Borough Cllr Carr:

Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council, Passed new budget, with new employees in planning, customer services and waste. There is focus on local plan update, new leadership and push back on housing numbers meeting is Thursday 10th March to lower the potential number of houses as St. Mary Bourne is in a AONB, and in a river catchment. Currently Basingstoke and Deane have delivered twice as many homes against the average town. There is also a Lack of 5-year land supply. This Thursday 10th March and Thursday 17th March, emerging policies for climate emergency especially reducing carbon in planning under regulation 18. Spring Hill: Cllr Carr Followed up with B&DBC on the 27th Feb with the Lead officer to discuss the results of test and also about the planter at the bottom of the access road being a dumping ground. The Enforcement team are raising this with developer ASAP. There has been a test with the large and small waste trucks, with the large truck still unable to gain access and the smallest still found access difficult. An engineer is to measure the gradient of the hill. It would appear that there is a general lack of communication between the parties involved.
