YOUR PARSH COUNCILLORS.

Here are a few words of introduction to some of your Parish Councillors. We usually meet every two months, on the 3rd Thursday of the month, in Brook Village Hall (please check previous minutes for dates). All residents are invited to attend.

SIMON BETTY (Chair)

Simon and his family have lived in Brook since 1994 and has been a Brook parish councillor since 2014. He became the Chair of the parish council in May 2023 having previously been Vice-Chair. He was a Chartered Surveyor for 34 years before retiring in 2020 having spent most of his career working in property investment. Simon was elected as the Ashford Borough Council ward member for Bircholt in the 2023 May local elections.

JANET JESSOP (Vice Chair)

Janet moved to Brook in 2010 and was immediately impressed by the friendliness of both her immediate neighbours and other residents of Brook. She found it easy to meet up and get involved in village activities. She was co-opted onto Brook Parish Council in March 2014 shortly after her retirement as a Biomedical Scientist at the William Harvey Hospital. Now, having served for 10 years she intends to stand down from the Parish Council.

ADRIENNE BETTY

Adrienne trained as a Food Scientist and worked in the food industry for 10 years. She was previously a Brook parish councillor between 1996 and 2005 and rejoined the parish council in May 2023. She has been a Justice of the Peace since 2006 and was a school governor for 12 years.

The other Councillors are Fran Penberthy, Pete Penberthy and Alison Wood.

CARETAKER'S CORNER





Brook Parish Council contributes to the Village Caretaker Scheme shared by the neighbouring parishes of Brabourne, Brook, Mersham and Smeeth. In Brook, you will often see Paul on Mondays busily keeping the grass on the playing field and village green mown, as well as attending to other village caretaking activities, as directed by the Caretaker Committee. Here, Paul gives his own update;

The end of October saw the last mowing of the grass at Brook. The rain started and hasn't really stopped since then. Cutting back trees on the green and trees around the playing field at the village hall kept me going until Christmas.

Having just completed washing the road signs and road name signs, I'm now ready for this year's mowing.

WHAT'S NEW

PARISH MEETING

The Brook Parish Meeting will take place at 7pm on 23rd April in the Village Hall. The parish meeting is a meeting that all the electors in a civil parish in England are entitled to attend. It is a legal requirement for every parish in England to hold a parish meeting and is a direct form of democracy. The meeting will offer the opportunity for parishioners to hear presentations from their elected representatives such as the County, Borough and Parish Councillors, from organisations from within the village and to ask any questions. You are all very welcome to attend.

THE ARBORICULTURAL SURVEY REPORT

For some years now, the trees growing within Brook recreation ground are subject to a regular health and safety survey. The Parish Council, as the land owner, has a duty of care' to take reasonable steps to prevent or minimise the risk of personal injury that might occur from tree breakage. The last survey was carried out on Wednesday 10th January 2024 and the report was issued to the Parish Council. Of the 57 trees identified, just one was identified as requiring remedial work; an apple tree required the removal of some dead wood within a recommended 3 month time period.

UPDATE ON CHANGES TO WASTE MANAGEMENT.

The new Ashford Borough Council (ABC) waste management contract commenced on 25th March 2024, when SUEZ took over refuse collection services from Biffa. All households in Brook should have received notification about what changes to expect in a guide. A letter explaining the change to the day of collection (now Wednesday), should also have been put through your door. You may have noticed that the dog poo bin, which was on the village green, has been replaced by a standard waste bin. This bin will take dog poo bags as well as ordinary black bin waste.

D-DAY 80 BEACON LIGHTING

Thursday 6th June. In remembrance of the 80-year anniversary of the D-Day landings. The beacon lighting will take place on the village recreation field at 9pm.
