highlights is a scientific 'Investigation and Discovery Day' held at the Gatehouse in Aylesbury which never fails to raise a huge amount of interest.
